Society of Women Engineers Host Wow! That's Engineering

The Society of Women Engineers (SWE) University of Hawaii Collegiate Section hosted the 7th annual Wow! That's Engineering! outreach event on March 14. The event was held at the University of Hawaii at Manoa Campus Center Ballroom and engaged 97 students along with parents and educators in hands-on activities.

The students were introduced to a diverse group of volunteer engineers, which included collegians and professionals, to help them learn about the opportunities in engineering and see the empowerment of diversity. The hands-on activities built on engineering skills such as team work and finding creative solutions to everyday problems. In post-event surveys collected, the majority of participants reported improvement in problem-solving, building and designing abilities, and knowledge of STEM. They also reported enjoying working with other girls and the mentors.

The event also engaged parents/educators in discussions on important topics regarding young students' STEM education and career paths. The parents/educators were able to quiz a panel of volunteers from the local professional section of SWE on the outlook of the profession and their experiences. They also were



ASME HAWAII SECTION HISTORY

Last month we reported on the whereabouts of Frederick H. Kohloss, P.E., JD, and ASME Fellow. He's alive and living in Tucson, AZ.

This month we would like to write about Howard D. Hole, our sixth ASME Hawaii Section Chairman. There is scattered information about Mr. Hole. Howard D. Hole served as ASME-HI Chairman in 1959-1960. He was a charter member of HSPE in 1961 and was subsequently HSPE President. Howard was HCES Engineer of the Year in 1968. He was also ASHRAE Hawaii Chapter Charter Member in 1969

His very brief obituary appeared in the Honolulu Star Bulletin in May 1997, which wrote that Howard Hole, retired mechanical and professional engineer passed away in Salem, Oregon, in April 1997 at the age of 76. The brief write up mentioned that Hole served as a radio operator and gunner in the U.S. Army Air Corps in World War II. He was a prisoner of war and received the Distinguished Flying Cross Air Metal. His company was Howard Hole & Associates Inc. The article did not mention any of his engineering accomplishments.

His ashes were scattered somewhere in Hawaii. He was survived by his wife Dorothy, son Howard D. Hole, Jr., and daughter Rhonda D. Wolter. Son Howard Jr. resides in Cincinnati, Ohio

Program: Civil Engineering an important part of our Sustainable Future

Speaker: Manfred Zapka, Ph.D, P.E., M-ASCE, ENV SP, LEED AP, Chair of the ASCE Hawaii Section Sustainability Committee

Synopsis: Civil engineers need to be prepared for the extraordinary changes taking place under which the projects they plan, design and construct are expected to operate. Civil engineers will be at the forefront of managing changes of how the world will be responsibly using our limited and critical resources and averting further degradation of ecological systems. The overuse of critical resources and the consequences of a stressed environment have been becoming apparent, expressed as shortages of fuels and fresh water, more frequent and intense storms, extended heat waves and droughts, record flooding, rising seas, forest fires, non-point source air and water pollution, and many more critical impacts on the environment and communities.

The presentation will introduce some important basic topics of sustainable engineering and infrastructure. The talk will provide guidance on how civil engineers can prepare themselves to stay well-informed and competitive in the face of increasingly demand for sustainable project delivery. The new sustainable infrastructure rating system ENVISION [™] will be briefly discussed.



Section Meeting

The ITE Hawaii Section meeting was held on May 27th, on the 9th floor of the Fasi Municipal Building.

President Pete Pascua opened the meeting having everyone introduce themselves. He thanked Gordon for providing lunch, and announced that the money collected for lunch will be donated to the Western District Student Endowment Fund in honor of C.S. Papacostas. Pete also thanked those that volunteered and provided shuttle service for Costas' funeral, as well as everyone that attended. It was also announced that our Annual Meeting Grant will be renamed the Constantinos S. Papacostas Annual Meeting Grant in honor of Costas. At the District Annual Meeting, July 19-22, in Las Vegas, a moment of silence will be held in his honor as well as others within the ITE community that have passed. The International Meeting and Exhibit, August 2-5, will be in Hollywood, FL. Our Hawaii Section Annual Meeting will be on June 24th, at the Plaza Club. Ballots for our Section 2015-2016 officers went out last week, please cast your vote.


Western District Secretary-Treasurer Cathy Leong announced that Western District ballots should be coming out on June 5th, and the International ballots on June 19th. She also wanted to thank everyone who donated to the Student Endowment Fund in Costas' name, more than \$1300 has already been donated. Should anyone need assistance in making a donation, she'll be happy to help them. A spotlight on Costas will be on the Endowment website, and a plaque will also be given at the Annual District Meeting.

Vice President Natasha Soriano introduced Dr. Adrian Ricardo Archilla, professor at the UH Moana, speaking on Top-Down Fatigue Cracking in High Temperature Environments.

Dr. Archilla started his presentation saying that Hawaii may not have the hottest or the coldest weather, but in Hawaii temperatures can get hot everyday. He stated that from the moment asphalt pavement is built it experiences stress. The distress of pavement is categorized by bottom-up fatigue, top-down fatigue cracking (TDFC), thermal cracking, rutting, and by roughness index. Fatigue or Alligator cracking starts from the bottom, and moves its way to the surface, indicating that the structure has failed. Early stages of TDFC will appear as longitudinal cracks along the wheel

path. Dr. Archilla showed picture examples of cracking, including roads on Oahu, one with both TDFC and rutting that occurs in cold temperatures. He encourages everyone to look at the roads, and identify what kind of distress is occurring. Dr. Archilla discussed the AASHTO MEPDG Manual of Practice, now known as Pavement ME Design. Traffic, material properties, and environment are inputted to select a trial pavement structure. An analysis takes place, and pavement response and performance models are created to determine if the pavement meets criteria. It was explained that fatigue testing equipment is used to apply Miner's hypothesis to calculate damage as a ratio of loading in an increment of time over the number of repetition before failure. Pavement experiences different amounts of stress throughout the day, dependent on temperature and frequency. Dr. Archilla had graphs showing colder temperatures having a higher modulus, but explained frequency has a higher effect. He recommends monitoring actual temperature at different times of the day rather than just checking at one point in the day.

The floor was open to questions. Only one question was asked: So are we supposed to design for fatigue cracking? Dr. Archilla answered no, we need to catch it at the right time so that it does not progress. Top-down fatigue can be fixed with milling and treatment.


JUNE 2015 HIGHLIGHTS: BOARD of **DIRECTORS MTG -**
