Sunday Reflection – Father’s Day

Father's Day is observed on the third Sunday of June which falls on June 20th for the year 2021. Father’s Day is not designated to revere solely one’s biological father; rather modern Father’s Day suggests that we should celebrate this day with those whom we consider worthy to be our father even if they are not our fathers biologically or legally. Father’s Day is an important celebration in our lives in two ways. In one way, it gives us an opportunity to thank our fathers for their sacrifices. In another way, it helps us to understand the challenges of fatherhood. It also teaches us to stay responsible while dealing with our children because they will have to lift the burden of the nation on their shoulders one day. It is our moral obligation to train them well for such hard times.

Are we also confused about how to celebrate Father’s Day? Let me give you a few suggestions and you can plan your activities on this day.

1. Buy flowers to wish your father a happy Father’s Day.
2. Start your day by wishing your father happiness and thank him for bringing you up.
3. Bring a Father’s Day gift for him that you can afford and you think would make him happy.
4. Plan a brunch or dinner together.
5. Plan an outing or party with your family.
6. Spare time to watch a movie together or take time to sit together.
7. Share your childhood memories and feelings with your father.
8. If you are celebrating the day with someone other than your biological father, express your feelings with compassion and make him/her realize how much you revere him/her.

Saint of the Week ... St. Aloysius Gonzaga

St. Aloysius was born in Italy in 1568. He was destined for the military by his father who was in service to Philip II, but by the age of 9 Aloysius had decided on a religious life. It was at that time that he went to Florence to be educated. By age 11 he was teaching catechism to poor children, fasting three days a week, and practicing great austerities. When he was 13, he traveled with his parents to Spain and acted as a page in the court of Philip II. The more Aloysius saw of court life, the more disillusioned he became.



Feast Day: June 21

A book about the experience of Jesuit missionaries in India suggested to him the idea of entering the Society of Jesus, and in Spain his decision became final. Despite efforts by his father to convince him otherwise, Aloysius finally prevailed and was allowed to renounce his right to succession, and was received into the Jesuit novitiate.

In 1591, a plague struck Rome. The Jesuits opened a hospital of their own, and because he nursed the patients, Aloysius caught the disease. A fever persisted after his recovery and he was so weak he could scarcely rise from bed. He died three months later at the age of 23.

St. Aloysius Gonzaga is the patron saint of Catholic youth, teenagers and seminarians.

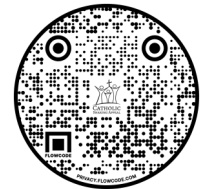
