Minutes of Congregational Meeting January 19, 2020

Option 1: Sell Parsonage building to be moved off site and keep land

- Possible income of selling parsonage \$10,000 to \$15,000
- Require buyer to move parsonage and clean up lot after move
- Could save \$300 annually on insurance premiums
- Literally giving away \$180,000 house

Option 2: Use Parsonage for Ministry/Outreach

- Must upgrade building to meet American Disabilities Act
- Permit would be required from Fire Marshall to make it a business with required number of
 parking spaces, remove stovetop, install exit light/signs, build wheelchair ramp, expand one
 bathroom using licensed plumbers and electricians to make handicap accessible, possibly
 would need to use space from a bedroom to expand bathroom, install smoke detectors in every
 room, upgrades could run possibly \$10,000 if no additional problems detected during
 inspection process
- Need to install new air conditioner at cost of \$6000-\$7000
- Is there such a need for additional space to justify cost of improvements?
- Would there be a zoning issue for county?
- Additional costs to furnish parsonage and for utility bills
- Estimate additional \$300 for insurance premiums

Option 3: Rent Parsonage

- What if we had to evict resident—what image would that project for Mt Hermon?
- Why should a church have a profit?
- Did we consult other churches who rent their parsonage such as St Pauls in Columbia or Whaley Street United Methodist Church to see how it works and if there are any tax implications?
- Longer the parsonage sits unused it deteriorates—already has been 2.5 years
- Suggest placing a cap on repairs a rental agency is able to do without consulting us
- Renting now would maintain building and we could change the usage of building in the
 future—this would keep it in good shape and possibly decrease the number of repairs needed in
 the future
- Joel Price Sr said his previous house of similar square footage is currently being rented for \$1500 monthly
- Would we construct a fence to separate parsonage from rest of church?
- Where would money come from to make improvements—could use extra \$50,000 from loan
- How to control noise/parties from interfering with church events?
- Repairs can always open a can of worms
- How long would it take to rent?

A vote was taken of the 63 members present after discussion of the above three options

Option 1 received 33 votes

Option 2 received 3 votes

Option 3 received 27 votes

Option 1 passed on the first vote (passed 51% threshold required)


Happenings ...




