

April 14, 2019 Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord Lk 22:14-23:56

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Palm Sunday! We open Holy Week today, where we disciples of Jesus re-trace his final steps leading to his death on the cross. Holy Week with its rehearsal of Jesus' last days and hours is like a Bible version of the TV shows Forensic Files (or all the shows on the ID channel-Investigation Discovery), that explore the details of victim's lives leading up to their death. We have to wait until after Easter to see 'The First 48' that breaks the case and clearly reveals who was behind the acts leading to the death. But we are not there yet! We start the Holy Week Tour with Jesus' Triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where He is welcomed into the Holy City recognized for His saving work as a leader, religious healer and teacher. Our script for the last events of Jesus' life are what we call the 'Passion Narratives' of the gospels. Yes, they are the 1-o-n-g readings on Palm Sunday and again on Good Friday. Today, we hear Luke's edition, and on Friday we will hear John's. I encourage everyone to listen with fresh ears, because each gospel writer emphasizes unique details that the other writers may take for granted. So, while we call each account the 'same story', there is much to be learned from the different details. Like the Titanic story, we know how it ends, but we can gain a lot along the way, appreciating each unique detail given. Another reading tip I suggest is to listen closely or follow in the book, and when something strikes you like 'I never heard that before', then pursue the 'why' of that particular detail being included. On a personal prayer level, a person can even ask, "Is God underlining that detail for me this year? What does that mean for my life right now?" I like to dedicate my whole week to praying over the one or two lines from the Sunday readings that God lays upon my heart at the beginning of the week (like mission commands).

Jesus, as a model leader, never asks his disciples to do anything or take up anything that He has not undergone or suffered through Himself. Jesus prepares the way ahead for us, like he is setting the stage before calling us on to it. We remember His mission instructions when he sent out the apostles, two by two, without any extra supplies. He did that because He was going to provide everything along the way. Jesus sends us out with the expectation of trust from us, that He has pre-emptively prepared the way. And Jesus comes through! I love how Jesus quizzes the apostle about this in Luke 22:35, asking, "When I sent you out without purse or bag or sandals, did you lack anything?" 'Nothing,' they answered." Jesus takes care of them. So we should not be surprised in the first Palm Sunday gospel when Jesus sends out two followers to acquire a new colt to serve as his transport into Jerusalem. And everything goes just as Jesus indicates. They go, and "those who had been sent went off and found everything just as he had told them" (Luke 19:32). Jesus does this again in regard to making the preparations for the Passover meal, when he sends Peter and John into Jerusalem to set the table and gather food/drink provisions, even throwing in a secret sign they will notice of a 'man carrying a water jar' (read it all in Luke 22:7-13). Again in Luke 22:13, it says Peter and John "went off and found everything exactly as Jesus had told them..." God does that, time and again when we strive to follow His will! God opens the way, especially in the face of obstacles. Deuteronomy 31:8 says, "The LORD is the one who goes ahead of you; He will be with you He will not fail you or forsake you". Ahead of us and behind us..... Psalm 139:5 says, "You [Lord] go before me and follow me." Isaiah 45:2 even describes some of God's pre-emptive actions as "I will go before you and will level the mountains; I will break down gates of bronze and cut through bars of iron." So God has this! Recall that last Sunday from Isaiah 43 we heard that God 'opens a way through the sea....and open rivers in the desert' (verses 16,20). Palm Sunday and all of Holy Week's events leading to Easter morning teaches us greater patience and trust in God's Will. Walking the way patiently with Jesus, means trusting the Father's plan of goodness overcoming evil, of life overcoming death and grace overcoming sin! Who could have imagined Life rising on Easter morning, while standing at the cross on Good Friday? Steven Curtis Chapman sings it well in his song, 'Our God is in Control', when he says that "we'll sing holy, holy is our God, While we're waiting for that day!" That is a Triduum worth celebrating this week (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday leading into Easter morning's Eternal Day!). It is so Christian, to say, 'More to Come!
