

Downtown Miami Children – Predicting Future School Needs

The Miami DDA recently published the <u>2018 Greater Downtown Miami Demographics Report</u>, which indicated that, due to the influx of new residential units, population in Greater Downtown Miami increased by 127% since 2000.

Greater Downtown Miami is now home to more families as well: as of January 2018, there were 8,153 families with children, indicating a 12% growth since 2000. As Greater Downtown Miami continues to attract new residents, more children will come to the area increasing the demand for neighborhood school options.

As of 2018, there were 13,005 children in Greater Downtown Miami.
