Entry Method – First Received – OPENING DATE: February 24, 2020

- Entries may be received at any time on or after the opening date.
- Entries received before the opening date will be destroyed.
- Hand-delivered entries cannot be accepted on or before the opening date (day 1). Hand-delivered entries can be accepted only on day 2 or later.

Overnight envelopes must have the recipient's signature waiver signed or the envelope may be refused or delayed.

Final Closing Date: March 31, 2020

No Refund of Pre-Entries withdrawn after the closing date

CAT Refund Policy

A 100% refund will be given for any request received prior to the closing date for trial entries. Refunds in the amount of the entry fees less any unavoidable expenses incurred by CAT will be made for requests received after the closing date and up to the day before the trial if the refund is requested for the following reasons: dog in heat, injured or ill dog with verification from vet upon request, injured or ill handler with verification upon request and family emergency.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

* The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

* Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the show committee.

* It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dog(s) and / or children. Any exhibitor whose dog(s) and / or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the show committee, be asked to leave the show site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

* No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

* Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate, and legible information on the entry forms: illegible or incomplete entries cannot be entered in the show.

Take I-5 Exit #9 (In Washington), head west on 179th for ½ mile, turn left onto NE 2nd Ave., then left again at the Purple Gate. **Exposition & Equestrian Building** is on the right, at the end of the road.

CRATING INFO

Ample crating space around both rings on concrete. Please remember this is private property. Exercise your dog responsibly. **Pick up after your dog at the show site and around the hotels. All dogs must be on leash except when in the ring or warm up area. Dogs left unattended must be secured in a crate or x-pen. No tethering of unattended dogs is allowed. ABSOLUTELY NO PROPANE HEATERS ARE ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS PREMISES. No Prong Collars Allowed.**

PRIZES & AWARDS

Placement rosettes or ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 4th place for Qualifying and non-qualifying scores for all classes. Dogs with an NT (no time) are not eligible for any ribbons. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score, and Jr. Handlers in Standard. See Page 5 for special **SPRING CLASSIC** rosette & Perfect Weekend drawing info.

MEASURING

Measuring will be done both Saturday and Sunday from 7:15 am to 7:30 am. General briefing will be given following measuring each morning, prior to the first class briefing. Competitors not attending the general briefing will still be subject to the terms and conditions set forth in such a briefing. Neither the judge nor the host club is required to provide details of the general briefing once it has been given. All competitors are required to check-in. There will be no exceptions. **THERE WILL BE NO MEASURING** of dogs after judge’s first briefing each day. All dogs without a permanent card must be measured before the judge’s briefing to show that day. **THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS!!!**

Jump Heights – no dog will jump lower than 4”

P-Card = Permanent Card: the lowest allowable Regular height a dog may jump in CPE.

General CPE rules for entries/show site:

- Dogs must be at least 15 months or older the first day of the trial
- Blind (both eyes), lame, in season or aggressive dogs may not enter the show. The Club may choose to exclude any of the above from the site.
- Dogs must be registered with CPE prior to the closing date of the trial, or by the trial date for Day Of Show entries. Registration forms are on the Forms page: www.k9cpe.com. Forms MUST be mailed to CPE and are processed 2-3 times per week. CPE ID numbers are emailed to legible email addresses. Registrations can only be processed from mailed forms.
- Dogs must be able to be measured at their first show. If a dog cannot be measured, the dog cannot run and no refund will be issued. Dogs within ½” of a jump height require at least one more measurement. When dogs reach their second birthday, a measurement is required. All dogs must be measured at their first trial regardless of jump height.
- Only CPE Judges can measure dogs.
- Electronic shock collars are not allowed at ANY CPE trial – training or bark.
- Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. A warm-up jump shall be provided for all entered dogs. No relieving of dogs in the warm-up area.

Dogs in the ring, leashes, exiting the ring

- Dogs shall run without anything attached to its body. This is for the safety of the dog. This includes no: collars, stitches, wraps or any other item. The only exception is a small barrette or rubber band to keep hair out of a dog’s eyes.
- Leashes may not have anything (other than name/license tags) attached to them when used in the ring.
- Dogs may enter the ring on a collar, quick release harness or head halti/leader. If prong collars are allowed per the show site, they may *not* be used to take a dog into the ring.
- Handlers may not carry their leash with them on the course – if done so, an NT will result. Exception: Handicapped handlers that have a mobility problem in picking up the leash at the finish may put their leash in their pocket – the leash must be out of sight.
- Dogs must be under the handler’s control when leaving the ring or the judge may enter the run as No Time - NT.

For clubs that will allow Declared Training In the Ring

We (CAT) will offer Declared training in the ring. The handler has the option if they want to use a toy or training aid at any time during their run, the handler must approach the Judge during Walkthrough or previously in that trial day for the Judge to approve the toy or training aid for use on the course.

- Handler must alert the Judge upon entry to the ring that the dog will be TIR. Handler is then allowed to have a reasonably sized silent toy/aid with them for use once their run has started (this toy must be approved by the Judge of record PRIOR to the start of the class to determine its eligibility, absolutely no food/scents/audible devices). The toy is NOT allowed to be used in either gate chute or prior to the previous dog leaving the ring.

See the online rulebook or current member letter for additional rules.

The following items are considered training in the ring (see Fix and Go):

- Violating the 4 paw safety rule (directing the dog back onto the contact)
- Start line stay – leaving the dog and going back again to reposition the dog after the handler passes the plane of the first obstacle (before the handler leaves the dog, repositioning or repeated commands can be a delay of start)
- Putting the dog back on the table in the point games

For Clubs that are not allowing Declared Training In the Ring:

We (host club) will not be offering Declared Training in the Ring at this trail. Please remember that the following is not considered Training in the ring:

- Dog grabbing its leash at the end of a run (if the run has not yet ended, the dog would receive an NT)
- Asking the dog once for a sit or down on the table in the point games (asking more than once will be a delay of finish, 5 faults/points)

While running on course

- The handler will direct the dog through the course without a collar or lead.
- Food, toys, training devices (includes fanny packs and leash attachments) are not allowed within 10’ feet of the ring. Clickers, training whistles and squeaky toys are not to be used within distraction distance of the ring.
- The handler may not carry anything that could aid the dog in its performance. Exclusion: Handicapped/Differently Abled Handlers using a cane, scooter, wheelchair, etc., to enable their progression around the course.

The handler may use any verbal or visual commands to direct the dog through the course. The Judge may assess a 5 fault penalty to elimination for any command that is not given in a sportsmanlike manner. Faults can be but are not limited to: foul or abusive language, display of anger, extreme frustration or excessive harshness. If the fault is severe enough, the Judge has the right to excuse the exhibitor from the ring and / or the remainder of the trial. If excused from the trial, a report would be filed with CPE. See Faults, Eliminations and Excusals in the rulebook.

Spring Classic 2020

HIGH IN LEVEL

A special rosette will be awarded in each Level (1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & C) to the dog with the most points accumulated from both Saturday's Standard runs AND Sunday's 1st Standard. You must also be entered in Saturday Snooker as this is used as a tie breaker. To be considered for this award, dogs must be entered and compete in all four of these classes. Awards will be issued to the Standard level of the dog on Saturday even in the case of a move-up.

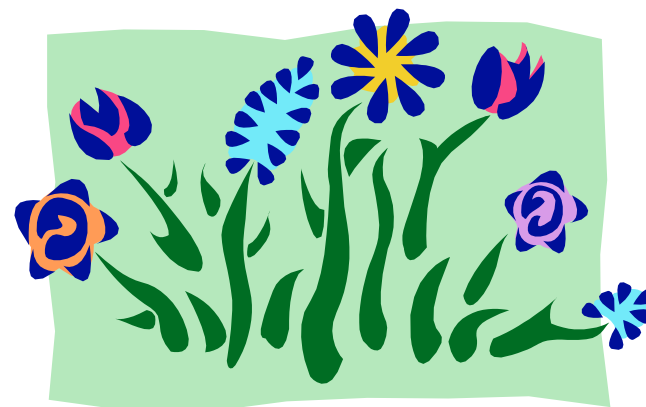
Award Point Calculation:

Q = 5 points or 2-1/2 points if faulted

Additional points are added for Placement. (Must be a Qualifying run) to receive these placement points:

1st Place = 4 points
2nd Place = 3 points
3rd Place = 2 points
4th Place = 1 point

1st Tiebreaker: In case of a tie, the Snooker game points will be added to the final calculation to determine the winner. 2nd Tiebreaker: The fastest Snooker time.
