Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

ARTICLE VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit **Creation and Formation** Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet. Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.

Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9. Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly. A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not in consistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

it's nice to know that someone's praying for you.



New Addition To Campus



Wayne William Messner



Wayne William Messner, youngest son of Burgette J. and Pearl Messner, was born December 19, 1919 in Beaver County, Oklahoma, and departed this life August 23, 1990.

Wayne spent his early life on the family Homestead north of Darrouzett, Texas. With the influence and help of his Uncle Victor Messner he started training horses and entertaining at rodeos throughout the Midwest. His rendition of "The End of the Trail" became the trademark of his rodeo routine with his horse, White Cloud.

On September 10, 1944 Wayne married Pauline Jacobs at Darrouzett, Texas. To this union was born four children, Texanna, Deanna, Edward Wayne and Coleen. Wayne purchased the "Family Farm" and reared his children doing farm work. In 1952 he was employed by Northern Natural Gas Company where for the next 29 years he enjoyed working with his fellow employees.

Wayne accepted Christ at the age of 12 in a revival held by Rev. Blair Grubb. In 1953 he surrendered his life wholly to the Lord at the Follett Chapel under the ministry of Rev. Marcus Adair. Through-out his close walk with God his life has touched many people.

Wayne loved the Doctrine of the Apostolic Faith Movement and held it precious in his heart. Camp Meeting was also a part of his life and had never missed being in one since 1958. His burden has been for the Bible College as he felt this is where our Movement will have growth and the bond that holds the people together.

A highlight in Wayne's life was a trip to Israel. The prophecy of the Bible and walking where Jesus walked was very exciting. His hope was to see Jesus return to Earth and set up his Kingdom.

At the time of his death, Wayne was an active member of the Midway Country Church, a member of the Board of Directors of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Baxter Springs, Kansas, and was completing his sixteenth year of service as board member in the Beaver County Farm Bureau.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one sister Rachel Altmiller, and two brothers Wibur and Walter.

Today he leaves many wonderful memories to numerous friends, neighbors, and relatives. He is survived by his wife, Pauline, four married children and their families, Texanna and Max Ollenberger of Olathe, Kansas and their children Jamie and Keith of the home, Deanna and Howard Rogers of Ellinwood, Kansas and their children, Jerry, Jimmy, and Jennifer of the home, Edward Wayne and Susan Messmer of Logan, Oklahoma and their children, Darryl and Donnie of the home, and Coleen and Jay Bradley of Wildorado, Texas and their children, Rachael, Rebecca, Jason and Charles of the home. Dad, when we think of you we see;



Peace Amidst The Strom

The ringing of the telephone woke me Easter morning, April 15, 1990. It was my mother, calling from their home in Joplin, Missouri, to tell me that my 27 year-old sister, Lisa, had been involved in an accident. Lisa had been driving an eighteen-wheeler for over a year. We knew the possibility of an accident was there, but nevertheless it was still a surprise to hear that it had actually happened. They had no idea how serious her injuries were, only that she was being flown to St. Louis, to a hospital there. Living in south Texas, some 600 miles away, I didn't know what to do. During our church service that Easter Sunday morning thoughts of Lisa flooded my mind. Though I could not be with her, I knew God would.

As far back as I can remember I have been taught to trust in God. This teaching would never leave me, but would help me through some of the roughest times in my life.

As I look back into the past, I can recall so many situations in which I was taught the importance of putting my faith and confidence in God. There were times when the storms outside would rage--perhaps a fierce thunderstorm or threat of a tornado, and I would be uneasy. My mother would gather my four sisters and me and lead us to the cellar or to the basement where she would pray and ask God to shelter us- to protect us from the storm outside. A peace would settle over us and we would be calmed, knowing that God was watching over us.

I can remember the nights I would wake trembling with fear after a bad dream. My mother would hold me and teach me a Bible verse that would comfort me in the midnight hours. She would always assure me that God was there- that he loved me and would keep me safe.

Each morning before school our family would kneel together in prayer, asking God to keep each one of us safe as we went to school that day. Somehow we knew He would.

In the years that followed, one by one, we began our own lives. We knew that no matter where we went or what life brought our way, God would be there. I knew that this time was no different. God was still taking care of our family.

That afternoon my parents called me again. Lisa condition was critical. She was unconscious with no sign of brain activity whatsoever. The doctors only gave her $1\frac{1}{2}$ chanceof survival. As I talked with my mother on the telephone I was reminded of her courage and faith in God. She told me that God was there with them and she knew nothing was impossible with Him. The minister that was at the hospital to encourage them was amazed at their faith in God at such a difficult time.

All through that afternoon and evening I clung to faith in God and fought those thoughts of fear and unbelief that tried to take hold in my mind. I knew that no matter how serious the situation was, the God I served was there. That night they called me with more information on Lisa'a condition. At approximately 12:30 a. m. (it was now Monday, the sixteenth), they would do one last check for brain activity. If there was none they would disconnect the machines that were helping her breathe. I talked to my parents and once again they were relying on God to work it all out. They were at peace with their decision to unbook the life support. They knew that God was not limited to a machine- that if Lisa lived it would be nothing other that a miracle. They knew that the breath of life could only be taken if God allowed it to be so. My husband and I stayed in prayer through the time of the testing. We felt such a sweet peace as we prayed. We felt so confident after our prayer time that we expected to be called with the news of a miracle for Lisa.

A few minutes later, my family called with the news that Lisa had died. At first I didn't know what to think. It seemed as if Iwas in shock, like I was waking from a dream of sorts. As I lay in bed that night, the grief and fear tried to engulf me, but I still had to trust in God. I had to believe that whatever happened God was in complete control.

My husband, my daughter, and I made the trip from Texas to Missouri to be with my family. I wasn't sure what I would find when I reached my parents home. When we got there my parents met us outside, and even in their sorrow their faith was in God. Of course, they were heartbrokenthey had just lost a child. We had lost a sister and friend.

There's something about death that astounds people. The uncertainty, not knowing when or how it might happen. The feeling of never touching or seeing that special person again in this life. It can really shake one's faith in God if allowed to. But once again our faith would be in God. My mind went back to those stormy nights, when, as children, we could rest assured that we would be alright. We could be so confident that God was right there with us, that somehow, some way, He would see us through. We held to that. He was our hope. I thought of Jesus' disciples in the boat during the storm, and how they became so fearful. (Matthew) They woke Jesus and asked him if He even cared that they might perish. But Jesus was there all the time and He cared so much more than they gave him credit for. When Jesus spoke those words,"Peace, be still", all the winds and waves had to obey and the sea was calmed. Amidst the fiercest storm our family had ever gone through, we were calm. We felt God's peace.

The day of the funeral I watched as friends and loved ones paid their respect to my sister and showed their concern for our family. One by one they would come and I would hear My mother sweetly saying, "Put your trust in Jesus. He will never fail you. Please, put your trust in Him." Tears filled my eyes as Ilistened and realized that what my mother had taught me was so real to her, that it would not fail, even in times such as these. It's not always easy to trust God. At times I do question Him. It's then that I'm reminded that I may not always understand things that happen, but that God in His infinite wisdom and grace sees the future, and is in control.

The days following Lisa's death have not been easy. We miss her terribly and sometimes the hurt is almost unbearable. We've gone through battles and tests that we never expected to go through. Yet God has been there and we are trusting Him. Faith is easy when life is, but it's when the storms come, when the "winds" blow, that faith is put to the test. We have felt the hurt and we have felt the pain, yet through it all we have trusted God and felt His peace in the midst of the storm.

And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

A WORD FOR A DISMAYED HEART

"Fear thou not; for I (God, Himself) am with thee; be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of My righteousness" (Isaiah 41:10). So says God to a dismayed heart.

CHRISTIAN DUTIES

A Christian is a person professing belief in Jesus as the Christ or in the religion based on the teachings of Jesus. They are supposed to exemplify the life of Jesus; showing forth, by their daily living, the characteristics of Jesus.

Christianity is not a lip service or putting on a show; it is showing the character and practices of Jesus Christ: not just on the first day of the week but every day of the week.

Be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind. It does make a difference how we think. Jesus can help us in this process so that we can find and prove what is that good, and acceptable and perfect will of God. This is a personal challange. God's will is going to be had throughout the world in His time. I am concerned about knowing what His good, and acceptable, and perfect will is for me as the days unfold in my years of living. Not only do I want to know, I want Him to help me to be in His will.

Here again is the thinking process. It is very important. To every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly that he ought to think: but soberly according as God has given to every man the measure of faith. If humans could be bought for what they are worth and sold for what they thought they were worth, it would be a most profitable business.

The body of Christ is compared to the human body. It consists of many members working in harmony. Each member must work in harmony with other members or the body becomes disoriented: not able to functiion or perform simple tasks. So we, being many, are one body, and all members one of another. Having gifts differing according to grace that is given us; let us find our place under the direcrtion of the Holy Ghost. There are too many misfits so the professed body of Christ is disoriented. I use this in a general manner.

Prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith.

Ministry, let us wait on our ministry.

Teaching, let us learn to teach.

Exhortation, let us work on exhorting.

Ruling, let us rule diligently.

Showing mercy, let us do it cheerfully.

Let love be without dissimulation. That means, let it be real: not put on or watered down.
