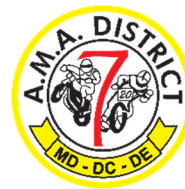




AMA District 7 Dirt Track Racing Supplementary Rules



Welcome to the world of amateur/semi-pro dirt track (1/2mile, TT, & short track) racing.
Here are a few rules and District 7 Sports Association policies for the new riders and a reminder for the experienced rider.

I COMPETITION APPAREL

- Helmet** – Full coverage or shatterproof goggles w/ helmet. Must have eye protection. No GoPro helmet mounts.
- Boots** – A minimum of eight (8) inches high. This applies to youth riders also. No sneakers will be allowed.
- Leathers** - (or heavy duty vinyl) jackets and pants for A & B riders. Padded motocross or padded denim apparel is acceptable for all classes. Jackets/shirts must have long sleeves.
- Gloves** – Full finger gloves must be worn

II SIGNUP

- Always show your assigned number and respective class on the entry blank when signing in. Failure to do so will result in loss of District 7 points for the event.
- Competitors may enter any classes so long as the equipment meets the class requirements.
- AMA and District cards MUST be presented at sign-in. Failing to do so will result in having to reapply for eith card and paying required fees. An expert or pro card (license) does not make a competitor eligible for District 7 seasonal awards. ALL competitors must have an AMA and District 7 Dirt Track Card to collect points. NO EXCEPTIONS.

III INSPECTION & NUMBER PLATES

- The referee or tech inspector is empowered to measure motors of all place winners. Any rider refusing to allow their motor to be measured or prepare his motor for measurement automatically disqualifies themselves from any event they have competed in that day and will lose all accumulated seasonal points.
- Motorcycles may have front breaks in TT. Motorcycles must not be equipped with front breaks in all other races. Operating rear breaks are required for all semi-pro and amateur racing. ATV's MUST be equipped with WORKING kill device (cord) – compression release.
- Number plates: Three (3) number plates are required. Numbers will be at least six (6) inches in height. Nothing but numbers and letters can appear on the number plates. No fancy numbers, remember if your number can't be read, you can't be scored. ALL displayed #'s must be corresponding. ATVs shall have eight (8) inch numbers, four (4) number plates are required with one to be on handlebars.
Plates will be: "B" – Yellow with Black Numbers "A" – White with Black Numbers
Only "A" Riders who are previous season District 7 trophy recipients are eligible to have black plates with white numbers. All other riders with black plates will be required to change them to the required color combination. Be sure your number plate is the correct color.
- If any rider is found to be illegal at tear down he will automatically lose his District 7 points for any event on that day. Additional offenses of any rider found illegal will result in loss of points for 30 days for second offense and 90 days for third offense.

All classes noted will be recognized by AMA District 7. Any or all of the classes may be run and it is the responsibility of the promoter to advertise and announce prior to the event which classes may be run. At the discretion of the promoter or referee classes may be combined, due to lack of entries, etc. Classes combined will be scored and awarded

NO REAR KNOBBY TIRES EXCEPT 50cc CLASSES – all other classes must use approved dirt track tires or DOT approved street tires, on rear. Front knobby is OK. All tires in question rest on referee's final decision on tire usage. If it looks like a knobby, it is a knobby.

**A Rider who reaches the age of 16 before January 1st will be refused a Youth Mini Class Number.



V POINTS DISTRIBUTION

1 st Place	10 POINTS	6 th Place.....	2 POINTS
2 nd Place.....	8 POINTS	7 th Place.....	1 POINT
3 rd Place.....	6 POINTS	8 th Place.....	1 POINT
4 th Place.....	4 POINTS	9 th Place.....	1 POINT
5 th Place.....	3 POINTS	10 th Place.....	1 POINT

If 10 or more entries per class – 1 point

ALSO:

At District 7 events where less than 7 riders are entered in any class the points awarded for such class will be broken down as follows:

- 6 riders entered – 1st place=8 ● 2nd place=6 ● 3rd place=4 ● 4th place=3 ● 5th place=2 ● 6th place=1
- 5 riders entered – 1st place=6 ● 2nd place=4 ● 3rd place=3 ● 4th place=2 ● 5th place=1
- 4 riders entered – 1st place=4 ● 2nd place=3 ● 3rd place=2 ● 4th place=1
- 3 riders entered – 1st place=3 ● 2nd place=2 ● 3rd place=1
- 2 riders entered – 1st place=2 ● 2nd place=1
- 1 rider entered – 1st place=1

Promoters and Clubs are reminded to show numbers of riders entered in respective classes on report form.

AMA District 7 has a season high point contest for both A and B riders in 1/2mile, TT, & short track. The points accumulated by a rider in the current season ONLY are the points used in determining the season contest winners. The AMA District 7 Season runs December 1st thru November 30th.

**In case of a tie the winner will be determined by the results of the last race.*

VI PRACTICES

1. Youth riders will practice separately from all other classes.

VII FLAGS

- Green – Start of Race
- Yellow – Danger on Track
- White – One (1) lap to go to finish
- Red – Stopping Race
- Black and White Checkered – Finish
- Black – Disqualification of Individual Rider
- White with Red Cross – Ambulance on Track
- Light Blue – Move over another rider is trying to pass

VIII DISTRICT 7 NUMBERS

In order to keep your same number, your application to renew your number must be received by the numbers/cards chairperson no later than December 31st of current year. After that date, your number is open to anyone who requests it. No exceptions will be made. If you request a different number, your application will be held until the first of the new year and if the former holder does not renew the number, it will be yours.

PIT RACING AT ANYTIME WILL MEAN INSTANT DISQUALIFICATION for the day and possible fine, at the discretion of the referee.
