BOSTON Brings 'Hyper Space Tour' to Mystic Lake May 27

OSTON will make a stop at Mystic Lake Resort & Casino for a performance at 8 p.m. Saturday, May 27.

Always a huge crowd pleaser with their highenergy stage show, other-worldly sound, and exceptional musicianship, BOSTON prides itself on performing a totally live show, delivering an extraordinary experience that is faithful to their studio recordings.

Gaming News

New York. Schenectady, New York—famous as "the other New York City" in the development of early radio programs—is the latest city in the region to get a casino complex. Schenectady, about three hours north of Manhattan, is home to the just-opened Rivers Casino And Resort. Thousands rushed to play on opening day; the facility has more than 1,100 slot machines and 67 tables. According to some published reports, the new casino boasts about 18-hundred parking spots. Business was so brisk on opening day at the \$300-million dollar facility that local police were called out to direct traffic in the neighborhood.

Missouri. State regulators in Missouri report that despite a drop in hotel bookings at the St. Jo Frontier Casino, the popular destination continues to be in the black. In its latest report, the state of Missouri says that the facility, owned by a Las Vegasbased company, experienced a drop in visitors of about 11 percent in the most-recent filing period. But, at the same time, revenues were actually up. One officer of the casino told area media that January was a positive month for the St. Jo Frontier. The facility, along with the Mark Twain Casino in La Grange, Missouri, is owned by Affinity Gaming.

Iowa. Civic leaders in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, are looking at several proposals for new gaming facilities in that city. Among them is one from Wild Rose Entertainment. That plan would see the construction of a boutique-size, \$40-million facility as part of a new four-story downtown retail development. Discussions on expanding gaming in the city have been going on for the last four years. Meanwhile, there are fears that other facilities could be built within easy driving distance that would lessen the chances of success of new casinos in Cedar Rapids.

Big Time Birthday Win

A Delta Air Lines ramp agent took his mom's advice and bought a scratch-off lottery ticket on his 28th birthday—and it was a very smart move. Patrick Clarke, who lives in Queens, New York, said his mother gave him \$50 for his birthday. The next day, while visiting his girlfriend in Brooklyn for a birthday celebration, Clarke stopped at a deli and bought two \$10 Set for Life scratch-offs—but never imagined he would win. Back at his girlfriend's apartment, Clarke scratched one of the tickets and saw a match on number 16 with the word "Life" under it, indicating he had hit the jackpot. The jackpot prize was \$5 million, but Clarke opted to take the onetime lump sum of \$2,453,693.

Big Win Bummer for Brit

Britain's youngest EuroMillions lottery winner has revealed she is planning to take legal action against the lottery for negligence. Jane Park, who won £1 million (US\$1.25 million) at the age of 17, said winning the windfall had "ruined" her life and she often thought things would have been better if she had never won. Park, now 21, says that someone her age should not be allowed to win such a substantial sum of money. She said 18 should

She said she had become bored with relentless consumption and felt like it failed to offer longterm genuine happiness. Before winning the lottery, Park, who now owns two properties, worked as an administrative temp and lived in a small apartment with her mother in Edinburgh, Scotland.

Lotto Lag

Young Americans are showing less interest in buying lotto tickets than their parents, prompting lottery officials to worry about the odds for future growth. While overall ticket sales rose 9 percent last year versus 2015, the number of millennial players-adults in their late teens to early 30s—is falling. That is creating concern among leaders of the industry, which generates \$80 billion in annual revenue, more than the combined U.S. sales of movie tickets, music and concerts. Only a third of Americans aged 18 to 29 said they played the lottery in the past year, compared with 61 percent for those aged 50 to 64, according to a 2016 Gallup survey. The rate for millennials fell from 39 percent in surveys conducted in 2003 and 2007, Gallup said. For all other age groups, the likelihood of playing went up over the past decade.

Lottery officials say the winner was relieved to find the ticket before time ran out to claim her prize. Players have 180 days from the date of the drawing to claim their prize.

Bingo Benefits Wetlands

Crushers of Comedy, a standup comedy production company, hosted Laugh Your Bingo Off in the caves of Deerfield Ranch Winery in Kenwood, California. The event was a benefit for the Kenwood Marsh wetlands and players paid \$20 in advance or \$30 at the door to participate. Bingo games were led by stand-up comic Priya Prasad, a popular Bay Area comic who has appeared on NBC's Last Comic Standing. Players received three bingo cards per game for five games, and a range of prizes were awarded.

Bingo Thieves Prosecuted

A West Fargo, North Dakota, woman has pleaded guilty in Cass County District Court to a theft charge in connection with the theft of more than \$10,000 from a charity Bingo operation that benefited a youth hockey organization. After entering the guilty plea, the woman was sentenced to 30 days in jail followed by three years of supervised probation. According to court documents, the woman and an accomplice were working at the Bingo when the operation noticed its profits appeared to be short. Following an investigation, the women were reportedly charged with taking more than \$10,000 from the gaming locale.

Young and **Old at Bingo**

Celebration Church is a Church of God located near the Blue Ridge Parkway in Roanoke, Virginia. Among its programs is Impact Student Ministries, which invites young people to the church, engages them in worship, helps them grow, empowers them to lead, and encourages them to contribute to the community. Recently a group of Impact members engaged in community outreach by visiting Friendship Health, a rehabilitation center in Cave Spring, Virginia, where they visited residents, spent time with them, and joined in on several sessions of Bingo. The visit was part of the group's focus to go beyond the four walls of the church and to serve others, and to impact friends, family, schools and the community.

Bar Bingo in Utah

The Beer Bar and Bar X in Salt Lake City, Utah, attracted hundreds of people to play charity Bingo as a fundraiser for the regional chapter of Planned Parenthood. The bars host Bingo fundraisers every month for a different organization. "The threat of it being defunded is kind of a big deal and I think it matters to a lot of people and so we're doing our best to have a voice and let other people have a voice," Duncan Burrell, co-owner of the Beer Bar, told ABC-TV/Utah. The bars hoped to raise about \$10,000 dollars for Planned Parenthood.





Veterans Post

In-Vitro Fertilization Now a VA Benefit

Severely injured veterans with service-connected disabilities can now get reproductive treatments from the Department of Veterans Affairs as part of their benefits package. The biggest bonus will be in vitro fertilization (IVF), which had been banned until now.

Additionally, there will be fertility counseling and treatments (assisted reproductive technologies, or ART) for the spouses of those veterans. The addition of IVF will be a huge step forward for veterans who were injured by explosions, leaving them unable to procreate due to genitourinary or spinal cord injury.

Until now, the VA has provided

certain services and treatments, limited to counseling, blood testing, surgical correction, medication, diagnostics and reversal of vasectomies and tubal ligations.

The 2012 PCS Fact Sheet:
Infertility and Assisted
Reproductive Technologies
specifically says, "The medical
benefits package explicitly
prohibits in vitro fertilization."
It did, however, cover in vitro
for active-duty service members
through the Department of
Defense, but only six attempts
in three IVF cycles. Additionally,
"Only the veteran is eligible for the
VA-covered infertility treatment
services."

The new benefits are funded only through Sept. 30, 2018, so if you're considering using any of these benefits, especially IVF, don't delay. Those treatments don't always work on the first attempt, so begin early. Call the VA now to schedule a consultation and evaluation if your injury is already documented as being service connected. If you need help filing a claim and proving service-connection, contact the Wounded Warrior Project at www. woundedwarriorproject.org or 1-877-832-6997.

Long-Term Care

Dear Savvy Senior,

Is long-term care insurance a good idea? My wife and I aren't rich by any means, but what we do have we'd like to leave to our kids, not to some over-priced nursing home. What can you tell me? — Alive and Kicking

Dear Alive,

Long-term care (LTC) insurance is expensive and risky, but depending on your assets and health history, it's a good thing to consider. Here's what you should know.

Is It For You?

With the rising cost of nursing home care, averaging about \$70,000 per year, LTC insurance, which covers nursing home care, assisted living and in-home care, can be a smart option for many people. Is it right for you? Here are some things to consider:

• **Finances**: LTC insurance makes the most sense for the middle class (assets between \$100,000 and \$2 million). People below this level probably can't afford the premiums and can

fall back on Medicaid, and those above it can afford LTC on their own. Remember that Medicare and Medicare supplemental (Medigap) policies do not pay LTC expenses.

- **Health**: In most cases it's disease (like Alzheimer's and stroke), not old age that puts people in nursing homes. What's your family history of these?
- **Risks**: Believe it or not, your chances of needing LTC are high. In fact, nearly 60 percent of Americans over age 65 will need LTC at some point in their lives.

LTC Tips

LTC insurance is notoriously confusing and very expensive. A 65-year-old in good health can expect to pay between \$2,000 and \$3,000 a year for a policy, but by buying earlier (in your 50s) you can save big on your premiums. Here are some of the different features and option you should know about.

- Daily Benefit: How much coverage you get should depends on the kind of care you want and where you'll receive it (prices vary depending on where you live). Get only what you need or can afford.
- Inflation protection: If you think nursing homes are expensive now, just wait. The average costs are expected to quadruple by 2030, so get a policy with a 5 percent per year inflation protection.
- **Policy coverage:** Policies that cover nursing home care, in-home care, assisted-living facilities and

adult day care are the best, but also the most expensive. If this doesn't fit your budget, get a plan that covers only nursing home care and assisted living facilities, which are your two greatest LTC financial risks.

- **Benefit period:** With the average stay in a nursing home nearly two and a half years, a benefit period of three or fours years is a safe bet and less expensive than a lifetime benefit.
- Elimination Period: Most policies have a waiting period of 90 days that require you to pay out-of-pocket before the policy kicks in. You can adjust this, but a shorter waiting period will increase your premiums and a longer one could cost you thousands of dollars before coverage begins.
- Benefit trigger: This determines when the insurer starts paying. Most LTC plans begin paying when you can no longer do at least two of six activities of daily living, such as bathing, dressing, or using the toilet, or suffer from cognitive impairment stemming from dementia. Be sure your plan is no different.
- Tax qualified: Most LTC policies are tax qualified, which means that they may be eligible for tax deductions. Ask your accountant about this.
- **Discounts**: Some insurance companies offer discounts to couples (married or unmarried) and families (up to four) who

purchase a shared-care plan.

Policy Shopping

LTC policies are specialized, so choose an insurer that's been offering them for at least five years and one that has a claimspaying ability that is rated A-plus or better by A.M. Best (www.aaltci.com). Some top rated companies to consider are MetLife, Genworth Financial, John Hancock and Prudential who all have a history of stable pricing. A good shopping resource is Long-Term Care Quote (www.itcfp.com, (866) 471-4072), a free service that will help you compare policies.



What's New in Nevada

Monte Carlo Closes Poker Room

MGM Resorts International, the owner of the poker room at the Monte Carlo Casino in Las Vegas, says that it is in the process of closing that room. The shutdown would be the initial part of a massive change in the entire facility. A press release from the company tells media that there are plans to convert the existing area into two new hotels, the Park MGM and the NoMad Las Vegas. The planned closing will leave the Las Vegas Strip with 19 poker rooms. At one time there were more than 25 such facilities on the Strip with nearly 400 tables.

Superbowl Sees Record Betting

State regulators in Carson City report that this year's Super Bowl brought record betting handle to the state's sportsbooks; Nearly \$19 million dollars was bet. Published reports indicate that the total was \$6 million more than last year's amount, which set a record at the time. It's estimated that sportsbooks made nearly \$11 million because of the record transactions this time around. The Nevada Gaming Control Board has issued reports on Super Bowl wagering for the past 27 years. During that time, the numbers indicated the sportsbooks made a profit in all but two years.

Teens in Casinos?

At least one member of the Nevada State Legislature wants to see the state's legal age for gambling lowered by three years. According to legislative records, **GOP** Assemblyman Jim Wheeler wants to see the age set at 18. The idea of lowering the age was first proposed nearly a decade ago. Now, Wheeler, whose district is largely rural and lies east of Lake Tahoe, wants to resurrect the idea. Some observers say that the bill could face an uphill battle, with many hotel owners feeling that 18-to-21-year-olds would create more problems than it would be worth. At the current time, thirteen states allow 18-year-olds to gamble. The closest state in that category to Nevada is Idaho.

Isolated Ely has no Bingo

Although Ely, nearly 200 miles north of Las Vegas, has had gaming for almost a century, this city of a little more than 4,000 people has not, in recent years, had a major Bingo venue. Thousands visit the city each year, going to local gaming houses while in town. Many use Ely as a base of operations for exploring the Great Basin National Park, which is about an hour away. Others visit nearby ghost towns and archaeological digs. The moral of this examination of Ely is that, except when it's done at your local civic club, big-ticket Bingo can be just too expensive for all but large cities, such as Las Vegas and Reno.

When Bingo Gets Out of Control

Several months ago I wrote about a weekly Bingo session where things occasionally get out of hand. There are myriad problems at that venue. First, the games are played in a restaurant and adjacent bar where there is the usual kind of noise you would expect in that situation. Secondly, the PA system is inadequate. Third, on many nights people in the bar are allowed to play; but, the caller can't hear anyone who yells "BINGO" from that room. The possible winner has to come to the adjacent room where the caller is. By that time, the caller has usually gone on to the next number. Additionally, the hotel where the games take place often has very few prizes to give. If there's more than one winner, a play-off is necessary. Add to this the fact that alcohol is being served in both rooms. What you have here is a recipe for disaster.

We tend to think of Bingo as a fun, informal kind of game. That is true. But, in order to remain fun and informal, the game has to be organized and fair for everyone. If you let things get out of hand, it's not fair to anyone. I am glad that I am not the caller in the hotel/

bar situation I mentioned earlier. I think calling Bingo in that venue would be like trying to call Bingo and maintain order in a busy bus station.

I mention this because I used to think that the kind of regimentation I would sometimes see at professional halls in Vegas and Reno and Atlantic City was a little too much and stuffy. Now, I feel differently. But, there is a fine line between maintaining order and being too regimented. As much as I truly enjoyed the countless thousands of hours of Bingo I played while living in Las Vegas or traveling to big Bingo venues, my best times have been at the small halls where neighbors and friends play—the VFWs and the Elks and American Legions and K of C's charity halls.

Remember a year or so ago when I played Bingo back in my hometown in southern Indiana? I sat in the same cafeteria where I had played back in the mid-1950s. Bingo was part of how we paid for the new school. Everything was perfect. I wish every person reading this could go to that little town in Indiana and experience that easygoing kind of game.

So, what can we do to bring fun back to the old game? It's no wonder so few people scream when they win. It's almost as if WE are there, but the GAME isn't there anymore.

Poker Talk

The 2016 World Series of Poker Main Event drew 6,737 players, which created a massive \$63.3 million prize pool. The top prize was \$8 million, and it came down to 39-year-old Vietnam native Qui Nguyen, a baccarat player with a certain gambling panache, and 27-year-old Gordon Vayo, a young but experienced poker pro from California.

Nguyen had used aggression to pull out to a large chip lead after eight and a half hours of heads-up play. On what would be the final hand of the tournament, Nguyen raised to 8.5 million on the button with Kc 10c, and Vayo reraised all in for 53 million from the big blind with Js 10s.

Nguyen called and was a 68 percent favorite to win, while Vayo would come from behind 29 percent of the time. They would tie 2.7 percent of the time.

Many of you might question Vayo's decision to move all in with J-10 suited, as it's only a mediocre hand, not exactly a premium one. The big problem with going all in with such hands, especially over the top of a raise, is that very rarely will an opponent call with a worse hand. Instead, they tend to fold weaker hands, while stronger hands such as A-J, K-Q, etc., are

sure to call. Vayo was no doubt hoping for a fold, but his backup plan was that his J-10 would be live if he got called.

Unfortunately for Vayo, Nguyen did call, and with a better 10.

At first glance, the Kd 9c 7d flop was great for Nguyen, who paired his king. However, his chance of winning improved by only 1 percent. That's because Vayo picked up a double-gutshot straight draw, meaning that either an eight or queen would be a winner for him. One of those cards would appear 29 percent of the time with two cards to come.

The 2s turn was no help to Vayo, and his chances dropped to 18 percent. Nguyen was one card away from winning poker's most prestigious title, and he had an 82 percent chance of surviving the river.

The dealer burned one last time and put out the 3h.

And with that, Qui Nguyen, one of the least experienced players at the final table, etched his name in poker history alongside such greats as Doyle Brunson, Phil Hellmuth Jr., Johnny Chan, Stu Ungar and Johnny Moss.

"Thank you to all my friends and family," Nguyen said moments after the victory. "I'm so excited. I don't know what to say. I just tried to remind myself to never give up, to never give up. It was tiring, it was tough, but I wanted to stay aggressive and never give up, and thankfully for me it worked out."

Don't feel too bad for Vayo. Even though he didn't win, he still took home a consolation prize of \$4.7 million.

Does Where You Sit Matter?

If you are a recreational player (not card counting), then mathematically, it makes no difference where you sit. Are you surprised at the answer? I know many players are, because they mistakenly believe that the third base player (also known as the anchor player) can influence whether the table wins or loses by how he (or her) plays his (or her) hand. Some players even expect the anchor player to "sacrifice" his hand for the betterment of his fellow table players (no, I'm not kidding you on this). Why do players believe this? Probably because they vividly remember the times that an anchor player misplayed his hand and screwed the other table players. It goes something like this:

"I'm sitting there playing blackjack and minding my own business when that anchor fellow decides to hit his 16 with the dealer showing a 6. We tried to convince the dummy to stand, but he wouldn't listen. Sure enough he draws the dealer's bust card. And of course the dealer has a picture card in the hole, and draws a 5 for 21 and we all lose. So don't tell me a screwball playing third base won't hurt me."

If you play blackjack, I'm sure the above scenario, or one similar, has happened to you (if it hasn't yet, trust me, it will). Somehow we always seem to remember the times we lose a big hand because of the clueless player at third base (I call it selective memory).

Let's suppose that the lack of skill of an anchor player can result in bad things happening to other table players. Now let's suppose we pool our money and open a casino with lots of blackjack tables. To ensure that we make a ton of money at blackjack, we're going to pay players to sit at every third-base seat with instructions that they must hit when they are supposed to stand, and stand when they are supposed to hit, to cause all the other players to lose. We'll be rich!

Of course this is nonsense; otherwise casinos would have implemented "clueless shills" to their benefit a long time ago. The facts are these: the skill of the anchor player, or for that matter any player on the table, has no effect whatsoever on your chances of winning or losing. In fact, you could have five chimpanzees

playing next to you on the same table and your chances of winning and losing in the long run won't change one iota. The reason is because you have no earthly idea what the sequence of the cards is in a shoe, so it could happen that a dumb play by any player could result in you winning the hand, or, just as likely, losing the hand. In the long run, it all evens out.

Nevertheless, blackjack misconceptions such as this one live on, so here's my advice for players who fret about where to sit: If you are a newbie to the game and need to bring a strategy card along as an aid (hey, there is nothing wrong with that, and it's casino legal), I suggest you sit in player spots 3, 4 or 5. Why? If you sit at first base, the dealer will be looking your way for a playing decision rather quickly (remember that the first-base player acts first). This doesn't give the firstbase player much time to look at his hand, then the dealer's upcard, then glance at his strategy card to determine how to play the hand. However, if you sit in positions 3, 4 or 5, you will have a little more time to figure out how to play your hand, and when you are not rushed you are more likely to make the right play, win more, and enjoy the game better.





Many years ago my Mother and Father went to Savannah and had biscuits at a boarding house that were delicious. She was given the recipe and made them for us for years. Well, my Mother has passed and I can't find the recipe anywhere. I remember her calling the lady "Mrs. W." Any chance you know whom we are talking about? — Bette L. from Reading, Pa.

Dear Bette,

This might be your lucky day. I have a recipe book I bought twenty-one years ago from a Mrs. Wilkes at her boarding house in Savannah, Georgia. Hopefully I remembered the right "Mrs. W." Here's the recipe I am assuming you asked about.

WILKES BOARDING HOUSE STYLE BISCUITS

2 cups self-rising flour ½ tsp. baking powder 1 tbsp. Crisco shortening 2 tbsp. margarine 1/3 of a cup buttermilk 1/3 of a cup whole milk

Sift flour and baking powder into a large-sized bowl. Cut in Crisco shortening and margarine until the mixture resembles coarse corn meal. Fill measuring cup with buttermilk, whole milk and enough water to make 3/4 cup. Make well in the center of the dry flour, pour in liquid. With hands, mix lightly and quickly to form dough, moist enough to leave sides of bowl. Turn on a lightly floured surface. Knead by picking upsides of dough away from you pressing down with palms of hands, pushing dough away. Repeat 6 or 7 times. Work dough into large ball while kneading. Keep fingers dry by dipping into dry flour frequently. Pinch off portions of dough for desired size of biscuit. Press lightly to make biscuit appear flat until baked while placing on well greased pan. Bake in pre-heated oven at 450 degrees for 12 to 15 minutes. Makes 16 biscuits.

NOTE: To make this recipe with cheese use 1 cup grated cheese; stir in after cutting in shortening. Bake same as regular biscuit.
