We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

Tidings from Timothy

This morning is my second sermon on Heaven. It is not really like the one last Sunday night, which was an expository sermon on the Ressurrection from 1 Cor. 15. This one is dealing with the topic of "Going Home." Don't forget that tonight is singing night.

<u>India Work:</u> Around 70 villages and 400 baptisms recorded. This trip has really gone well. Keep up the prayers.

Tim's Schedule

(note that I ran this article about this time last year, but I thought that it should be repeated for new members or those that just wonder about the best way to contact me or get access to the building, etc..)

Some may wonder about the best time to get in touch with me. Others may want to know basically when I am around Willette and when I am generally "out." Whatever your interest (if you have any interest in my whereabouts (a) here are my regular activities: (A word about reaching me) On any given day, it may be hard to reach me. This is because 1. Things come up with members that may temporarily call me away or 2. I don't have cell service in the place where I am. In particular, I DO NOT generally have cell service with any reliability (it will drop the call or not even ring) while I am at home or in the church building. Either no. for the church building will ring the office now, and our home phone is 6156997311, notice that the prefix is all that is different from my cell phone of

6156557311. Also, I check the church email each day, so you can reach me that way if it is not too urgent. I CAN generally get texts in most places in Willette, unless I have headed "down the hill" if you know what I mean. In that case the text may be received a few minutes or even a couple hours later.

Sunday: well, you know what is going on this day. I am generally preaching the Nursing Home service on the 3rd Sunday and just any given Sunday Connie or I or both of us may be at the Jail in the afternoon.

Monday: In the Winter, meals on wheels takes up a portion of Monday morning into lunch time. Before that I am often making radio programs so Monday is hard to get me before the afternoon. In fact, there may be people or situations I need to follow up on from Sunday, so Monday is hard to catch me in the office, period.

Tuesday: I am around the building most of the day. In the morning I am here helping with the Benevolent Building and eating donuts. When Dean is through with me and I have had lunch I go back to the building and can be found until 4 or 5pm in the office, when I go out to make a few visits.

Wednesday: I am here most of the day as well. An exception is the 3rd Wednesday when I go visiting in the afternoon at the Nursing Home. I find this is an excellent time to get to know them better, minister to them, and eat cake. It is your fault for me doing that since you make such good cakes. Other than that, I am usually here at the building getting ready for Midweek study. I also may be making some radio programs or sermon practicing in the Auditorium.

Thursday: I may be gone some of the day on hospital/shut-in visitation. In the evenings I make evangelistic visits.

Friday: I am working on the bulletin and prayer list, or making visits I may not have gotten to on Thursday (depending on when an Elder or member is available to visit with me). Finalizing plans for Sunday lessons.

Saturday: family time or evangelistic visits in the community.

Of course, any of these days can be interrupted by baptisms, funerals, or weddings. I hope this has been of some help and I want you to know that I am not a slave to routine and

am always open to doing what is needed at the moment, give me a call or visit.
