

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

IMITATE GOD'S GENEROSITY

"It's not fair!" We sympathize with the laborers who worked all day only to find out that they made not a penny more than those



who worked for only an hour. This is an obvious injustice. What's the point of having a "daily wage" and an "hourly wage" if the numbers are the same? In the first reading we hear the Lord tell Isaiah, "my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my

way" (Isaiah 55:8). Yes, from our perspective the landowner's arrangement is unfair and the consequences for the hardest workers is an injustice. But our perspective is flawed. God, source of infinite love, infinite mercy, and infinite generosity, sees this arrangement much differently. May we be humbled by Isaiah's reminder.

"Because no one has hired us" (Matthew 20:7). This is the response of the laborers who were still standing around at five

o'clock. Why hasn't' anyone hired these Perhaps they were injured, weak, or disabled. Perhaps they were lazy or uncooperative. Quite likely they were already rejected by every other landowner. But not this one. The kingdom of heaven



welcomes even those who have been rejected, who have been waiting, who did not bear the heavy burden. God's mercy and acceptance are unrestricted.

Saint Paul was in prison when he wrote the selection we hear today, unsure of what would come next. His conversion had come some twenty years earlier, around noon if one were to apply today's Gospel story to his life. In the twenty years since his conversion he had made three missionary journeys, carrying the gospel to Gentile lands from Corinth to Antioch, throughout dozens of towns in between. He was ready to meet the Lord, if that was his fate, but more than willing to continue his ministry if allowed to do so. Whatever happened, he would magnify Christ in his person as he increased the body of 'Christ, the church.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS BE SURE TO LOOK THE PART

I used to coach my oldest son in soccer when he was younger. As he got older, he would go to tryouts for select high school teams. I was no longer the coach, but I always shared with him one piece of advice before any tryout: Be sure to look the part. I told him that if he showed up looking like a soccer player, there was an increased chance of him being seen as a soccer player. If he showed up looking like a kid that plays soccer in video games as opposed to the real thing, he might not be taken seriously. As he grew older, that same advice was then applied to getting a job. It's advice I have heeded myself all my life. You can even say it is like another common phrase: "Fake it till you make it."

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we certainly do not want to fake it, but we do need to look the part. The world looks at those of us who proclaim to be Christians to see if there is anything to this way of life. If they see us looking and acting like people transformed by Jesus Christ, they will be more likely to take Christianity seriously. If they look at us and see nothing different, then they can easily conclude that there is nothing different about Jesus Christ. He just becomes simply another religious figure of history. Can the world see the power of Christ in you? How will - Tracy Earl Welliver, do you look the part?
