#### TRADE-MARK FOR FLAVORING-SYRUP FOR SODA-WATER.

STATEMENT and DECLARATION of Trade-Mark No. 40,619, registered June 16, 1903. Application filed September 23, 1902.

#### STATEMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CALEB D. BRADHAM, a citizen of the United States of America, residing and doing business at Newbern, in the 5 county of Craven and State of North Carolina, have adopted for my use a Trade-Mark for Beverages, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact specification.

My trade-mark consists of the arbitrary to hyphenated word "PEPSI-COLA," as shown

in the accompanying facsimile.

This mark has been continuously used in

my business since August 1, 1901.

The class of goods to which the mark is ap-15 propriated is beverages, and the particular description of goods in said class in connection with which the mark has been and is

exclusively used is a flavoring-syrup for sodawater.

The mark is usually applied by means of 20 labels to bottles, boxes, or other receptacles containing the goods, but may be marked on or otherwise applied directly to the receptacles or displayed thereon in any other wellknown manner, and, moreover, the mark has 25 been extensively used in advertising and on all kinds of stationery.

is used by him in commerce between the United States and foreign nations or Indian tribes, and particularly with Dominion of Can- 15 ada; that the description and facsimiles presented for record truly represent the trademark sought to be registered, and that he is a citizen of the United States.

replaced by Diet Pepsi.

Dear Pepsi & Pete: I collect Pepsi cans, should I leave the Pepsi in the cans?

Dear T.L.:

I would recommend yu drain your Pepsi cans before putting them in your collection. A leaky can could ruin something very valuable. If you drain your cans from the bottom it will not affect their value.

Dear Pepsi & Pete: Recently I heard someone refer to a reproduction Pepsi item as a "fantasy" item. What does this mean?

Dear Baffled:

A reproduction is a copy of an old Pepsi collectible. A "fantasy" item is something new that is made to look old using old logos, and styles. An example is the Pepsi tin containers that are being sold at novelty shops. Pepsi never made any containers of this type.

With the rebirth of Pepsi-Cola taking place during the depression price and quanity was already a big part of the But by 1930 post identity. war inflation had caused Pepsi to abandon the 12 ounce for a nickel drink. To meet the challenge of this new era. Alfred Steele was made President of Pepsi-Cola on March 1, 1950. One of Mr. Steele's main objective as president was to create a new image for Pepsi-Cola. The emphasis changed from price to style. The new image of Pepsi became one of a drink consumed by sophisticated Some of the slogans people. used during this period were, "the light refreshment", "Be Sociable, Have a Pepsi", "Refreshing without filling". Mr. Steele didn't think that new slogans and advertisments would be enough to give Pepsi the new image he desired. he began a campaign to create a new bottle for Pepsi. His efforts culimated on May 1, 1958 when Pepsi introduced the "Swirl bottle".

Despite all these accomplishments Mr. Steele will probably always be most remembered for being married to actress Joan Crawford. Upon Mr. Steel's death in 1959 Joan Crawford was elected to the Board of Directors for the Pepsi-Cola Company.




Pepsi collector Ray Montgomery from Florida, is spotlighted in this issue.

My name is Ray Montgomery, I was born and raised in Cincinnati, Ohio which is where I began my Pepsi collecting. I have been drinking Pepsi since I was 3 years old. I remember alot of different Pepsi bottles and signs as I was growing up, I only wish I would have hung onto them. Around 1970 my sister gave me a Pepsi clock, even though it was not an original I hung it on the wall and started looking for other Pepsi items. I've obtained a few good items through the club, the Pepsi book by Bill Vehling gave me many other things to look for. I have now collected approx. 200 items and am very pleased with them all. Some of my favorites are a 1960 Pepsi machine, 1920 Wooden carrier and about 5 bottles dated before 1910.




The cardboard sign above was done by Mr. Petty an illustrator from the 1940's-50's. Mr. Petty was most noted for his pin up girls.


Below is the 1987 commemorative tray from New Haven, Missouri. Even though this is a rather new tray it is still very desirable.

## **Pepsi History**

A few years ago Pepsi-Cola did a commerical with a time machine theme. The gist of the commerical was that a scientist accidentally took a can of Pepsi back to 1885 before Coke was invented. Cut to the present all of a sudden everything Coke begins disappearing.

The idea was that if the great taste of Pepsi had been invented before Coke there wouldn't be any Coke today. The commercial shows how little events can sometimes have great consequences.

This leads us to a seemingly minor business decision Coke made in 1931 that could have resulted in Pepsi-Cola fading into history as just another soft drink company gone broke.

Let me set the scene, May 1931 Richmond, Virginia, Pepsi-Cola has just filed for bankruptcy for the second time. Meanwhile in New York, Charles Guth, President of Loft Inc. a chain of 115 country stores (each with soda fountains) has decided he is unhappy with his present agreement with the Coca-Cola Company. Due to the fact that Loft Inc. was buying over 31,000 gallons of syrup from Coke each year Mr. Guth thought that Loft Inc. deserved a jobbers discount. Coke thought otherwise and said "no", (if they had said "yes" Coca-Cola could very well have had a monopoly on the cola market today.) Mr. Guth didn't like being told "no" so on May 19, 1931 he instructed Mr. V.O. Robertson to explore the possibility of Loft Inc.

serving Pepsi-Cola in their soda fountains. Because of the bankruptcy Loft Inc. wasn't able to buy Pepsi So through some syrup. financial manuerving on August 10, 1931 Pepsi-Cola was incorporated again, with Charles Guth as President. Loft Inc. was then able to buy Pepsi-Cola syrup. Several years after this episode Guth introduced Pepsi-Cola in the 12oz. bottle for a nickel and as they say the rest is history.
