The Villages of Creekside Refuse / Recycling Guide

Thank you for choosing Waste In Time Disposal for your community refuse and recycling needs. Below are a few bullets about our services and contracted services.

Refuse

- Monday Morning pick up weekly - up to 5, 32 gallon trash bags weekly per residence. We are not counting bags so an occasional extra bag or two will be collected, however, If additional bags are needed on a regular basis you may purchase "extra trash" tags through our office for \$1.00 per tag. Extra Trash Tags are sold in sheets of 10.
- Place trash out Sunday Evenings. We may come through early, so to prevent a missed pick up it is advised you place your trash out for pick up on Sunday evening.
- Yard Waste such as grass clippings will require a "Yard Waste" Tag. Tags are sold for \$2.00 each and can be bought through our office in sheets of 10.
- Large bulky items (mattress, couch Etc) require a call in advance and may have an additional fee. Please call us prior to placing these items out to arrange for pick up.

Recycling

- Monday Morning pick up weekly - Unlimited. Items that are collected for recycling include:

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD: This includes any size material consisting of a fluted corrugated sheet, like **shipping boxes, packing boxes, CLEAN pizza boxes (no grease or food remnants)**, etc. Flatten all boxes and remove packaging including Styrofoam, peanuts, bubble wrap and plastic liners. **Do NOT put paperboard (cereal boxes, shoe boxes), newsprint or junk mail in the bin.**

PLASTIC BOTTLES AND JUGS: This includes **plastic bottles, jars, jugs and anything else with a neck.** Throw away the lids and rinse out any residue. All other plastic material is considered trash. Ignore the numbers, as they don't indicate if something is recyclable. Do NOT put plastic bags, toys, buckets, packaging, Styrofoam, hosing, furniture, or other plastic items in the bin.

METAL FOOD AND BEVERAGE CANS: This includes all food and beverage cans made from aluminum or steel. Throw away the lids and rinse out any residue. Do NOT put metal hangers, cooking pots and pans or other scrap metal like foil and pie plates in the bin.

GLASS: This includes clear, green and brown glass bottles and jars. Throw away the lids and rinse out any residue. Do NOT put light bulbs, dishes, glassware, window or automotive glass, vases or any other glass material in the bin.

Newspaper: Dry Newspapers (Bundled is preferred) NO JUNK MAIL or advertising inserts.

- **If you aren't sure, remember the term " When in Doubt, Throw it Out".**
