## Chef's Recipe

### Lentil stew of Jacob and Esau.

Two liters vegetable broth soup

1 cup split red lentils

1 ½ tablespoon rice

2 stalks of celery, finely chopped

1 carrot

Salt.

### Seasoning:

5 tablespoons good olive oil

3-5 cloves of garlic, chopped

1 small hot pepper, finely chopped

1/2 cup sweet red pepper, finely chopped.

2/3 cup chopped celery

1 cup chopped green coriander.

1 teaspoon cumin.

2 teaspoons ground coriander grains

Freshly squeezed lemon juice to taste.

### Method:

Boil the lentils and rice with broth or water. Cook over medium heat until the lentils are crumbly. Season with salt and cook over low heat.

Prepare the seasoning:

Heat the oil in a medium skillet, add the garlic and hot pepper, add the rest of the ingredients (including the dry spices), except lemon juice, and bring to a boil.

Pour the contents of the pan into the pot of soup, gradually add lemon, taste and add more salt or lemon if needed.

## OUR RELIGIOUS CONNECTION

### HALAKHAH – PART TWO



#### The Difference Between Torah Law and Rabbinic Law

Jewish law includes both laws that come from the Torah (whether expressed, implied, or deduced) and laws enacted by the rabbis. However, even a rabbi-enacted law can be considered as derived from the Torah. The Torah gives certain people the authority to teach and to make judgments about the laws [Deuteronomy 17:11], so that rabbinical laws should not be casually dismissed as merely “man-made laws” as opposed to the laws of G-d in the Torah. Following these lines, one becomes aware that rabbinical laws are as binding as Torah laws. However, there are differences in the way we apply laws that are *d’oralta* (from the Torah) and laws that are *d’rabbanan* (from the rabbis).

#### Precedence

The first important difference is that *d’oralta* takes precedence over *d’rabbanan*. When two *d’oralta* rules are in conflict, the rules of precedence are applied to determine which rule to follow. However, if a *d’oralta* rule comes in conflict with a *d’rabbanan* rule, the *d’oralta* rule (Torah rule) always takes precedence. An example of this is, do we fast on Yom Kippur when it falls on Shabbat? These are both *d’oralta*, so the rule of precedence must apply. Specific rules take precedence over general rules. The specific rules of Yom Kippur fasting take precedence over the general rule of Shabbat joy, so yes, we fast on Yom Kippur when it occurs on Shabbat. When other fasts on our Jewish calendar are *d’rabbanan*, the *d’oralta* rule of Shabbat joy takes precedence. These other fasts that fall on Shabbat are moved to another day.

The second important difference is the strictness of observance. If there is a doubt (*safek*) in a matter that is *d’oralta*, the strict position (*machmir*) must be upheld. If there is *safek* in a *d’rabbanan* matter, we take the lenient position (*makeh*). In Hebrew this is stated: *Safek d’oralta Phuma, safek d’rabbanan dikula*. A concise example of this is, suppose you are davening shachares (morning services) and you can’t remember if you read Bar’hu and Shema, two important prayers. You are in doubt – *safek*. The Shema in the morning is a mitzvah *d’oralta* [Deuteronomy 6:7], so you must be *machmir* – strict. Go back and recite Shema. The recitation of Bar’hu, on the other hand, is a mitzvah *d’rabbanan*, a rabbinic law, so you can be lenient and you don’t have to go back and recite it. If you are certain that you did not recite either of these, then you must go back and recite both. When there is no doubt – *safek* – there is no basis for leniency.

In the next *Mishpacha*, Halakhah Three, Jewish law concerning physical healing, will be discussed. This is based upon Exodus 15:26, “I am the L-rd, your healer.” It involves both medical knowledge and our higher authority.
