Planning your Annual Programme of Events?

## PUBLIC AFFAIRS COP26

COP26 is the 2021 UN climate change conference which takes place in Glasgow between 31 October and 12 November. COP stands for "Conference of the Parties" and brings together the countries that signed the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change that came

into force in 1994.

NFWI's focus for this event is on how climate change particularly impacts on women and girls. (The campaign pack is called The Whole Story). A common criticism of COP conferences is that they "manufacture loopholes" through which Governments worldwide, can wriggle out of their commitments. The UK Government has a responsibility to make sure all climate agreements produced at COP26 are without these loopholes, so NFWI have worked with project designer Jane Bolsover, to produce a pattern for a simple



crocheted "no more loopholes" bracelet. This bracelet can be sent to our MP (among others) to raise awareness of COP26. 



In the lead up to and following the Annual Meeting, WIs have been discussing the proposed ovarian cancer resolution and deciding how they wish to vote.

Link Delegates and Federation Representatives have cast these votes and we are happy to confirm that the resolution 'A call to increase awareness of the subtle signs of ovarian cancer' has passed with a majority of 99.48%.



This means the resolution is now an NFWI mandate and will form the basis of a national WI campaign which all members are invited to work on.

## **Orange and Date Fruit Salad**

This is a delicious fruit salad that I made on our camping holiday.

#### **Serves 4**

4 large oranges 100g dates Small bunch of mint



Slice the top and bottom off the oranges, stand them on a board and run a sharp knife vertically down them to remove all the skin and pith. Holding the fruit over a bowl to catch the juice, slice down between the membranes to give segments. Chop the dates and the mint and mix everything together. Chill if you can before eating. The last bit isn't possible in a tent!
