ILYC General Operating Rules

Approved by the Board of Trustees August 08, 2021

- 1) This is your Club, enjoy it. Do your part to keep it clean and tidy. Put away items not properly stored. Repair or report broken or damaged items. Introduce yourself to people you don't know.
- 2) Members are responsible for their families and guests. It is each member's responsibility to see that everyone using the Club under their sponsorship is following the General Operating Rules.
- 3) No pets are allowed on any Club property.
- 4) The last Club Member leaving should ensure all lights (except security lights) are out, all doors are locked, and the gate is shut.
- 5) Please return all tools and other Club equipment to the original location when you are finished with them.
- 6) Personal items, equipment, or sails shall not be dried or left in any Club buildings. Shore boxes may be stored, as space permits, in the island shelter house between the fall and spring cleanup dates.
- 7) Place all garbage and trash in trash cans, not in the fireplace or grills. If the trash can is full, remove the bag and deposit it in the dumpster. Insert new trash bag.
- 8) Please do not leave perishable food, drinks, or alcoholic beverages in the refrigerators from week to week.
- 9) Club boats are for official Club uses only.
- 10) Only one shore box may be placed at each dock. Shore boxes will not be more than 2 feet wide by 2 feet high by 4 feet long in size. All wood shore boxes must be painted white and kept in good repair. As an alternative 80 ~ 100-gallon resin or polyethylene deck box (Desert Sand, Light Taupe or Beige) may be used. Box and lid must be the same color. All electric motors and drive systems on lifts are to be permanently covered and painted white.
- 11) No one may sleep overnight in any Club building. Campers and tents will be allowed on Club property only by approval of the Board of Trustees. Dining canopies may be used.
- 12) Parents are responsible for their children. Please do not leave young children unattended on Club property.
- 13) The swimming area provides the greatest possibility of potential hazard to life. The following has been adopted: a. A life preserver ring with line will be provided at the beach area.
 - b. Young children shall not go into the water unless supervised by a parent or designee.
 - c. No pop bottles, glass, metal, or breakable items are permitted on the beach.
 - d. The safety fence will be in position at all times when the beach is clear of boats.
- 14) No diving or jumping except for supervised training is permitted from the bridge or docks.
- 15) First Aid equipment is to be supplied by each member for their personal use.
- 16) In case of accident, fire, etc. call 911 and give specific instructions.
- 17) No boats are to be on the beach except for cleaning or repair.
- 18) Parking is allowed in front of the Clubhouse at the parking blocks. No parking is permitted outside the gate on the causeway leading to the Clubhouse. This is not Club property. Car parking is also available along the Chase Ave. side of the gravel lot, as well as along the Brentlinger docks on Biff's Way

- 19) The Club property and buildings are open for use by all members. Non-Club parties or events must have approval of the Board of Trustees.
- 20) No fireworks of any kind are permitted on Club property except when sponsored by the Club and under adult supervision.
- 21) The Club locker room is provided primarily for the storage of Club leased lockers and refrigerators and is not available for other general storage unless approved by the Board of Trustees.
- 22) Club Members should use the Lost and Found Box outside the Locker Room for mislaid items.
- 23) The Club kitchen may be used by all members. It is the responsibility of each member to clean up after use.
- 24) Dry sailing (mast up and sailed) will only be permitted for those boats for which the annual dry sailing fee has been paid. Any exceptions must have approval from the Dock Master.
- 25) Members may not request a change of dock or move to dry sail to avoid making repairs to their present dock or lift. Their present dock must be in similar or better condition than their new dock before the change can be made.
- 26) Members must dispose of trash resulting from dock or lift repairs off-site if the material does not fit in the dumpster.
- 27) All boats and trailers kept (dry sail and /or winter storage) on Club property must have current registration and be maintained in operable condition. No boat or trailer storage (except Jr. Sailing) is permitted on Club property Memorial Day weekend through September 30.
- 28) Members may rent (off-site) trailer storage space for boats docked at the Club. Trailers must be identified with owner's name and have current registration. Current off-site location is Morgan's, 7963 St. Rt. 708 Russells Point, Ohio 43348. 937-407-1000
- 29) Broken dock lifts must be repaired promptly. The Dock Master and Board of Trustees must approve any additions or changes to drive units. A standardized drive unit was recommended by the Long-Range Planning Committee and approved by the Board of Trustees at the 04-27-19 meeting. This device is a 4000 lb. capacity 1 hp motor self-contained unit with GFCI and a sealed control unit.
- 30) Due to the width of the channel and the wave action within the channel, Island docks 1 through 26 are reserved for monohulled sailboats completely suspended or cradled above the water line. These sailboats shall be no longer than 20 feet in length and weighing no more than 850 pounds. Also, due to their T-Post design, Island docks 27 through 31 carry the same restrictions. Docks targeted for rental to monohulled sailboats not suspended above the water line (Cruisers) are to be determined by the Dock Master and approved by the Board of Trustees. Docks 64, 65 and 69 are reserved for Race Committee Boats.
- 31) No changes (other than basic repairs) or installation of any electrical system within the Club shall be made without approval of the Board of Trustees and an electrical inspection. All electrical hook ups will require approval form the Board of Trustees.
- 32) To ensure the longevity of our bridge, no vehicular traffic is permitted on the bridge.
- 33) The Sunfish deck is for set up, launching, retrieval, and tear down. No boats storage is permitted on the Sunfish deck without approval of the Board.
