Scholarship Applicants

WE ARE awaiting information from University Park regarding students eligible to apply for our scholarship. Current Penn State students should start looking for their email invitation to apply for our scholarship on or about Jun 10th. Responses will be due on or about Jun 24th.

In 2019, we petitioned the PSAA to change our charter to allow World Campus students and graduate students to apply for our local scholarship. Last year, we had the largest pool of eligible participants since I have been president of the chapter. There were 20 eligible students at University Park or Commonwealth campus and 20 eligible World Campus students. The two scholarship winners received \$3300 each. **WE ARE** Penn State strong!

Survey Results

In November 2023, the Board sent out a 6 question survey (#6 was optional – your name). Below is a summary of the other 5 questions and the results:

- 1. Were you aware there is an active Dayton Chapter of the PSU Alumni Association (DCPSAA)? **85% of the respondents were aware of our organization**. While this isn't a bad number, we ask you to spread the word to your neighbors, friends, co-workers who love Penn State. They do **not** need to be an alumni to belong to our organization. **WE ARE** here for all Penn State fans!
- 2. What are you passionate about? The DCPSAA currently supports Crayons to Classrooms, Wreaths Across America, THON, the Carl Stravinski Scholarship (DCPSAA provides 2 scholarships to local PSU students) and Montgomery County Sleep in Heavenly Peace.
 - a. Would you like information on any of the above charities?
 - b. How can we help you support your passion?

Passions ran from PSU sports/Thon/our scholarship, to Crayons to Classrooms, Food Pantry Volunteering. We were asked to expand our social and networking. We need your support to make this happen.

- 3. Location is always important for any gatherings. Recently we have been meeting in Miamisburg and Beavercreek. In order for you to more easily attend events, where would you prefer we meet? Responses varied from Troy to Miamisburg with the majority asking for the Beavercreek/Greene County area. We are more than happy to try different locations, but ask that someone familiar with the area host the event.
- 4. In addition to the Student Sendoff Picnic, "Penn State Presents", and football watch parties, what other activities would you like us to do (e.g. happy hour, group outing to away game, Young's Dairy outing, wine tasting, other)? We received a plethora of responses from Group Volunteering activity with Five Rivers Metro Parks or other organizations to Young's Dairy, to beer/wine tasting, to Meeting other Penn Staters who own business in the area. As you can see above in the "What's Up" section, we are trying to implement your ideas.
- 5. "Penn State Presents" is a quarterly opportunity to provide insight to many occupations and crafts. Our 1st event is being held Nov 30th (invitation from Kade Crittenden PSU Eberly College of Science). What other topics would you like presented (interested in a spring discussion with Greene County Master Gardener, a robotics instructor, financial support, long term health insurance, other)? Responses included the topics above along with Food Pantry Volunteering, Weather and recent pattern changes, Artificial Intelligence, Blockchain Technology, Virtual Reality, Robotics, or other advance technology, brewing, cooking, and baking. You have some great ideas! I have reached out to individuals/organizations to try and cover your topics. Stay tuned and watch your emails for more information as we schedule events. Note these topics are for your enjoyment. We ensure all speakers know requesting donations is not acceptable.

In the survey, someone asked how to make school more affordable for their child. We offer the following suggestions:

1. An online search will yield sites for scholarship opportunities.

2. Consider:

- a. attending a Commonwealth campus for the first 2 years and then transferring to Main Campus; or
- b. pursue part time enrollment and employment to balance college expenses and income; or
- c. attend World Campus for the first year or two.
- 3. Most of the colleges have positions for students to work in their offices/labs/etc. The student should check with their advisor for opportunities.
- 4. Are one of the parents active duty or retired military? PSU has a program to treat military families as "in state" residents which translates to "in state" tuition costs. <u>Admissions Information for Military and Veteran Students at Penn State Undergraduate Admissions (psu.edu)</u>
