



SAVE HIS PEOPLE FROM THEIR SINS

On page three of my Holy Bible I read these words, "I will put enmity between thee (the serpent) and the woman (Eve), and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel." Here in the third chapter of Genesis any Bible student can see God's promise of a saviour through the seed of man.

It indeed is tragic that Eve yielded to Satan's temptation and drew Adam into the transgression because God had given His word,—"for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die." God is good and merciful. He did not leave man to his hopeless tragic sin, but immediately set plans in motion to redeem man from his sin.

Let us take the journey, as it were through the Bible, and view a few of the sign-posts that indicate God's plan to bring forth a saviour for man, the sinner.

In Moses time, no less than thirteen centuries before Jesus was born, God said to Moses, "I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethern, like unto thee, and will put my words in his mouth; and he shall speak unto them all that I shall command him." This prophecy was fulfilled by none other than Jesus Christ. Jesus acknowledged that He came to do and say what the Father commanded Him to do and say. (Deuteronomy 18:18)

In the days of Isaiah the prophet, over seven hundred years before the birth of Jesus, God gave his word about this matter as the prophet spoke to King Ahaz, the fifteenth king of Judah: "Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign: Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." (Isaiah 7:14). It is very significant that His name was to be Immanuel, which means, "God with us." This one of whom the prophet wrote was to be more than a prophet, He was to be God-with-us.

Isaiah the prophet further exclaims, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder; and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6).

This prince of peace, upon whose shoulder the government should rest has indeed been reigning within the hearts of Christians for over nineteen hundred years now, but when other prophecies are fulfilled, He will indeed be the literal King of Kings.

Micah, the prophet, who also lived centuries before Jesus was born, wrote concerning this birth of this holy son, "But thou, Bethlehem, Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting." (Micah 5:2).

The prophet here foretold the place of the saviour's birth but more than that, the prophet Micah recognized the diety of the one to come. He said He had been from of old, from everlasting. Jesus is the eternal saviour, the Son of God.

In the new testament, in the book of Luke, chapter one, verses twenty-six through thirty-five, is the account of the angel Gabriel's visit to the virgin Mary. Although Mary was espoused to Joseph, she had never known him in a sexual way. In verse 31 the angel announced "And, behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name Jesus." In verse 35 the angel explained, "The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God."

The prophesied name of Jesus means saviour. In order to send a Saviour, God sent Immanuel—God with us.

God also dealt with Joseph, Mary's espoused husband. We read about it in Matthew, chapter one, verses eighteen through twenty-five. Let us examine verse twenty-one: "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shall call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins."

Here is explained again, the purpose of God sending His son into the world, to man, suffer as man, be tempted as man and to give himself for man. Call his name Jesus, for He shall save His people from their sins.

New testament writings further explain the coming of this Immanuel that would save sinners.

Luke gives an account of Mary's and Joseph's experience in traveling to Bethlehem and finding only no vacancy hospitality and finally spending the night in a stable. He tells of the birth of Jesus. He tells of Mary giving birth—wrapping her son in swaddling clothes and lying him in a manger.

Luke tells of the shepherds hearing the good news from the angel and the song of the heavenly host. "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men." (Luke 2:1-19)

Luke also tells of old Simeon's blessing on the eight day old Christ child and of Anna's prophecy that puzzeled the heart of Mary, the Christ child's mother. (Luke 2:21-40)

Luke further tells of the boyhood of Jesus. When he was twelve years old he astonished the doctors in the temple, with His answers to their questions.

Once more, at Christmas time we celebrate the birth of Jesus who was prophesied to be the saviour of men.

He indeed is the Saviour of men, as is attested in this prophecy to Joseph, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shall call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins."

GOD IS GREATER THAN A CROWD


Mightier than Pharoah's army.

The only Bible God wrote through human agents, was written in two of the world's most perfect languages. The Old Testament was originally written in Hebrew and the New Testament in Greek. The Bible God gave man was perfect and because God inspired it, it is the true word of God.

So many different Bible versions are on the market today that it is confusing. In some of these Bibles, words have been altered, or changed and even phrases have been left out entirely. Many times the public is completely fooled because the Bibles look and sound like a true version.

Every believer is referred to as a Christian soldier. How can we fight the battle with Satan if we don't have the true armour of God? In Ephesians 6:10-18 we are told to "Put on the whole armour of God, and above all, to take the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God, Praying always,". If the sword of the Spirit is a luke warm version of the Bible, with subtle changes made, how can it be effective and divide the truth and withstand Satan?

God has faithfully warned us to be on guard against Bible corruptions. Jeremiah wrote, "For among my people are found wicked men. They lay wait, as he that setteth snares; they set a trap, they catch men." (Jeremiah 5:26).

God wrote through the apostle Peter: "But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction.

And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of.

And through covetousness shall they with feigned words make merchandise of you: whose judjment now of a long time lingereth not, and their damnation slumbereth not. II Peter 2:1-3.

Down through the ages there have been corrupters of the Holy Bible. We should "Be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive. (Ephesians 4:14)

God has sentinels in verse form, placed to guard the scripture. In the beginning of the Bible, Deuteronomy 4:2, "Ye shall not add unto the word which I command you, neither shall ye diminish ought from it." "Add thou not unto his words, lest he reprove thee, and thou be found a liar," Proverbs 30:6. And in Revelation 22:19 "If any man take any away from the words of the book of this prophecy God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the Holy City, and from the things which are written in the book."

A fundamental law of the Spirit is "Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God," (Romans 10:17) "For by grace are you aved through faith," Ephesians 2:8. Faith can be no more perfect than the word which produced it. If the Word is corrupt, then the resulting faith which comes from it will be corrupt and without lifegiving essentials.

Only an unaltered Bible can produce a perfect, soulsaving faith!

There are two streams that all Bibles can be traced to. At first the only scriptures in existance were those given by the inspiration of God, (II Peter 1:21) These messages were put into writing and when placed into book form they became Bible number one, the true Word of God. This stream has come to us crystal clear through the divine evidence of God's omniscience. It is pure, life-giving water of God's inspired Word and it has power to produce saving faith. (Romans 10:17)

The other Bibles have come to us in a stream whose waters are clouded with "Mud" of philosophic criticism. It seems to be based upon the reasonings of the "natural man," (I Corinthians 2:14). The source of this stream is hypothetical, and untrustworthy. It has produced a multiplicity of Bible versions which differ so much from each other that the result is faith repelling confusion.

The Textus Receptus was approved as the true original Hebrew and Greek manuscript. Westcott & Hort rejected the Textus Receptus and wrote their own version from the smallest of these groups of Bible Manuscripts.

The revisers of 1881 followed the guidance of Westcott and Hort. Hort's partiali for the Vatican manuscript was practically absolute. As the Sinaiticus was the brother of the Vaticanus whenever pages in the latter were missing, Hort used the former. He and Westcott considered that when the consensus of opinion of these two manuscripts favored a reading, that reading should be accepted as apostolic. We come back to the Vaticanus as Westcott and Hort's text used almost entirely.

When the Revised Version was summitted in 1881 there were between eight and nine changes in every five verses, and in about every ten verses three of these were made for critical purposes. Think about that. For critical purposes, the Vatican Codex, sometimes alone, generally in accord with the Sinaitic, is responsible for nine-tenths of the most striking innovations in the Revised Version!

The Greek text of Westcott and Hort (1881) is the private enterprise of two men from a very limited and select number of manuscripts. Their Greek text was strongly radical and revolutionary, Dr. Salmon reported.

Dr. Scrivener informs us that there are 2,864 cursive and uncial manuscripts of the New Testament in whole or in part. It has been acknowledged, even by some enemies, that nineteen-twentieths of these manuscripts are in accord with the Received Text, the Textus Receptus. But Westcott and Hort turned away from all this testimony, and elevated the Vaticanus and Sinaiticus to the chair of authority. This is why the Greek Text of Westcott and Hort contains 5,337 changes from the reading of the Greek Textus Receptus which is the basis for the King James Version.

Since 1881 the great controversy has been between Westcott and Hort's so called Neutral Text and the Textus Receptus. Many learned textual critics uphold the Textus Receptus because of the immense number of manuscripts which are in agreements with it. They thought the Sinaitic and Vaticanus were scanty survivals of a corrupt tradition and that they probably survived because of their corruption.

The religious beliefs of Westcott are shown from a letter to his fiancee in 1847 "After leaving the monastery, we shaped our course to a little oratory which we discovered on the summit of a neighboring hill . . .; Fortunately we found the door open. It is very small, with one kneeling-place; and behind a screen was a 'Pieta' the size of life (i.e. a Virgin and dead Christ) . . . Had I been alone I could have knelt there for hours."

Hort writes to Westcott, October 17th, 1865: "I have been persuaded for many years that Mary-worship and Jesus worship have very much in common in their causes and their results."

In conclusion all textual critics since 1611 are, for the most part, in agreement with the Greek Text of Westcott and Hort. And since the textual foundation principle of the Westcott and Hort theory have been proven to be based upon a false foundation, we can only arrive at an unavoidable conclusion, this whole system of Bible translation is wrong. All Greek texts produce since 1611 which are in agreement with Westcott and Hort are founded upon the same unprobable hypothesis. Since Westcott and Hort's text is corrupt, all in agreement with it are corrupt also.

Out of 162 verses from different translations note how many were changed from the Greek Textus Receptus, and

the King James Version. (Only a few are given here)
New American Standard147 changes
Good News for Modern Man144 changes
Amplified N.T136 changes
Phillip's N.T
John Wesley's N.T

In the Good News for Modern Man version the word "Blood" of the Lord is omitted 15 times. The word "begotten" is left out 8 times. The Good News Bibles have been sold for below cost. We wonder why, it is so they can get the young people ready for the Bible the Ecumenical Movement is planning.

True believers should buy King James Bibles now, because the day is coming when they shall wander from sea, to sea and from the North even to the east; they shall run to and fro to seek the word of the Lord, and shall not find it. Amos 8:12.

The Textus Receptus is Latin for Received Text. This is the Greek Text used as a basis for the translation of the King James Bible in 1611. At first the Textus Receptus was known as the Greek Vulgate. Vulgate means that which is best known and used by the majority of the people. This was the text used by the Apostles in separate manuscript form. When the Spirit-directed consciousness of the early church gathered these separate God-inspired manuscripts into book form, they had the Received Text, the Textus Receptus.

July 22, 1604 King James of England announced that he had appointed 54 Hebrew and Greek scholars to produce a Bible, which we know today as the King James Version. These men were organized into six groups which were to meet separately.

Each scholar first made his own translation, then passed it on to be reviewed by each other member of his group. When each selection had completed a book of the Bible it was sent to the other five groups for their independent criticism. In this way each book went through the hands and minds of the entire body of translators. To guard further against possible errors another committee was formed by selecting two from each of the three companies. Then the entire version came before this select group where all differences of opinion were ironed out. It put the finishing work of organized cooperation where the direction and discernment of the Holy Spirit was desired.

With the revisers of 1881 all was different. The Old Testament committee met together secretly as one body for ten years. The New Testament committee also met together for ten years. All was done in secret. We wonder why all the secrecy? The unpublished new Greek Text of Westcott and Hort, upon which they had been working for 20 years was, portion by portion, secretly committed into the hands of the Revision Committee.

All reports indicate that the iron rule of silence was forced upon the Revisers during the ten years. The waiting public all this time was kept in suspense. The world did not know what had been done, until after elaborate plans had been made to throw the Revised Version Bibles all at once upon the market to promote a tremendous sale.

The following is taken from a letter received by Mr. and Mrs. Albert Janzen from their daughter, Alberta, who is doing missionary work with Youth With A Mission and is at the present in Argentina.

Alberta writes, "We got back to Valle de Lago this morning at 1:30 a.m. and ate. I couldn't believe it, I'd never come up our 2½ kilometer driveway in a vehicle before and more than once I thought "into Your hands I commit my spirit", but all is safe.

At 12 we had an "asado with charriscos. It's actually much better than it sounds, but it's pig guts baked and smoked over an open fire. It's eaten with hunks of buttered bread and roasted potatoes. At 1:00 we left for Villa Delores. It was true missionary traveling with our bags! At our entrance we caught a bus, relieved that they would take us with our baggage. We arrived in Villa Delores and did a bit of shopping. Even a tiny town seemed such a luxury! Shops! Toothpaste!

We were supposed to have one large meeting that weekend, spending the rest of the time with our church families and witnessing. We had four services, witnessing, and still spent time with our church families! One morning I woke up with chickens in my room but that is just a sidelight.

The family I stayed with were poor but average Agentine. They didn't have a kitchen sink but did the dishes outside under the tap with the ducks and chickens. The three that stayed with the Pastor had rat for dinner one day. No joke. Rat. They said it tasted like chicken.

If you ever need to contact me, telegraph Los Pozos or else phone Wedge and Shirley Alman, Buenos Aires. They will call Phil Saint in Cordoba, who will contact Los Pozos post office, who will send a message with the bread man either Tuesday, Thursday or Saturday, then I will walk an hour over the mountain trail and call you. Fun, huh? A letter would be nearly as fast."

FINDING THE WILL OF GOD

Many have said I am willing to do the "will of God" but I have trouble finding His will. Let us see what the scripture says concerning the will of God. Ephesians 5:17 says "Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is." Jesus himself faced hard decisions as Matthew 26:39 tells us. "And he went a little farther and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, O my father if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: neverless not as I will, but as thou will." Phillippians 2:39- "For it is God which worketh in you both to do of his good pleasure." In John 15:5 Jesus said, "I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing." So we must be in his will. James 4:13-15 says "Go to now, ye that say, today or tomorrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain: Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away. For that ye ought to say, If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that." The people wanted Paul to stay in Ephesus, Acts 18:19-21, "And he came to Ephesus, and left them there: but he himself entered into the synagogue and reasoned with the Jews. When they desired him to tarry longer time with them, he consented not; But bade them farewell, saying I must by all means keep this feast in Jerusalem: but I will return again unto you, if God will. And he sailed from Ephesus."

Many seem to think it is God's will for them to do anything good that enters their mind. David wanted to build the temple but the Lord said he must not built it. 1 Chronicles 28:2-3 "Then David the king stood upon his feet and said, Hear me my brethern, and my people: As for me I had in my heart to build an house if rest for the ark of the covenant of the Lord, and for the footstool of our God, and had made ready for the building: But God said unto me, Thou shalt not build an house for my name, because thou hast been a man of war, and hast shed blood." God had his reasons and Solomon, David's son, was the one God chose to build the temple. Some get overly eager and rush in without finding God's will. King Saul had his instructions from Samuel the prophet in 1 Samuel 10:8 "And thou shalt go down before me to Gilgal: and, behold, I will come down to thee, to offer burnt offerings, and to sacrifice sacrifices of peace offerings: seven days shalt thou tarry till I come to thee and shew thee what thou shalt do." But Saul got in a hurry and failed to wait until Samuel got there. 1 Samuel 13:8-14 "And he tarried seven days, according to the set time that Samuel had appointed: but Samuel came not to Gilgal; and the people were scattered from him. And Saul said, Bring hither a burnt offering to me, and peace offerings. And he offered the burnt offering. And it came to pass, that as soon as he had made an end of offering the burnt offering, behold, Samuel came; and Saul went out to meet him, that he might salute him. And Samuel said, What hast thou done? And Saul said, Because I saw that the people were scattered from me, and that thou camest not within the days appointed, and that the Philistines gathered themselves together at Michmash; Therefore said I, the Philistines will come down now upon me to Gilgal, and I have not made supplication unto the Lord: I forced myself therefore, and offered a burnt offering. And Samuel said to Saul, Thou hast foolishly: thou hast not kept the commandment of the Lord thy God, which he commanded thee: for now would the Lord have established thy kingdom upon Israel for ever. But now thy kingdom shall not continue; the Lord Hath sought him a man after his own heart, and the Lord hath commanded him to be captain over his people, because thou hast not kept that which the Lord commanded thee.

Ahimaaz also got in a hurry. 2 Samuel 18:19-29 Then said Ahimaaz the son of Zadok, Let me now run, and bear the king tidings how that the Lord hath avenged him of his enemies. And Joab said unto him, Thou shalt not bear tidings this day, but thou shalt bear tidings another day: but this day thou shalt bear no tidings, because the king's son is dead. Then said Joab to Cushi, Go tell the king what thou hast seen. And Cushi bowed himself into Joab and ran. Then said Ahimaaz the son of Zodak yet again to Joab, But however, let me I pray thee, also run after Cushi. And Joab said, Wherefore wilt thou run, my son seeing that thou hast no tidings ready? But howsoever, said he, let me run. And he said unto him, run. Then Ahimaaz ran by the way of the plain, and overran Cushi. And David sat between the two gates: and the watchman went up to the roof over the gate to the wall, and lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold a man running alone. And the watchman cried and told the king. And the kind said, If he be alone, there is tidings in his mouth. And he came apace and drew near. And the watchman saw another man running: and the watchman called unto the porter, and said, Behold another man running alone. And the king said, He also bringeth tidings. And he fell down to the earth upon his face before the king and said, Blessed be the Lord thy God which hath delivered up the men that lifted up their hand against my lord the king. And the king said, Is the youngman Absolom safe: And Ahimaaz answered, When Joab sent the kings servant and me thy servant, I saw a great tumult, but I knew not what it was." Ahimaaz, in his eagerness to carry the tidings didn't wait to see what really happened. Today some of God's runners with tidings are as confused as Ahimaaz. Many are so anxious to be witnesses for the Lord before they are able to give others a reasonable answer. God will give us time to study our Bibles and pray until we have a Bible answer. 1 Peter 3:15 "But sanctify the Lord thy God in your hearts: and be ready to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear."

Years ago I went with a young man to a town in West Texas to visit his relatives who were unconverted. I was very tired so I went to bed very early. He was a new convert and anxious for his relatives to be saved. Before I went to sleep I heard him in the adjoining room telling his relatives they ought to get saved. And if they did not they would die and go to hell. They asked him how he know that and his reply was, "That's what they told me." He had more zeal than knowledge.

Some are out trying to preach with lots of zeal but very little knowledge. If we are confused we will only confuse others. Study your Bible diligently and pray until you are sure God has called you to preach. Be a good witness-Be a Bible witness.

In finding the will of God, there are many things we must consider. There are the things we would like to do. There are things that others think we should do. Many times our family or friends think they know what we should do. They may mean well, but God can reveal His Will to us.

What God asks us to do may be contrary to what we want to do. Consider Jonah, and Jesus in the garden. It is not easy easy.

After we are saved and blessed of God, the devil will sidetrack us if he can. Maybe God calls someone to preach and here comes the devil. He tells you that since you have a good salary, it will be alright or even better if you support several preachers financially and you will be doing more good. So they let others have a credit card and financial support and think they are getting by. The devil is smart and he always comes up with some plan to cheat you out of eternal life.

We have to pray through all these things to find God's will. Remember we have a will, our family has a will, friends have a will for us and God has a will for us. We must find God's will if we are to please Him.

If we follow our own mind, we will lose eternal life; if we follow others the chances are that we will go down in defeat; if we follow the devil's plan we are doomed. We must follow the Lord's will. Much of His will is revealed in His word. Some have prayed for God's will to be revealed to them and His will has already been revealed to them in His word. II Cor. 6:14-15 "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? And what communion hath light with darkness: And what concord hath Christ with Belial? Or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel?"

We then know it is not God's will for us to be yoked in marriage or religious work with unbelievers or infidels.

Some have prayed and said it was the will of God for them to leave their spouse and marry someone else but God's will is revealed in his word. Matt. 19:19 "And I say unto you, Whosoever shall put away his wife except it be for fornication, and shall marry another, committeth adultry; and who so marrieth her which is put away doth commit adultery." Also I Cor. 7:10-11 "And unto the married I command, yet not I, but the Lord, Let not the wife depart from her husband; But and if she depart, let her remain unmarried, or be reconciled to her husband; and let not the husband put away his wife." Mark 10:9-12 "What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder. And in the house his disciples asked him again of the same matter. And he saith unto them. Whosoever shall put away his wife. and marry another, committeth adultery against her. And if a woman shall put away her husband, and be married to another, she committeth adultery." God's will does not need to be revealed by prayer when it is plainly revealed in his word. When we find God's word condemns something we want to do, we need not pray for His will to be revealed. We already know it. When He tells us to do something like in John 13:14. "If I then your Lord and master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet." We do not need to pray for His will to be revealed. We already know it is His will for us to wash one anothers feet. His will is revealed in his word. The thing we need to pray about is our willingness to obey His will for us. Much of His will is contained in His word and if we obey His word, we arein His I do not have to pray whether it is God's will for me to attend prayer meeting and preaching services at the church. Hebrews 10:25 "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." I am disobeying His will unless I have a justifiable reason and not just an excuse.

If we ignore God's word in not doing what He plainly commands us, then we will be in trouble when we try to find His will be direct revelation through prayer.

IN THE LAST DAYS

This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, traitors, heady, highminded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God; having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away. Boundary lines have been fought over and changed, political policies within nations have caused civil wars, and riots have shown the tempers of the restless populations of the cities around the world. "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee. Trust ye in the Lord forever: for the Lord Jehovah is everlasting strength." Isaiah 26:3,4.

Today we live in the time of which Paul said people would have a form of godliness but deny the power thereof. We find a vast number of people who claim to be Christians that are like Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden. The root of their sin when they ate of the forbidden tree was in their yielding to the desire planted by satan to be like someone else. God led the Children of Israel from Egypt and demonstrated His power at the Red sea, yet while Moses was on Mt. Sinai with God, the people had Aaron to make a golden calf that they might worship it as the Egyptians did. God was with them in the cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night for 40 years in the wilderness. He fed them with manna and quail and gave them water from the rock. He held back the water of the Jordan at flood time for them to cross into the promised land. God miraculously caused the walls of Jericho to fall and helped them to conquer the land but they rejected Him as their leader. They wanted a visible King that they might be like other people. They adopted the ods of their neighboring nations and incorporated their

heathen worship into their worship of the True God until God said, "Mine heritage is as a speckled bird," Jeremiah 12:9. Jeremiah also said they had corrupted their worship until their children would remember only their heathen ways. Ezekiel likened them to a wild vine that was good for nothing but fuel to be burned.

The Israelites were so arrogant in the fact they were God's chosen people and were called by His name that they railed to see the reason for their being chosen was to be an instrument for God to use to show His Love and power to other nations of the world. He had chosen them that they might be a special people and reflect His desire to all people and then bring forth the One who could forgive their sins and give them eternal life.

When Jesus came, the chosen people were so far from God, He had to preach to them before the rest of the world could hear the glorious news. The message of Christ though would have set them apart and made them different so they rejected it and crucified the One who wanted to be their Saviour. "He came unto His own, and His own received Him not", John 1:11.

God has always had a faithful witness and so it was with the message Jesus preached. A few faithful followers continued to spread the message of salvation and deliverance from sin through the blood of Jesus Christ. Though persecution was severe and many were killed, they remained true. The gospel message spread through southern Europe and Asia Minor as the disciples taught it until about 190 A.D. when deviations began to creep into the belief of some of the newer converts. Theodosius (378-398 A.D.) made Christianity the State religion of the Roman Empire. Christ had designed to conquer by purely spiritual and moral means. Up to this time those who embraced Christianity did so by voluntary conversion and a genuine change of heart but by compulsory church membership the church became a political organization and took a nose dive into apostacy. Doctrines such as eternal tormentism, unconditional election and the immortal soul, which the church fathers did not preach, began to surface. Augustine (340-430 A.D.), a bishop in northern Africa and a noted theologian, did much to mold the doctrines of the church and many people take the traditional teachings which are foreign to the doctrine of Jesus Christ instead of searching the scriptures.

Today we have a repeat of history and another speckled bird. Many who call themselves Christians copy the people of the world. They attend church when they want to or have nothing else to do. When they do go they want to look like the people who do not even profess to serve God. When they go to town or on the job their mode of dress and conduct is the same as those who care not for God and take His name in vain. They say it is old fashioned to hold to the teachings of our forefathers. Through the years Reformers sent from God have helped people to revive and serve God again but in a short while they fall back again and become worse than before. Even their form of godliness fails to interest the multitudes and those who would search for something better than the cold formalism of the churches today are falling for a substitute which is superficial. Again let us go back into history. A young king named Josiah who reigned in one of Israel's dark pages of history, found a book of the law. After having it read he had all the idols and their altars torn down and renewed the worship in the temple. This, however, was only a face lifting, it did not change the heart and people were soon as wicked as they were before.

Today there are many cults and isms sweeping the land in the name of Christianity. They look well on the surface but are unworthy of the name of Christ. They are like the bill board at the side of the road. The front which you see as you drive along looks nice but look back at the other side-it is nothing but a skeleton. The Greeks told Phillip, "We would see Jesus." Friends, He is the One the world needs to see. When prayer change things, it is the one who prays that it changes. It teaches one to go through a trial. It gives courage to face an issue and strength to do the task.


Jesus prayed for the above needs and taught his disciples to pray.

TITHING-A DIVINE INSTITUTION By Myrtle Carney

To tithe is to give unto God one tenth. The ancient Hebrews practiced tithing by giving one-tenth of their harvest and increase of the herd. Today Christians think of tithing as giving one-tenth of their income of money.

Sadly enough most all churches stay afloat financially because of the faithful support of only a small percentage of their congregation. This group holds sacred the O.T. scriptures (Gen. 28:22, Lev. 27:30, Mal. 3:8-10 and I Sam. 8:15) on tithing and accept the custom in the days of Jesus and the early church (Matt 23:23, Luke 11:42 and I Cor. 16:2). Many other scriptures are available. However, in the next few paragraphs I'd like to go deeper in the Word and approach the other part of the congregation who show up at church each Sunday Morning and expect "something for nothing."

Gen. 1:1 "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth." Does that sound like men are owners? Or does it sound as if all men are sharecroppers of God? By creation God became owner of heaven and earth, and if owner, then we are his servants, stewards and merely tenants of this earth. I further suggest that man never owned a farm, a mine, a factory, a house, or a business. The things which man proudly claims as his own, are his only for a sojourn. How does any owner expect the occupant of a store, office, or anything to recognize him? By paying rent. What does the man holding a mortgage on your home expect of you? You must keep that paper legally alive or forfeit the title.

The minimum rate of giving is the tithe or tenth. It is the minimum for Christian living. Some acclaim "the O.T. had the tithe written in its law, and that we live under grace not law." Very well, we are living under Love as manifested by Jesus Christ. Let us then look to the Master for His instruction. Some 400 years after Malachi challenged the people "to bring the whole tithe into the storehouse of the Lord," Jesus stood on a mountain and set forth the principals of the Kingdom. Christ was a keen observer of nature—He saw men ruined by the love of money, putting it before God. So our Lord gave this tremendous injunction in Matt. 6:33, "Seek ye first the Kingdon of God." Money caused so many people to lose their souls, that of the many parables of Jesus, approximately 1/3 of them stress the right

use of possessions. Jesus came not to destroy but to fulfill the law. Tithing was a Jewish law and Jesus did not abolish it. He went beyond in His teaching and practice. Christ taught PRINCIPALS NOT LAW, SITUATIONS NOT TRADITIONS. LOVE NOT DUTY, SERVICE FOR LOVE'S SAKE NOT SLAVERY, GIVING NOT GETTING.

It is not "easy" to tithe for someone who lacks in love for Christ and in zeal for His cause; but to the devout, whether rich or poor, it is a delight. I pity the man who feels it is a duty to tithe, and knows nothing of the joy of giving to the Lord. The Christian who tithes as an act of worship finds in the practice a sense of fellowship and unity with the Lord. and a recipient of the manifold blessing of God.

Since Jesus taught the 2nd mile principal, how can we go the 2nd mile without going the first. The first mile is tithing, and thing is the rule of O.T. stewardship. The O.T. is a preluct to the N.T. and Jesus lifted, raised, and perfected the O.T. standards. He never intended to make tithing a burden. He looked upon the principal as a venture of faith. If there is anything more Biblical than tithing, I have yet to find it. It does take faith to tithe. When the pay check comes and there are more bills than dollars, it takes real courage to say, "Our tithe must come first" (Matt. 6:33) This is no theoretical statement—Tithing is a test of Faith. Are you a Tipper or a Tither? Your church has a Lamb's

Are you a Tipper or a Tither? Your church has a Lamb's Book of Life, The Financial Secretary's Book. It contains the names of saints and sinners—those who live selfishly or by love and sacrifice. They are all there, the attendant and the absentee, the pillar and the sleeper, the wing and the weight, the supporter and the sponge. But the sad tragic picture is, there are more tippers than tithers. More who want Christ's life blood for nothing than those who appreciate it enough to Live By Faith.

The tithe is no experiment. In all lands, Christian believers of every name have demonstrated it a present-day method of financing the Kingdom that is practicable, equitable and efficient. Nor is it merely a superior financial system, pleasing to God and profitable to the church. It's spiritual results commend it as a Divine Institution. Next to prayer itself, it is the surest means of keeping alive a sense of dependence on God. It is a form of Thanksgiving that affords the best possible expression of heart gratitude.

EARLY HISTORY OF THE GREEK TEXTUS RECEPTUS

Textus Receptus is the Latin for Received Text. This is the Greek Text used as a basis for the translation of the King James Bible in 1611. However, this collection of canonical manuscripts, written in the Greek language, did not receive the name Textus Receptus until the days of the Elzevir brothers in 1624. In the preface of their Greek New Testament they printed the following words translated into English. "Therefore thou has the text (Textum) now received (receptum) by all, IN WHICH WE GIVE NOTHING ALTERED OR CORRUPT." From Textum Receptum came the words we now use as the Textus Receptus, or Received Text.

THE RECEIVED TEXT WAS THE GREEK VULGATE

At first the Textus Receptus, or Received Text was known as the Greek Vulgate (1). Vulgate means that which is popular; the usual or best known, and most used by the majority of the people. This was the text used by the Apostles in separate manuscript form. When the Spirit-directed consciousness of the early church gathered these separate God-inspired manuscripts into book form, they had the Received Text, The Textus Receptus.

"QUEEN" OF BIBLE VERSIONS 150 A.D.

A number of good textual authorities state that the Bible of the Syrian Church, the Peshitta, was translated from the Greek Vulgate into Syrian about 150 A.D. This view is favored by G. H. Gwilliam, learned Syrian scholar and editor. His views are supported by Burgon and Miller, and others (2). This Peshitta version is admired by Syriac scholars as a careful, faithful, simple, direct, literal version, clear and forceful in style. These characteristics have given it the title "Queen of the Versions."


Antioch was the capital of Syria where the early believers were first called Christians, (Acts 11:26). In a few years the Syrian believers could be numbered by the thousands. Their Bible, the Peshitta, even today, generally follows the Received Text. This is another proof that the foundation for the King James Bible is older and more reliable than the Vatican manuscript, which was elevated to the chair of authority by Westcott and Hort.

An excerpt from the Thompson Chain Reference Bibles account of the Dead Sea Scrolls of the Book of Isaiah, that was written around 200 years B.C. stating in almost exact agreement with the King James Version.

The excerpt: The most important and best preserved of all these manuscripts were found by the young shepherds in cave I. The four which were purchased by St. Mark's Monastery were: (1) The scroll of Isaiah, known as St. Mark's Isaiah scroll, which was written on seventeen sheets of parchment sewn together end-to-end, making a scroll 24 feet long and 10.2 inches high. It is the largest and best

preserved of all the scrolls, and was written in an early form of the "square letter," which according to Dr. Albright places it in the second century B.C. This makes it the oldest known complete Hebrew manuscript of any Biblical book, and it agrees in almost every respect with our traditional Hebrew texts, as used in the translation of the King James Version of our Bible.
