WHERE'S THE GOLD? TIPS AND TECHNIQUES

In this column each month we will try to give newcomers to our hobby some valuable tips and techniques which may help them get more enjoyment out of recreational prospecting and mining. Who knows, it may even help them find GOLD!

THE LOST LEDGE

Ron was our guest speaker recently who talked about the Lost Dutchman Mine. This story relates to the Lost Dutchman

Since the rich glory days of the Peraltas, when gold is said to have flooded forth from the mighty "Mountain" like honey from a busy bee hive, to the time of the old German miner known as the "Dutchman," people have tried in vain to recapture that fabulous wealth provided by Mother Nature. Many have thought themselves close, but all have fallen short in this brutal quest for riches.

According to the tales told, the Peraltas themselves were the first to fall like wheat before the scythe to the cunning Apache. They say the Dutchman's own friend and partner, Jacob Wiser, felt the sting of the arrow as well. Many more would follow. Adolph Ruth lost his head in his futile search. Ed Piper lies in the Arizona soil after a life of search and turmoil. Celeste Jones, Ed Piper's arch rival, rests there also. The noble and gifted talents of Barry Storm all went for naught when the lure of the mountain drove him near mad and into an early grave in Los Angeles. The kind and gentle Al Morrow rests alone in the good earth that he loved. Lake Erie Schaefer showed me a rawhide map of Black Top Mountain which confirmed what Ruth and Storm were both on top of finding, which is the location of four mines in the east side of Black Top Mountain.

GlenMagill followed up the work of Jon Burbridge on the other side of Needle Canyon with his digs on Bluff Springs Mountain. Magill's publication of the Gonzales-Ruth maps led Bob Ward to identify correctly the proper canyon where these maps apply. Hermann Petrasch had his camp in the area for years, but was missing the key piece to solve the puzzle to the Dutchman's

mine Ward's failing health prevented him from the final solution to this "richest of all mines in America."

Estee Conatser ties together much of the information from most of these men in her book *The Sterling Leg*end. She does a most remarkable investigative report and brings to light much new information on the history of the mountains. Frank Fish wrote generally about the



mountains, as have J. Frank Dobie and Earle Stanley Gardner. Ron Eagle brings in another search site to the west in his writings. mustn't forget Travis Marlowe, who first published, in his Superstition Treasures, and now famous stone maps of the Peraltas. The maps give order to the chaos of trail signs in the mountains. Months or years could be searching around a marker when all it meant was to continue on the "marked out

trail" to the next marker.

Some say the figures that are on the stone maps, such as the horse, the priest and so forth, are only representative; nevertheless, you can look at the maps and see, line for line, the these figures appear on the mountain itself. How these stones came to be carved, and by whom, will probably always be a mystery, whereas their ultimate meaning leaves little doubt.

I studied these maps against a picture of the mountain for over four months, which is the amount of time it took me to come to the conclusion that the maps and mountain do match line for line and that the maps reveal where the mines are hidden. Many will not agree with my conclusion; however. Barry Storm did and so have many others. The maps will put you in the right location, and once there you should find Spanish markings to the mines and then you can decide for yourself.

You must remember these mountains were worked for over 200 years, off and on, and in different locations. Storm, Ruth and Schaefer concentrated on "Black Top," Burbridge and Magill


on "Bluff Springs," and Hermann Petrasch and Bob Ward around "Coffee Flat Mountain," which is also where the "Mapa del Desierto" fits to a tee with the land marks that are there, and where the "Caverna con Casa" is found. There are probably several hundred small dig sites and trail signs throughout the entire area, which only adds to the confusion of who is right and/or who is wrong. One explanation is that they were all correct with what they discovered, due to the fact that there was so much activity in all these areas.


All the people mentioned have, in their own way, contributed to the vast amount of information that can be studied before one tries to unravel these mysterious mountains and the vast hoards of treasure said to be hidden within.

The Superstition Mountains are truly a treasure hunter's paradise. I encourage you to scrutinize the maps and find the regions where they apply, then go look at the signs and try to figure them out. If, and when you do, here are some thoughts to keep in mind.

Permits must be obtained before any digging can commence. Also, you will not be able to work "a few days" and break into a mine. They were sealed and filled in such a way that it could take weeks or even months to open them up, so be prepared to stay and see it through.

Maybe you will be the one the "gods of the mountains" smile upon to whom they give up part of the treasure as they did once to an old German miner. You might, however, become another "statistic" in the long line of

Dry Land Dredging

There is a fairly new method of mining out there in the mining community that is rapidly gaining in popularity, with good reason. It is called "Vacking," and as you might suppose, involves vacuuming material.

As a suction dredge vacuums material from the bottom of the river, this is a type of dry land dredging. It involves using a small, lightweight unit to vacuum cracks and crevices of exposed bedrock. moss on exposed bedrock or boulders, or material in a dry wash in the desert. For this "dry land dredging," however, there are no uncomfortable and expensive wet-suits to don, no heavy equipment to carry and then set up, and no long period of learning how to operate the equipment, of learning where to find gold.

"Vack-Pack"

Anyone who is familiar with mining knows that there is a much larger proportion of fine gold deposited than large gold, in almost any area. Each winter, as the rivers swell with winter rains and snows, much fine gold is washed down them. The fine gold, since it is much lighter in weight, is deposited much higher on the banks, or in the material of the river, and as the high waters recede with the onset of spring and summer, much of the areas where the fine gold is deposited is left exposed up on the banks of the rivers.

These new units consist of a 2-cycle gasoline engine mounted on a 5 gallon container, which is equipped with a suction hose and a crevice nozzle. They are very effi-

cient at pulling the fine gold from moss, and at cleaning out crevices. Previous efforts to accomplish this by hand were slow and painstaking, and not very efficient. Collecting fine gold has always been one of the greatest challenges facing any miner, and some people spend years, literally, attempting to perfect their fine gold recovery.

Not only does "vacking" do an excellent job at recovering fine gold — It is a lot of fun! It is so fast, simple and easy to use, that it seems to take all the work out of mining. You are still out in the great outdoors, still getting healthy exercise, but all that's left when you remove the excess work, is the fun.

These units come on their own backpack frame, and all accessories are carried right inside the unit It is a completely self-contained unit and includes an extra fuel bottle, a crevice tool, a gold pan, a "sniffer bottle" to remove the gold from the pan, and even a sample vial to keep it in. With all these accessories, the unit weighs just 15 lbs., so you could hike into the back country with it without undue strain.

Many wives who are not interested in dredging or highbanking, enjoy using this type of unit because it is something they can do completely on their own. The only problem we have seen develop is that when some of the husbands see that the production exceeds that of their dredge or highbanker, they want to use one also. Then, they either fight over the one unit or join the growing group of "two-vack" families. Since they are such low cost units, this is easy to do.

I recently talked to one avid vack-

miner who has been using one of these units, for 2 years. He was concerned that he might possibly lose some of the fine gold out the exhaust as the unit filled, since it is so lightweight. Shortly after purchasing his unit, he fitted an elbow and extension over the exhaust, and directed it into a container of water. He has used it faithfully, and panned out the light powder that accumulated each time. He has never found even a speck of gold in it.


A crack or crevice in exposed bedrock that runs crosswise to the current of the river acts as a natural riffle, catching fine gold just as the riffles of a sluice do. The moss that accumulates on exposed bedrock acts much as the carpet in a sluice, only better! It is amazing just how much fine gold can accumulate there. These are prime areas for vacking.

Areas where people have been working with highbanking equipment have also proven to be good. Even if they have worked the area down to the bedrock, they have been unable to clean the area as thoroughly as it can be cleaned with a Vack, and generally, the richest areas are right on the bedrock

Don't forget that this equipment finds nuggets too! Even areas that have predominantly fine gold in the high bedrock will trap nuggets during flood times, and if they are there, this equipment will help you get to them as nothing else will.

All in all, vacking has such a wide range of applications, in so many areas of the country, by such a wide range of people, that the gain in popularity is very understandable. It can only be expected to grow.



BUREAU OF LAND MAN-AGEMENT UPDATE

Bill Provides Framework for Solving Development Issues in Las Vegas

Valley, BLM Official Says

A Southern Nevada land bill "provides a framework" for resolving development-related issues in the Las Vegas Valley, but the legislation needs some "fine-tuning," BLM Deputy Director Mat Millenbach told a House subcommittee today. "We believe that through continuing discussions with the bill's authors in the House and Senate, a final bill can be produced that would receive the Administration's endorsement, "Millenbach said in testimony before the House Resources Subcommittee on National Parks and Public Lands.

Millenbach testified on a bill, H.R. 449. known as the Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act of 1997, which has been introduced by Nevada Rep. John Ensign. A companion bill, S. 94, is being sponsored in the Senate by Nevada Sens. Richard Bryan and Harry Reid. The legislation is intended to promote the "orderly development" of the Las Vegas Valley - the fastest growing urban area in the United States -- by requiring the sale, exchange, or transfer of certain BLMmanaged lands located in Clark County, Nevada.

In his testimony, Millenbach noted that the Bureau has already been addressing difficult land-ownership patterns in the valley through its draft Resource Management Plan (RMP). Millenbach said the lands specified in the Ensign bill "are nearly identical to those identified for disposal in the RMP."

Millenbach said thousands of acres of BLM-managed land would be affected by the legislation and that the Bureau would like to sell much of this land "in harmony with the needs of the local jurisdictions."

Under the bill, local entities would receive 15 percent of the money from the sale of BLM public lands; the remainder would be used by the Federal Government to enhance natural resource management within Nevada.

Millenbach said the BLM would continue to work with the Nevada congressional delegation to resolve the Bureau's concerns about several provisions in the bill. Among the provisions that Millenbach cited with concern are ones requiring the Secretary of Interior to obtain local government approval before the BLM could proceed with a sale or exchange of public lands; waiving environmental laws in connection with the construction of a youth activity facility; transferring to Clark County, at no cost, 4,600 acres that are located in the Las Vegas Airport noise area; and allowing affordable housing to be an acceptable use of

the Recreation and Public Purposes Act.

Overall, Millenbach said, the bill "provides a framework to allow for a fair approach to dealing with the situation in the Las Vegas area." With the necessary revisions, the legislation will "benefit the American people and the local community as well," Millenbach said.
