#### ARTIFACTS FROM THE CURATOR'S CORNER

At 06:30 on June 6th 1944, Allied Forces launched a seaborne attack on five beaches on the West Coast of France: (code named) Sword, Juno, Gold, Utah and Omaha.

D-Day! "Operation Overlord." The Invasion and Liberation of Europe had begun.

This month's "Artifact from our Museum" is actually five artifacts. They are all similar. They are plentiful around the world and are fun to play in, and with, at any age... "Sand." But this is special sand, sand from the "Hallowed Ground" of those beaches.

My Uncle Richard was 18 when he enlisted in 1942 as a member of the 29th Infantry Division made up of men from Pennsylvania and Virginia. They had been practicing landings all around the British Isles for almost a year preparing for this single day.

On June 6, 1944, he was part of the first wave of assault troops following the Army Ranger Battalion to attack Omaha Beach. According to the Western Union cable my grandparents received, he was one of the first to die that day on Omaha Beach.



British, Canadian and Free French Forces were also part of the invasion concentrating their attacks on the other four beaches. Omaha Beach was the heaviest defended by the Germans and was the "bloodiest" of all the invasion sites.

Total Allied casualties were estimated at over 10,000. In the ensuing "Battle of Normandy" over 73,000 Allied troops were killed and 153,000 wounded. Over 20,000 French Civilians were also killed in the fighting.

Those five beaches on the French Coast would establish the "Foothold in Europe" needed to defeat the Germans and end the costliest war in world history

#### STORIES FROM THE WALL



**John Byron Stalker**, born February 7, 1895, in Argentine, Kansas, was the third of six children born to James and Charlotte Stalker, farmers originally from Peoria, Illinois. Known as Byron during his lifetime, he mainly resided in Kansas with his family until they relocated to California around 1910-1912 (most likely drawn to the thriving citrus industry here).

Byron spent at least part of his high school years in Orange. On July 3, 1916, at age 22, he married Sarah Lela Keiser (who went by just "Lela"), daughter of another Orange farmer.

On June 5, 1917, nine months after getting married, and two months after the United States began engagement in World War I, the newlywed Byron was summoned for the draft board. Two months later, on August 11, 1917, he entered service with the U.S. Navy.

We were unable to find Byron's military service details, other than his enlistment and discharge dates. While we don't know for certain what Byron did in the Navy, we do know that the most significant contribution of the U.S. Navy during World War I was the escort and transport of two million U.S. soldiers to and from France. Byron remained in the Navy until February 17, 1919, three months after the end of World War I.

In 1920, Byron and Lela lived in Orange, where Byron worked at a lumber company as a stickerman, responsible for making or placing the sticks used when stacking fresh lumber to ensure the lumber dries evenly.

The Stalkers welcomed their son, Gail Marvin Stalker, on January 22, 1922. Now a family man, Byron likely needed more income, and by 1930 he was working as an automobile salesman while residing in Orange. By 1936, he changed careers again, this time working as a life insurance agent for the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company.

As a serviceman during World War I, Byron knew what it was like to be deployed in a foreign war, leaving his family behind. When World War II came around, Byron learned what it was like to be the *parent* of a wartime serviceman. In 1942, his son Gail, age 20, began serving in the US Army Air Corps.

Like his father, Gail returned home from WWII safely, and would begin raising a family of his own. Byron and Lela's granddaughter was born in 1947, followed by a grandson in 1953.

Throughout the years, Byron remained in Orange with his wife, working as a life insurance agent, reflecting his commitment to providing for his family and serving his community. Not much is known about the Stalkers' retired life. But we do know that Byron kept going until age 89, when he finally joined Post Everlasting on November 29, 1984.

Less than two months later, Lela joined him at Post Everlasting, on January 19, 1985. They are interred together at Fairhaven Memorial Park.

We salute you, Byron Stalker, for you and your family's wartime contributions to our country.

#### STATE PARKS AND RECREATION PASS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE? Honorably discharged war veterans who are residents of California with an overall/combined rating at 50 percent or greater service-connected disability. The Distinguished Veteran Pass entitles the holder to the use of all basic facilities (including day use, camping, and boating) in California State Parks at no charge. This is a lifetime pass and is valid for use of the pass holder only. Although the benefits are lifetime, the pass holder's pass card will need to renewed every five years.

#### CEMETERY AND BURIAL BENEFITS

Veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces residing in California are eligible to receive certain end of life benefits. For information about entitlements, contact your local CVSO (page 187) or call CalVet's Veterans Services Division at (877) 741-8532.

#### WHO SHOULD I CONTACT?

Family members of the deceased veteran should first notify their funeral director of their desire to have military funeral honors rendered at the service. The family should provide the funeral director with as much of the following as possible:

- » Name of deceased
- » Date of birth
- » Social Security Number
- » DD Form 214 (Discharge Papers)
- » Other proof of veteran status or eligibility for burial honors




