My brothers and sisters in Christ:

I am writing to the entire Catholic community of San Diego and Imperial Counties this week to speak about the unspeakable - the sexual abuse of minors by priests which was detailed in the report of the grand jury in Pennsylvania. The individual stories of abuse that robbed the souls and violated the bodies of so many innocent children and young people during the past seventy years are shattering. For me as a bishop there is an additional level of shame, because in many instances, this abuse was magnified by the leadership of the Church that placed fear of scandal and the culture of clericalism ahead of the protection of young people. The Pennsylvania grand jury report demands action and also points the way toward reform in the life of our Church. That report reveals that the imposition of the zero tolerance policy in 2002 substantially worked. It ushered in a period in which sexual abuse of minors by priests fell dramatically through consistent reporting to civil authorities, the creation of lay boards to evaluate the truth of allegations, and the education of children about abuse. The additional reforms that we must undertake at this moment must be based on the principles that produced positive change after 2002 - an unswerving focus on protecting minors and vulnerable adults and a binding voice for the laity in determining whether an allegation is true. Any genuine reform must forcefully integrate these principles in a framework of accountability that applies to bishops in their personal lives and administrative actions.

I have already begun a process of consultation with priestly and lay leadership in the diocese of San Diego focusing on the steps we need to take locally and nationally to accomplish genuine reform. During the month of October, I will hold eight town hall meetings throughout the diocese. These meetings will focus on seeking input from people in the pews on the pathway to such reform, listening to those who have been victimized by clerical sexual abuse either directly or in their families, and praying for

God's grace to be our only guide. I invite you to be part of this effort by your presence or your prayers.

Hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Esta semana, estoy escribiendo a la comunidad católica de los Condados de San Diego e Imperial para hablar de lo innombrable - el abuso sexual de menores por sacerdotes que

fue revelado en el reporte del gran jurado en Pensilvania. Estos hechos que robaron el alma y violaron el cuerpo de tantos niños inocentes y jóvenes durante los últimos 70 años son devastadores. Yo, como obispo, siento más pena y responsabilidad porque en muchos casos los líderes de la Iglesia incrementaron el abuso al colocar el miedo al escándalo y una cultura clerical por encima de la protección de jóvenes.

El reporte del gran jurado de Pensilvania exige acción y además apunta a una reforma en la vida de nuestra Iglesia. Ese reporte muestra que la aplicación de la política de cero tolerancia del 2002 funciono. Marco el inicio de un periodo en el cual el abuso sexual de menores por sacerdotes disminuyo drásticamente gracias a la consistente denuncia a las autoridades civiles, la creación de comités laicos para evaluar la verdad de los alegatos, y la educación a niños y familias sobre el abuso sexual.

Las reformas adicionales que debemos adoptar en este momento deben tener como fundamento los principios que produjeron el cambio positivo después del 2002 - un inquebrantable enfoque en la protección de menores y adultos vulnerables y una voz obligatoria de los laicos que determinen si una alegación es verdadera y que castigo se debe aplicar. Cualquier reforma autentica debe integrar contundentemente estos principios en un marco de responsabilidad que se aplica a la vida personal y a las acciones pastorales de los obispos. Ya inicie un proceso de consulta con el liderazgo sacerdotal y laico en la diócesis de San Diego enfocada en los pasos que debemos tomar a nivel local y nacional para lograr una reforma real. Durante el mes de octubre, llevare a cabo ocho juntas a lo largo de la diócesis.

Estas juntas se enfocaran en recibir puntos de vista de los fieles sobre el camino a la reforma, escuchando a las víctimas de abuso sexual por el clero directamente o a sus familias, y orando para que la gracia de Dios sea nuestra única guía. Los invito a que se unan a este esfuerzo con su presencia u oración.
