Today we are invited to reflect on one of I the most profound truths of our faith, the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity: the belief that there is One God in Three Persons. We acknowledge this mystery each time we bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross. In the mystery of the Trinity, in that eternal dialogue between the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit, we experience the intimacy of God. Just as these Three Persons are in communion and



love with one another, belief in a Triune God calls us to commit ourselves to one another, to listen and speak with respect to each other, to relate in new ways as spouses, parents, friends, co-workers. Belief in a Triune God has the possibility of transforming all our relationships.



MAY 31 - FEAST OF THE VISITATION OF THE **BLESSED VIRGIN MARY:** This feast commemorates the meeting between Mary and Elizabeth, both of whom find themselves with child. Each woman experiences an outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Elizabeth's response is to declare Mary and her child blessed; Mary's response is to utter the great hymn of praise, the Magnificat. Found in Saint Luke's Gospel (Luke 1.39-56), the whole event is one of rejoicing in the wonders that God has done.

#### ORDINARY TIME

Indinary Time encompasses that part of the liturgical year that does not fall within the distinctive seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The Catholic Church celebrates two periods of the year as Ordinary Time: the first following the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continuing until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday: the second following Pentecost Sunday until the evening before Advent. There are about 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time, depending on the year. In actuality, however, there are fewer "Sundays of Ordinary Time" because major feasts honouring the Trinity, Corpus Christi, Christ the King, and others replace a particular Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is important to remember that Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects". We also may celebrate the parts of Jesus' life that were ordinary, much like our own lives.

JUNE 1 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT JUSTIN, MARTYR: Justin was a convert to Christianity and was called "The Philosopher". He used his knowledge of philosophy to explain Christian doctrine. Eventually, he was brought to trial and martyred about the year 165. The official account from court records still exists and shows how Justin and his companions, when brought before the Roman prefect, declared themselves to be Christian, refused to sacrifice to the gods, and were subsequently condemned to death. Justin's writings include one of the earliest descriptions of the Mass.

### **ALL SAINTS CEMETERY**

Tn a letter to the Churches of Gander and 2024, All Saints Cemetery Chair, Barry Hall, wished to inform families that their efforts to keep operating, development maintenance costs to a minimum is being hampered by the refusal of some families to comply with the posted rules, one of which is "Flowers and memorabilia to be placed on and secured to the monument, not to **the ground**". Steel spikes and rocks placed in and around the grave sites have caused significant damage to equipment to the point where a new lawn tractor has to be purchased at a cost of around \$7000. ASC is considering invoicing the families involved when such damage occurs. Prior to implementing that process the Committee has requested that church members be informed through bulletins and sermons allowing their message of concern be distributed in our congregations.
