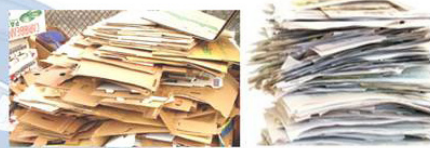

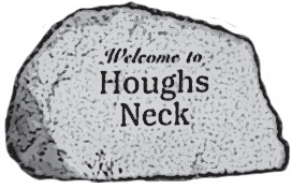

Good News from Houghs Neck Congregational Church

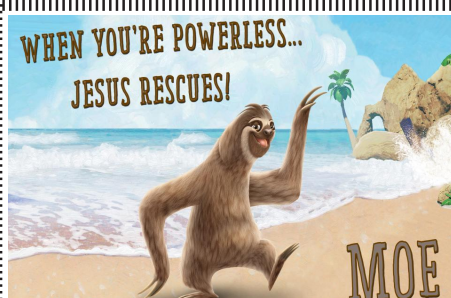
With summer coming to a close, the mixed feelings of sadness and joy begin to creep into our souls: Sadness that the summer days of relaxation and outdoor fun have whizzed by, seemingly all too soon, but joy in the anticipation of beginning a new cycle in our work lives, a new church year, a new school year. The rhythm of fall approaches.

Hopefully you collected enough warm memories to last you through the coming winter weather. My wife, Jean, and I had a wonderful time in Ireland and Scotland, seeing some beautiful countryside and meeting some very friendly people, some of whom were likely distant (mostly very distant) relatives. Jean, whose family name is Halligan, met by coincidence a gentleman whose mother was a Halligan. Part of my family lineage stems from the Scottish town of Luss on the western shore of Loch Lomond. The Colquhoun clan originates from there. My middle name is Calhoun, my mother's maiden name. Calhoun is a derivative of Colquhoun pronounced by Scots "ca hoon" with the accent on the last syllable. Like many of us who had ancestors that came to America, the name evolved into its present form by any number of possible reasons. The Colquhouns are known for the breeds of sheep they developed over the years, particularly the popular black-faced sheep.

In 1603 clan Gregor (MacGregor), attacked the Colquhoun clan at the battle of Glen Fruin. According to the Clan Gregor; two MacGregor clansmen, away from home, were forced to spend a night in Colquhoun lands. After being refused shelter, the two MacGregors found an abandoned barn and slaughtered a sheep which they ate. When the two were discovered they were seized and brought forward to Colquhoun, the Laird of Luss. Sir Humphrey Colquhoun of Luss, chief of the Clan Colquhoun, had the men tried by summary trial then sentenced the men to death. Of the 500 Colquhoun men involved in the battle, story has it that 200 were killed. I was told that it is likely that I had a relative that survived that battle (before 1603 there had been little or no dispersia of Colquhouns to other parts of the world). Lucky break for me! As yet, I have not been able to trace my ancestry back to that relative that survived the battle of Glen Fruin. I suppose he was either brave and fought well, or he was a fast runner!

Interest in one's ancestry as you are well aware is popular these days. Knowing one's roots seems to offer us clues to why we are and who we are. I hope you had a safe and enjoyable Labor Day and have been surviving this especially hot and humid summer. Unfortunately, this weather has increased the number of mosquitos this year. The Department of Public Health has confirmed 4 cases of West Nile Virus so far. In 2017, there were 6 confirmed cases and in 2016 16 confirmed cases. Please take precautions for yourself and your pets even as we head into the fall months; as long as the weather remains hot and humid, the mosquitos will stay out there.

Governor Baker came to the Kennedy Senior Center to sign a \$2.4 billion environmental bond bill at the end of August. The bond bill authorizes the Governor to fund capital projects focused on improving climate change resiliency and adaptation, enhancing environmental and natural resource protection, and investing in our parks and recreational assets. \$225 million is committed to purchasing environmentally sensitive lands, watershed remediation and coastal resource protection. Sustainable agriculture is a very important part of our economy and \$54 million is committed to enhancing our agricultural industry. Another \$100 million is provided to the Department of Environmental Protection for air quality protection and mitigation; river and wetland protection is funded at \$55 million; and \$100 million was allocated to address coastal defenses such as sea walls and jetties. Working with the Quincy legislative delegation, we were able to include a \$2 million earmark directly to the City of Quincy for sea wall upgrades, \$2 million for improving Squantum Point Park, and \$2 million for dredging the channel in Quincy Bay.

In response to climate change, a Global Warming Solutions Trust Fund was established to address the state and municipal climate change and adaptation plans. A special legislative commission will investigate the acidification of the ocean. The Fishing Innovation fund will help fund research and advancement of new oceanographic technology and design the future of commercial fishing. The Division of Marine Fisheries has to provide a report by the end of this year on the current state of the lobster industry and recommendations about the future of lobster processing. The Agricultural Innovation Fund will provide grants to help agricultural and cranberry producers.

Building on the past two sessions of work, we signed into law legislation that would continue Massachusetts commitment to utilizing more renewable power. In the past, we have provided financing to the solar industry, becoming the first in the nation to bid for offshore wind power and increasing our purchasing of hydroelectricity. In addition, we thus far have met our renewable energy portfolio (RPS) goals of 13%, which have been increasing steadily since being created in the Electricity Restructuring Act of 1997. Since 2008, when the Global Warming Solutions Act was passed, the RPS has increased by 1% each year. We are projected to have 20% of our energy from hydroelectricity by 2023 and have yet to determine how much offshore wind power there will be, but we are expecting no less than 800 megawatts. Hydroelectric power and offshore wind is not considered part of our RPS requirement. From 2019 to 2029, we will require our RPS goal to increase by 2% each year, for a total of 20% over 10 years; the RPS will then

Continue to increase by 1% each year after that. By 2029, the expectation is at least 33% of Massachusetts' electrical supply is from renewable energy plus an additional 20% from hydropower – and this figure does not include offshore wind, future battery storage technology and customer self-generated renewable power. According to one 2017 study, a 2% RPS increase in Massachusetts in connection with Connecticut's recent RPS increase could generate over 20,000 new jobs in the region and nearly 2,000 megawatts of additional renewable energy by 2030.

Beyond increasing our renewable energy usage, we established a clean peak standard whereby energy storage using renewable generation will be given priority during high energy usage periods. The Department of Public Utilities will require electric companies to provide for review the heat map showing where in the electrical system there are infrastructure stress levels. We also required that the MassSave energy efficiency program provide greater cost benefit to customers. The Department of Energy Resources is required to investigate the feasibility of purchasing electricity generated by offshore wind beyond the authorized levels set by the Commonwealth. Lastly, gas companies will be required to report annually on "lost and unaccounted for gas" (LAUF). This is the difference between the gas purchased by the utility and how much gas was delivered to customers and used by the gas company to conduct its business.

First before I start a roll call of items being completed/worked on I would like to express my thanks to all my constituents for working with me over the past several months. It has been proactive and productive to say the least in regards to requests, advice and solutions. We had a very tough Winter/Spring go of it and let's hope Mother Nature is easy on us this coming Winter. So let's enjoy the Fall season, get ready for school and stay active and productive as you usually do.

Speaking of productive, we had a very productive year thus far and below are a few action items in progress:

1. Brill Field , restoration has begun, new bleachers, clearing of brush on lower edge of the Dike

2. Clearing the dike above Brill field. Making it wider and clearing brush is in process.

3. Cleaning up Greg McKinnon Park and constructing new wooden guard rails at the park entrance. Thank you MWRA.

4. Clearing the dike between Palmer Street and Rockland Street is in process, widening the dike, clearing brush and making the pathway more compatible for emergency vehicles (when needed) is ongoing.

5. Working with the QYC in regards to their Seawall, new outfall pipe and continued progress on replacing the pipe extension out to the circle catch basins for better drainage.

6. Anticipating Maritime Center's new boat ramp construction to commence early fall after the boating season is over to limit impact to any late season events/boaters. Phase one is the ramp/docks and all of this is a long process.

7. Construction on new beach access stairs on Bayview Ave. Thank you DPW for staying on that project and installing in a timely fashion.

8. Restoring the Parkhurst Street Marsh. Working with Arthur Knowlton and City officials to get it right in regards to proper water flow in and out of the marsh.

9. Finalizing and installing a new tide gate for the ramp at the Bayswater Boatyard. Working with neighbors on boatyard protocol, which I hope has improved.

10. Grand opening of the new Lawrence Grenham Park/Playground on Macy Street

Mayor, George Nicholson, Jim Frattolillo, George Bouchard and all the folks at Veterans Services.

11. Seawall repair work wherever it was needed in early Spring and the beginning of a tremendous seawall restoration/replacement effort. Beginning at the Willows headed up to Merrymount (Phase 1), Manet to Bayswater (Phase 2). The administration has been nothing short of spectacular in their response to that subject and to my requests for individual assistance. Thank you also to Tighe and Bond for your assistance all year.

12. Working closely with HN residents in regards to Seawall issues. Making sure we get it right. A very productive community meeting was held on August 15th at City Hall. All neighborhoods that line up with the Phase 1 coastline project (Willows/Sea, Adams Shore/Merrymount) were in attendance.

13. Community Police day in and day out in Houghs Neck responding to all issues. We all like it when things are quiet and that is what we have had this summer in Houghs Neck. We will always have some issues but the QPD Community Police have been excellent. Thank you Lt. Bina and Officers Mitchell and Miller.

14. Ongoing analysis of the Rockland Street/ Cove area by city engineering to limit and solve the drainage issues that plague that area. This is ongoing as I realize this is an issue that has been in that area for years. An area that will not be forgotten. Thank you for your patience.

15. Ongoing analysis of the seawall between Bell Street and the Maritime center to ensure that gets on the list to be repaired and secured.

16. Thank you Troop 6 for the work you do in regards to the Community especially the cleaning of the "Crusher". Great work this summer. We will try our hardest to keep it clean by having the Community police stay vigilant on the Activities up there.

17. Congratulations to Troop 6 for two amazing

18. The project of restoration of the WWII Monument Park at Atherton Hough, spearheaded by the Houghs Neck Garden Club. This group secured a grant of 25,000 dollars to bring that park back to life. Great job by all, HNGC, Veterans service and the Park Department
