

# THE ARTS IN DOWNTOWN ZANESVILLE



## March ARTIST of the MONTH Aaron Buchholz St. Louisville Glass

My first experience in glassblowing was at Moorhead University, Moorhead, MN in 1996. I had no idea where it would take me, but I did know that I was hooked. From that moment on, I found my medium and I have devoted my career to pursue glass. For me, my passion for glassblowing is more than final piece. It's: the process, the equipment, the chemistry, and the community of people that glass attracts.

The variety of work that I make reflects the audience that the artwork will serve. I make glass for my personal pursuit and artistic vision, work that demonstrates my skill level, and artwork for the joy of others.

Glass pulls people in - it's bright, colorful, and catches the viewer's eye. People respond to glass in so many different ways. It can evoke memories of childhood, the beauty of nature, or a pure delight to the senses. I enjoy watching others view my work for the first time, especially children. Their eyes light up and they smile as if they have seen me pull a rabbit out of a hat. Glass invites others to share their stories about their experiences with glass. So often in conversation I will be asked, if I have made a particular animal or object out of glass. My response is often, "No, I haven't made that before, but I will try." Then the challenge is on for me as an artist to create something that I haven't made before. So many of the decorative and functional artworks that I make now, have come from the

In the glassblowing community, teams are often put together for particular projects. A piece of this size puts off a tremendous amount of heat and my team is using wooden paddles to protect me.

# Yan Sun Art Museum and Gallery


“Water Wonders - the Latest Boat Paintings by Yan Sun”

Where are you originally from and where are you now?

I have grown up in Zanesville my whole life, but I am currently living in Cincinnati, Ohio.

What inspired your design for the Y-Bridge Arts Festival Logo?

My main inspiration for the Y-Bridge Arts Festival Logo that I designed was the bridge itself. The Y-Bridge is something very unique to our town, and so I wanted to create something that would reflect that. I accomplished this by having a piece of the bridge in the logo and elements of our Y-Bridge, from the cement base to the railings and lights stands, replicating the bridge. Something I have learned during my studies at UC Blue Ash is to utilize negative space to convey a message. I applied this method to my logo and used negative space to create the Y shape in the logo so it appears as if the viewer is seeing the bridge from a Bird’s-eye view. Additionally, I wanted the logo to maintain a clean and simple look but was also aesthetically pleasing to the viewer.

Who is your favorite artist?

A designer that I am influenced by and have learned about during my studies at UC Blue Ash is Paul Rand. Paul Rand is famous for his ideas of merging copy with design and simplifying the amount of type and letting form and function interact. I applied this to my logo by having the type and the bridge, sun, and Y form all interact with one another, and making sure there was not an overpowering hierarchy.

If you are in school, what school and what is your major?

I am in my first year of the graphic communication program at the University of Cincinnati Blue Ash College.

How have you stayed inspired during covid?

I have stayed inspired during Covid by focusing on what blessings I have in my life and the many things that I am thankful for. Quarantine gave me time to create artwork for various members of my family and show them love and encouragement during the tough times.
