My painting represents the stand the brave people of Denmark took to smuggle most of their Jewish population, over 7000 people, out of Denmark and into nearby Sweden after Denmark was invaded by Nazi Germany. The boat in my painting represents all the fishing boats used to smuggle the Jewish people to Sweden. Also in my painting, there are 70 stars in the night sky, each star represents 100 people who were saved. I've named my painting, "7000 Stars Shining" in honor of the 7220 Jewish people saved by the Danish Resistance movement and the Danish people during World War II.
