PRESIDENTS REMARKS

Speaking of good news our Chantarelle irrigation **project** to improve the water flow to our front lawns will be underway very soon. Eric Nyberg is the contractor approved by the HOA Board. Since this is a maintenance and repair project, rather than a capital improvement, our attorney Barbara Zimmerman has informed us that a referendum is not necessary. The new drip systems for our lawns will distinguish Chantarelle, especially regarding the water conservation factor. Real estate agents should highlight this advantage compared to the surrounding communities that have a more traditional approach. Debbie and Susan as well as the HOA Board have

spent much time on researching and discussing this project as was apparent at the Jan 19th HOA meeting. Thanks to all for their efforts.

We are also looking into the next community day trip; the social and activities committees will research and report back to us. Anything that brings us closer as a community is great. Please remember to check on your neighbor to see if any assistance can be provided, either by running errands, making calls to contractors, or providing agency referrals; all are examples of being a caring community. LANDSCAPE NOTES

As you may know by now, we are eager to commence a major upgrade of our irrigation system. We now have good news: the first phase of the project is now set to begin in early February. At the last HOA meeting the Board approved a measure allowing the Landscape Committee to submit a vote to residents to approve the use of reserve funds for the irrigation upgrade. Since then, our attorney informed us that this project is not new capital investment but only maintenance, so that the Board's approval of the project is sufficient to allocate the reserve funds for the project. So the project can move forward! We are thrilled! What does this mean for you? During the month of February, and most likely into March, you will be observing the irrigation specialists from Eric Nyberg Landscaping in our neighborhood upgrading our lawn sprinklers to the more modern and much more efficient MP Rotator system from Hunter. We don't anticipate any disruption to residents but there will be more landscape activity than usual around the neighborhood. Once installed, then each year as the rainy season ends and dry season begins, our lawns are going to be much greener throughout the summer because of this highly efficient watering system. Also, we will be much more respectful of the water table from which we draw when we use our well for irrigation. Whether or not the drought continues, we will be much more in alignment with appropriate water usage for the dry climate in which we live. Also, we will be saving thousands of our homeowner dollars that will not have to be spent in the Landscape Budget for shoring up the old. inefficient and obsolete irrigation system.

Good news all around!

It has been brought to our attention that there are occasions when residents approach either one or both of our Waldron Landscape guys while they are doing their work on our landscape. While we very much understand that residents have questions and concerns regarding their landscaping, we want to refresh everyone's memory that the appropriate approach to dealing with any landscape matter is to contact either Debbie or myself. We will happily work with you on whatever your concerns are and then we will communicate to Rojelio and Arnulfo what needs to be done. So please, when you see the guys out there, let them do their jobs and bring your concerns to us. We thank you so much for this! Have a lovely February!
