170 YEARS YOUNG!

On August 26, 1851, a group of Norwegian immigrants, whose names all ended in "son," founded the Sun Prairie Lutheran Church of Burke as one of the congregations included in a parish which included Norway Grove Lutheran Church and Spring Prairie Lutheran Church, among others. The parish pastor was Rev. Herman Preus, who came here at the age of 26 with his new wife, Caroline, to answer his first call as a minister of the Gospel. The couples' first months were spent sharing tiny log cabins with various families until their own cabin was built at Spring Prairie. These were rough accommodations indeed for the Preuses, who were used to upper middle class life in Norway.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On August 26th, 1851, Rev. H. A. Preus presided at the very first worship service for the Sun Prairie Lutheran church of Burke or as it would be called later Burke Lutheran Church. Burke was one of six Lutheran Churches organized by H. A. Preus who was one of seven Norwegian Lutheran Pastors sent to America in order to establish the Norwegian Synod here in Wisconsin. At age 26 along with his wife Linka Keyser Preus, H. A. Preus emigrated from Norway to America with the hope of saving the Norwegian settlers of Wisconsin from the evil Haugean Lutherans who had splintered off of the Church of Norway and were starting to gain influence here in Wisconsin. One might even say that Rev. Preus was like a Norwegian Paul sent not to save gentiles, but instead Preus was sent to save Wisconsinites, a far harder task. Based upon the many pictures that I have seen of Preus he did not partake in nearly enough cheese curds, brats, and beer, yet despite this shortcoming, he and his colleagues were rather successful. Today Wisconsin is home to over 1586 Lutheran congregations from various denominations of primarily Norwegian and German heritage.

Burke may not be the oldest nor the biggest Lutheran church in Wisconsin yet here we stand 170 years later having just completed a massive building project where in a very real sense we have been reborn as something new, yet still honoring the rich heritage that we have inherited as being an integral part of the Norwegian Lutheran Churches here in Wisconsin. This is something to celebrate! In a world where less and less people are claiming to be part of a faith community, we are part of a community that is able to make this giant commitment to being part of Dane County's future while honoring this important part of its past, even if the city of Burke where we derive our name will soon be no more.

Here at Burke, history is an important part of who we are. We enjoy telling others about the rich and vibrant history of our building and the surrounding area because it helps tell them who we are. Yet this is not all that we are. One of the first things we ask visitors when they come through those doors is, "what is your story?" We thrive on those stories that make up our congregation because, like the bible, our congregation is a collection of stories, each lending a different perspective on faith and love, and that it is only when we are together that Burke's story comes alive. It has been amazing to be able to gather together once again and enjoy our new building. I look forward to many ministry opportunities that await us in the weeks, months, and years ahead as we look toward the future. In the meantime keep reaching out to each other, seek out new stories and new ways Burke can continue to be an integral part of the ever changing community that surrounds us.

BIRTHDAY LUNCHEON

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 11, NOON
The ladies' luncheon will meet on Wednesday,
August 11. Our August restaurant is the Sugar
River Pizza Company in Sun Prairie.

Also, the people they had come to serve were uneducated farmers whose conversations usually centered on the weather and the state of their crops, while the Preuses were used to socializing with sophisticated, educated people in Norway. In 1853, he was one of seven pastors organizing the Norwegian Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Preus served as president of the Norwegian Synod from 1862 until his death in 1894.

For the first twenty years, our congregation met for services in various members' homes. In 1871, a small, white wooden church was built on property that had been purchased from Herman Bergeland, whose home was just to the south of it. Mr. Bergeland's grandson, John Mandt Nelson, a graduate of Pumpkin Hollow School, eventually became a US Representative and ran the presidential campaign of Robert LaFollette.

In the late 1890's, the congregation decided to build our beautiful brick church, which was dedicated in 1898. As late as 1948, we had shared a pastor with Norway Grove Lutheran Church. At that time, it was decided to dissolve this connection and call our own pastor, and build the parsonage north of the church. The name of the congregation was also changed to Burke Lutheran Church at this time. (For many years, locals had also lovingly referred to it as "the Pumpkin Hollow Church.") As the children born during the post WWII baby boom became old enough for Sunday School, space for classes became a problem and, until 1964, some classes met in the basement of the new parsonage until the Sunday School/ Fellowship Hall addition was built.

Of course, now we have our beautiful new building and our historical brick church attached to it! There is not enough space in this little article to honor all the wonderful, dedicated people who have nurtured the Gospel of Christ through "The Little Church on the Hill" for 170 years and counting. Most of the Norwegian culture that was so evident here—lutefisk dinners, Norwegian accents, Norwegian songs on Christmas Eve—has become relegated to the past, but to all of these people I would like to say "tusen takk" (a thousand thanks). And, most of all, thanks be to God!!
