

#### **REGULAR MEETING**

May 9, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 am by President Krista Lopez, at the Covenant Presbyterian Church in Napa, CA.

Birthdays for May were acknowledged and Happy Birthday was sung.

The minutes of the April meeting were approved as they appeared on the website.

Treasurer's Report:

#### NVQ JUNE BOM ~ ASIAN CARD TRICKS

BACKGROUND - cream or off white

- Piece A Cut 2 squares 4 7/8" x 4 7/8"; sub cut diagonally to make a total 4 half-square triangles.
- Piece B Cut 1 square 5 1/2" x 5 1/2"; sub cut diagonally to make 4 quarter-square triangles.

From each of FOUR different Asian prints cut the following -

- Piece A 1 square 4 7/8" x 4 7/8"; sub cut diagonally to make 2 half-square triangles.
- Piece B Cut 1 square 3 ¾" x 3 ¾"; sub cut diagonally once to make 2 half-square triangles.
- Unit A. Using Diagram 1 as a guide, sew background fabric, piece A to one each of Asian fabric, Piece A.

Diagram I Make 1 pieced-square unit, press towards light color

Unit B. Sew background fabric quarter-square triangle (Piece B) to one each of the Asian fabric.



Unit C Using Diagram III for fabric cominations sew quarter --square triangles together to make square.

Using Assembly Diagram as a guide piece sub units together to make rows, then piece rows together.
