The Atomic Bomb . . .

or Heaven or Hell on Earth, Which Shall it Be?

To begin this message I want to read a statement by Dr. Leslie W. Ball, Los Angeles Physicist, that was published in a Minneapolis paper. Dr. Ball, addressing the United Nations committee said "That while the United States has enough atomic bombs for the wholesale destruction of cities throughout the face of the earth. atomic warfare, nevertheless, has greatly weakened this country as a world power." And he said further, "Even a relatively small nation, such as Portugal, could devastate this area before we had time to master our powerful forces. Wealth or a lack of it no longer is a factor in manufacturing bombs, for while we may have to use dollars, other nations can use slave labor.

The above statement comes from a man that speaks with authority. He worked on the atomic bomb project in Handford, Washington. Scientists who know agree that the atomic bomb is the greatest power ever assembled to date, and they agree, too, that they have only tapped this great reservoir of power. May I say here that these men did not invent or create this mighty power. It was already here. It came from God. Back of it all is a Great Master Hand. They only discovered what God had done. We know the devastation wrought in the two cities in Japan where the first two bombs were dropped. At least sixty percent of those large cities were destroyed. Great buildings of concrete and steel were wiped out. Thousands were smothered and burned to death. The steel tower upon which the initial test was made was melted. No such power was ever released before. When When I read the first accounts of the effects of this mighty bomb I said then, that such power, while assembled by men, could only come from the Creator of this great Universe.

Power To Destroy The World.
The Bible teaches that God one

time destroyed the world with water and St. Peter teaches that He will again destroy it with fire. These things seemed far away except in the faith we have but they are not anymore. This bomb proves that the entire world could be destroyed with one great flash of this atomic power, that God could wipe every living thing from the face of the earth in one moment's time. That is the power of God. That is the power we face today whether we want to or not. God is back of this atomic bomb. It's the hottest thing that men have ever had hold of and they



don't know what to do with it. It brings a holy awe over me and yet it thrills my soul. I trust that the knowledge of it will bring a revival, and that is what we need, an old-fashioned, heaven-born, God-sent revival, that will reveal to people what the God of this Universe really is, and what He can do, either for or against them.

Heaven or Hell on This Earth, Which Shall It Be?

Shortly after the first story came out of the atomic bomb being dropped on those Japanese cities an article came out in the Kansas City Star under the title, "Heaven or Hell on This Earth, Which Shall It Be?" The editor was referring to the deadly power of this bomb and what a blessing or curse it could be to humanity, dependent of course, on how it was used. Developed for commercial purposes it could revolutionize the economical world, or used in another war it could destroy civilization. The inside men know that because of this power the world is sitting on a powder keg today. They are afraid, and they don't know what to do about it.

Heaven or Hell Spiritually.

When I read of this mighty power it flashed over me that here is a fulfillment of scripture. Here is a revelation of the power of God Almighty that men face spiritually, and our lives can either be a Heaven or Hell on earth, and can end in the same manner. It all depends on which side we are on. If we are up against God we are fighting the greatest power the world has ever known. God has dealt with both men and nations all down through time but some of it has seemed only as a tale that was told. Now we are beginning to know. Modernists in our pulpits have ridiculed some of these Bible truths. Now they are going to know. Friends I have believed the Bible all my life, but when I see men and nations crumbling today under the power of God I believe it more strongly than ever. These things are confirming it.

In Psalm 37:35-37, you have my text. "I have seen the wicked in great power, and spreading himself like a green bay tree, yet he passed away, and lo, he was not yea I sought him, but he could not be found. Mark the perfect man, and behold the upright, for the end of that man is peace." David here has presented the case of men both against God and for Him and let us notice the results in a modern day and in a practical way.

We have witnessed during the past year the fall of some of the strongest and greatest men and nations the world has ever known and for a few minutes I want to call the roll.

Take Mussolini first, the strong man of Italy. A few years back he was denominated the World's Dictator. Many preachers held him to be the "man of sin" and the coming "World Dictator." He's gone. They led him out to the place of execution and he was too big a coward to face the music and was shot in the back. Then they took him to town and hung him up by the heels in the public square for all the people to look at. God's atomic power hit him.

Take Hitler, second, the strong man of Germany. In his last years he stole Mussolini's glory and

And then picked up the fragments that remained which was 12 baskets.

When Jesus passed by the pool called Bethesda, there were many cripples waiting for the moving of the water. One man had an infirmity for 38 years. Jesus said unto him, "Wilt thou be made whole?" On the cross, he said, "Forgive them, Father." He drank the cup of woe.

The ministry of the master model, Jesus was brief, but into those three years was crowded enough truth to regenerate all mankind. Christ has offered a cure unfailing for all sin. Jn. 13:15, "For I have given you an example that ye should do as I have done." And Jn. 14:12, "He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do, because I go unto my Father." Let us invoice our lives. HUNGER IN BERLIN

Tragic postwar conditions still are rampant in Central Europe, with hunger and starvation threatening millions. Pastor Grueber, head of the Protestant church relief office in Berlin, declares: "One

third of the children of Berlin are in danger of tuberculosis. Once they contract it, they are lost, since hope of recovery with the present shortage of medicines and nourishment infinitesimal. Should an epidemic of a virulent type of influenza break out this winter, the fate of Berlin's children would be decided."

YOUTH FOR CHRIST IN BRITAIN

The Youth for Christ movement has sent a team of five evangelists to the British Isles "to bring 1,000,000 British young people into Youth for Christ." Billy Graham, vice-president of the organization, declared in comment on the purpose of the campaign: "Never before has Great Britain been in such a desperate spiritual depression as that in which she now finds herself. With less than 1 per cent of the young people attending church, English political, social, and church leaders recognize that Great Britain will be pagan in the next generation unless a spiritual reawakening takes place."

RELIGIOUS CENTERS FOR STUDENTS

Plans for the spending of \$2,000,000 on religious student centers on the campuses of American nonsectarian colleges have been presented to the National Lutheran Council, reports Religious News Service. Dr. A. R. Weng, chairman of the Council's student service commission, says that more than 80,000 Lutheran young people are now in attendance at non-Lutheran schools and the number is rapidly increasing because of the large number of Lutheran war veterans making use of the G-I Bill educational program.

RELIGION IN RUSSIA

The trend toward religion in Russia is described by Oriana Atkinson, writing under the title, "My Life Behind the Iron Curtain." in Woman's Home Companion. She says: "Today the great swelling tide of the people's desire for religion seems to have burst the dam of official restriction. . . . A visit to any orthodox church will prove to anybody that the people are determined to worship. I attended several masses in small churches in poor districts of Moscow, and the way the people flocked there filled me with awe. I have never seen a drowning man gasp for breath, nor have I seen a starving man cram his mouth with food long denied. But now I can easily imagine how the lungs of one inhale as deeply as possible, how the other almost frantically stuffs himself when he is given a meal. That is the way the people worship in Moscow."

CONSUMPTION OF TOBACCO

"During the past twelve months the American people have smoked one billion cigarettes a day. This is a daily average of about 7 ½ cigarettes for every man, woman, and child, or about 16½ for each of the 60,000,000 who actually smoke," writes Ross L. Holman in the Christian Herald. "Since each cigarette contains about 2 per cent nicotine by weight, it means more than a million and a half pounds of one of the deadliest poisons in the world are used up in the cigarettes consumed by these 60,000,-000 smokers each year. When reduced to its lowest terms, the amount of nicotine in the number of cigarettes you as an average smoker consume every twenty-four hours would mean instant death if administered as a single dose. In fact, each single cigarette contains 1/1500 of an ounce, which within itself is a third of a fatal dose.

Encyclical Letter of His Holiness Leo XIII, by Divine Providence, Pope

To the Jesuits, Primates, Archbishops, and other Ordinaries in Peace and Communion with the Apostolic See of the entire World.

For the temporal reign of the future popes, in the land discovered by Christopher Columbus, known as the United States of America.

Venerable Brethren: Greeting and the Apostolic Benediction, Leo, bishop and servant of the servants of God; be it remembered by posterity that he is omnipotent in heaven and on earth, hath confided his church, which is one Holy Catholic, and Apostolic, and out of which there is no salvation to one man upon earth, namely, to Peter, prince and apostle, and to the bishops of Rome, his successors, with full power to rule over it.

This pontiff alone hath been constituted head over all nations and kingdoms, and invested with power to destroy, to separate, to scatter, and subvert, to plant, build up and link together by mutual charity, in order to preserve the faithful in the spirit of unity, and to surrender them whole and entire to the Savior.

In order to fulfill the duties imposed on us by the divine goodness, we labor incessantly to maintain the unity of the Roman Catholic religion, which God hath visited with heavy conflicts to the end that His own may be tried, and for our correction; but the numbers and power of the wicked have so far prevailed, that no portion of the earth has escaped their attempts to propagate their infectious and detested dogmas, being supported, among others by that slave to every species of crime.

The American republic under Protestant rulers is with the worst enemies of the church where security is offered; this republic having seized upon the lands discovered by Christopher Columbus, a Catholic, and usurped the authority and jurisdiction of the supreme head of the church, the United States is filled with obscure heretics.

The Catholics have been oppressed, and the preachers of iniqity established.

The sacrifice of the mass, prayers, fastings, abstinence, celibacy and all the rites of Catholicity have been ignored by Protestants.

The United States has been filled with books containing the most flagrant heresies of which the Protestant version of the Bible is chief. And not content with adopting its false and impious doctrines, proselyting has been resorted to, to turn the Catholics from the true church. The whole Roman Catholic hierarchy and priesthood of the world have been deprived of their livings by the heretics of America.

Courts have been set up and rendered decisions in ecclesiastical causes, and the people forbidden to acknowledge the authority of the Roman church, or to obey its ordinances and canonical decisions.

Naturalization oaths have been demanded in order that the subjects of the true church might be made to subscribe to the United States constitution, with its impious laws and nefarious teachings, to compel them to renounce the true authority of the Catholic pontiff; to dis-acknowledge him to be the head of both church and state, whereby those who have been compelled to suffer spiritual afflictions.

The Catholic bishops and clergy have been deprived of vast lands, and this is known to all. Palliation, argument or protest on the part of the United States is unavailing.

We find, moreover, that impiety and crime have increased and that persecution against the religion of Rome has been redoubled by the Protestants dwelling in the United States of America.

With deep sorrow we are now constrained to have recourse to the arm of justice, and are obliged to take action against a nation that has rejected the pope as head of all church and state governments.

In virtue, therefore, of the devine authority by which we have been placed on this supreme throne to our capability, we do in the plentitude of apostolic power declare that all heretics and unbelievers have incurred the substance

of excommunication, and they are hereby cut off from the unity of the body of Jesus Christ.

Moreover, we proclaim the people of the United States of America to have forfeited all right to rule said republic, and also all dominion, dignity and privileges appertaining to it. We likewise declare that all subjects of every rank and condition in the United States, and every individual who has taken any oath of allegiance to the United States in any way whatever may be absolved from said oath, as also from all duty, fidelity, or obedience on or about the 5th of September, 1893, when the Catholic congress shall convene at Chicago, Illinois, as we shall exonerate them from all engagements, and on or about the feast of Ignathus Loyola, in the year of our Lord, 1893. It will be the duty of the faithful to externinate all heresies found within the jurisdiction of the United States of America.

As the circulation of this bull, by sending to all places, would become a difficulty, it is commanded that copies of it be taken and signed by Jesuit notaries, subscribed by a bishop, and sealed with the seal of our court; they will then have the same power and efficacy as these presents here.

Given at St. Peters, Rome, on the 25th of December, 1891, the fifteenth year of Our Pontificate. LEO XIII, Pope.—Reprinted from the American, of Omaha, Nebr., Dec. 30, 1892.



Yes, my friends, God still lives and deals with both men and nations.

A Bible Example.

Let me give you one Bible example. Take Belshazzer who made a great feast to a thousand of his lords and drank wine, and praised the gods of gold, and of silver, and wood and stone, who insulted God by using the vessels of the sanctuary at Jerusalem, while the armies beat at the gates from the outside. It was in the midst of this hilarity that the "Hand Writing" appeared on the wall. Before Daniel interpreted the hand writing he preached a little sermon in about these words. "Belshazzer, vou know what God did for Nebuchadnezzar your father. People trembled and feared before If you move, notify the Apostolic Faith . . . giving both your old and new addresses.

him. He set some up and put some down. He slew some and kept some alive. He had great power but when his heart was lifted up and his mind hardened with pride he was deposed from his kingly throne, and went out among the wild beasts to eat grass like the oxen, "till he knew that the most high God ruled in the kingdom of men." Then he pronounced Belshazzar's fate in the interpretation of just one little word among others written on the wall. "Tekel thou art weighed in the balances, and art found wanting." That night Belshazzar was slain and his kingdom taken.

In my home community when I was a boy lived two families. The mothers in these homes were sisters. These families quarreled and fought and cursed each other and were often heard by their neighbors. One of the women finally took sick unto death. The night she passed into eternity she screamed and fought and begged those sitting up with her to keep the devils from off her bed and she went out that way. An uncle of mine who sat up with her had claimed to be an infidel but he wasn't after that night. Yes, my friends, we need to "Fear Him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.'

Conclusion.

"Mark the perfect man, and behold the upright, for the end of that man is peace." In these few words David reveals the other side of this picture. The power of God can make a heaven on earth if rightly used, and in the end give us access to the many mansions in my Father's house. Jesus Christ has the authority to deliver us from the power of sin and evil and to keep us if we believe in Him and trust Him. He alone can give the peace the world craves and needs. "My peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you,' He said, and "Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be

afraid." Paul termed the Christian experience, "joy unspeakable and full of glory." And again he said, "Godliness is profiitable unto all things, having the promise of the life that now is. and of that which is to come." No man ever missed the mark in giving his heart to Christ and serving Him. The way of life and peace and happiness, and church fellowship, and a world brotherhood, can be had only in a true observance of the fundamental principles of Christianity as Christ taught them and all those who will be guided by them can have a heaven on this earth.

Not long ago Jesus took one of our little primary girls home to glory. She was a beautiful little thing as she lay there in her little white casket, with her own little dolly in her arms. As I entered the house to conduct the funeral the broken-hearted father stepped up to me and asked that I use the following text, "suffer little children to come unto me, and forbid them not, for of such is the kingdom of heaven." Mark 10:14. And that is the text I intend to use, I answered, and that was the answer to that father's broken heart, and my friends, there is no other. Christ alone holds the key to immortality.

HOW TO ASCERTAIN THE WILL OF GOD

1. Surrender your own will. I seek at the beginning to get my heart into such a state it has no will of its own in regard to a given matter.

Nine-tenths of the trouble with people is just here. Nine-tenths of the difficulties are overcome when our hearts are ready to do the Lord's will, whatever it may be. When one is truly in this state, it is usually but a little way to the knowledge of what His will is.

2. Do not depend on feelings. Having done this, I do not leave the result to feeling or simple impression. If I do so, I make myself liable to great delusions.

3. Seeking the Spirit's will through God's Word.

I seek the will of the Spirit of God through, or in connection with, the Word of God.

The Spirit and the Word must be combined. If I look to to Spirit alone without the Word, alay myself open to great delusions also. If the Holy Spirit guides us at all, He will do it according to the scriptures and never contrary to them.

4. Note providential circumstances.

Next, I take into account providential circumstances. These often plainly indicate God's will in connection with His Word and Spirit.

5. Pray.

I ask God in prayer to reveal His will to me aright.

6. Wait.

Thus, through prayer of God, the study of the Word, and reflection, I come to a deliberate judgment according to the best of my ability and knowledge, and if my mind is thus at peace, and continues so after two or three more petitions, I proceed accordingly.

In trivial matters, and in transactions involving more important issues, I have found this method always effective.—Selected.
