## License Practical Nursing

- Q. When is open enrollment and when is the start date?
- A. We accept applications from August 1<sup>st</sup> to November 1<sup>st</sup>. The start date is in the spring semester, January.
- Q. What is considered a complete packet?
- A. A complete packet includes the required documents: application, CNA certification, Wonderlic and Accuplacer scores, official High School /official GED Scores/official, college transcripts, immunization records, and job reference letters.
- Q. How long is the course?
- A. 18 months, the course starts in the spring (January) and ends the following year in the summer (June).
- Q. Is financial aid available?
- A. Yes, financial aid is available and you may obtain information from the student services department.
- Q. How many people are accepted into the program?
- A. The program accepts 55 students.
- Q. How is the selection for each class determined?
- A. You must have a CNA certification before applying for the LPN program. The process is based on a scoring system, which includes providing reference letters, scores from the Accuplacer and Wonderlic tests, and having prerequisite courses that may transfer.
- Q. When and where is the Accuplacer and Wonderlic test given?
- A. Both tests are administered in the Financial Aid Office. The cost of the Accuplacer test is \$10 and \$15 for the Wonderlic test. No appointment is needed, but it is given on a first come first serve basis. You may test M-F from 730 a.m. to 12 p.m. The Accuplacer is good up to 3 years and can be retaken 14 days later, but you will have to pay another fee. A photo I.D. is required.
- Q. How will I know if I am accepted into the program that I chose?
- A. You will be notified by mail, phone, or email.
- Q. If I am not selected, do I need to reapply?
- A. Yes, you will need to reapply and complete another application along with work references or personal references.
