From the PRESIDENT......

Hello Fleetwood neighbors,

My name is James Ainsworth, your new Fleetwood Board President. I have previously served as Director of Security. I will continue to handle security in addition to Walls, streets, alleys, and lights.

Our family moved to Fleetwood in June of 2009. My wife, Suzanne, and I think Fleetwood is a great place to raise our sons, Travis and Grant. We love the mature landscape and how nice neighbors keep their homes. We look forward to many more years of living in Fleetwood. This is home!

We have not had any reportable crimes in Fleetwood recently. I credit alert homeowners, the visibility of our Security Patrol, and the cameras at the entrances to our neighborhood. When reviewing the video footage we see many vehicles pull into the neighborhood and make a quick exit once they see the "Security Camera" signs. We had one car that backed up onto Memorial to avoid the cameras. Please call Houston Police Department ("HPD") and Security Patrol if you see anything suspicious. I have talked to a few HPD officers in Fleetwood and encouraged them to drive through anytime.

Nancy, our daytime guard, recently had back surgery and is recovering at home. Houston Harris Patrol has assigned a fill in officer, Rohan, to cover the daytime patrol while Nancy is recovering. We wish her well and look forward to her return once she recovers.

Walls, streets, alleys, and lights:

Since I just started these duties, I only have limited knowledge to share.

The walls along Memorial are in great shape. The walls shared with other neighborhoods look to be in good shape as well.

Our streets are maintained by the City of Houston. I have noticed recently the city is working on Cranberry Hill near Crossroads. The City appears to respond best when they receive lots of calls and are especially responsive when there is a "safety" concern. Please call 311 to report any street damage you see. I have started cleaning the street signs. Many are covered in mildew and were hard to read. I hope to be finished with all the signs in the next few weeks. I hope this will help our guests and first responders find homes quickly.

We continue to monitor the alleys for damaged areas. We made several repairs last year and have budgeted to make more repairs this year. We are trying to work within our budget and get the best results for Fleetwood. This will be on ongoing project and hopefully we can get the upper hand in the next few years.




The Fleetwood Board Meeting are scheduled the Second Wednesday of each month at 6:30 p.m.

JUNETEENTH 150 YEAR ANAVERSARY





Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the end of slavery in the United States. Dating back to 1865, it was on June 19^{th} that the Union soldiers, let by Major General Gordon Granger, landed at Galveston Texas with news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free. Note that this was two and a half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation – which had become official January 1^{st} , 1863. The Emancipation Proclamation had little impact on the Texans due to the minimal number of Union troops to enforce the new Executive Order. However, with the surrender of General Lee in April of 1865, and the arrival of General Granger's regiment, the forces were finally strong enough to influence and overcome the resistance.



HOW STORMS ARE NAMED


Since 1953, Atlantic tropical storms had been named from lists originated by the National Hurricane Center. They are now maintained and up dated through a strict procedure by an international committee of the "World Meteorological Organization" (WMO). The six lists are used in rotation and re-cycled every six years, i.e. the 2014 list will be used again in 2020. The only time that there is a change in the list is if a storm is so deadly or costly that the future use of its name on a different storm would be inappropriate for reasons of sensitivity. If that occurs, then at an annual meeting by the WMO committee (called primarily to discuss many other issues) the offending name is stricken from the list and another name is selected to replace it. Several names have been retired since the lists were created.

If a storm forms in the off-season, it will take the next name in the list based on the current calendar date. For example if a tropical cyclone formed on December 28th, it would take the name from the previous season's list of names. If a storm formed in February, it would be named from the subsequent season's list of names.

In the event that more than twenty-one named tropical cyclones occur in the Atlantic basin in a season, additional storms will take names from the Greek alphabet.

DEFECATION BY DOGS OR CATS (POOPER SCOOPER LAW)

There is an ordinance relating to picking up fecal matter deposited by owned dogs on property which does not belong to the owner of the dog or where the owner has consent to let his/her dog defecate. The text of the ordinance is as follows:



- 1) "It is the duty of each person in control of a dog or cat to promptly remove and dispose of, in a sanitary manner, feces left by such dog or cat.
- 2) "It shall be the duty of each person in control of a dog or cat to be possession of materials to remove feces left by a such dog or cat."
- 3) "It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this section that the person in control of the dog or cat is the owner of the premises, or the owner's agent of the premises, where the dog or cat deposits feces"
- 4) "Violation of this section is unlawful and any violation shall be punishable upon conviction by a fine of not less that that &75.00 or more than \$500.00. Each act in contravention of this section is a separate offense.
