Greetings Church,

And that includes us. As I meditate on Easter, I ask myself...have I really left the empty tomb? Think about it. What good is Resurrection if we keep ourselves locked in the safety of the tomb. Holding on to all the old ways, holding on to all the old grudges, the old lies...the old order of things. Or do I genuinely believe that by the power of Jesus Christ something NEW is happening. When Jesus walks out of the grave there's a new order. Is your life still bound to the old way? Or have you joined the resurrection? Are you ready to walk in the newness of life?

Easter is a wonderful time to let the old ways die, put them in the tomb and let them stay there. Only the things that belong to God's kingdom join the new way. So, we celebrate the newness of our lives in Christ with love, hope, forgiveness, mercy, and kindness. We celebrate the newness of Christ by loving our neighbor. We celebrate the newness of Christ by walking in grace and experiencing salvation.

Behold! Everything is made new! Because the grave is empty our lives are full!

Melvin W. Reif September 29, 1926 - March 31, 2022

Melvin W. Reif, 95 of Graytown, OH died Thursday, March 31, 2022 at his home under Hospice Care. Melvin was born September 29, 1926 in Elliston, OH to the late William and Minnie (Ninke) Reif. He was a 1945 graduate of Salem-Oak Harbor High School. On August 23, 1952 he married Norma Klickman at St. John Lutheran Church, Rocky Ridge, OH.

Melvin was truly a man who loved and walked with God. He was a lifelong member of Trinity United Church of Christ, Elliston, where he belonged to the former Men's Fellowship, Sunday School class, and was a past Trustee of the Church. He was also a lifelong farmer and was a school bus driver for 32 years for the BCS Schools. He supported the school where he videoed sports games for years.

Melvin certainly enjoyed his family; grandchildren and greatgrandchildren. He enjoyed traveling and woodworking, giving away many items like crosses by the many hundreds. He also held memberships in S.C.R.A.P., Farm Bureau Council, and NFU. He treasured his Minneapolis Moline tractor collection, playing cards, an in the 60's he and his wife were charter members of the Buckeye Squares Western Dance Club.

Survivors include his wife of 69 years Norma of Graytown; sons: Daniel Reif of Port Clinton, OH, Thomas (Kim) Reif of Clayton, MI, William (Luann) Reif of Graytown; 5 grandchildren, and 14 greatgrandchildren. He was also preceded in death by his brother Willis Reif, sister Janet Buhrow, and grandson Benjamin Reif.


