GOD'S PLAN OF SALVATION

Our Bible Lesson

How often we thank God because He has made the plan of salvation so plain and simple that even a child can accept it.

As Jesus said, (Matt. 11:25-26) I thank Thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent, and hast revealed them unto babes. Even so, Father: for so it seems good in Thy sight.

Indeed it becomes simple and plain when revealed to us by His Spirit, and yet so grand, so glorious and so wonderful that it is a hidden mystery which all the wisdom of this world can not comprehend or fathom.

But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise: and God has chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty.

And base things of the world, and things which are despised, hath God chosen, yea, and things which are not, to bring to naught things that are:

That no flesh should glory in His presence. 1 Cor. 1:27-29.

Jesus said, (John 15:16) Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you. By the Holy Spirit, He shows us the way, and leads us to Calvary. The simple shepherds would not have found the Christ, had not the angels told them how to find Him.

Neither could the wise men find the Christ, unless the Lord had guided them by the star in the east which went before them till it came and stood over where the Child was.

How many wise men today would like to know the truth, but are seeking it in their own way and are groping in darkness and despair, instead of looking up for the Star of Hope. Shall we not let the Holy Spirit lead us to Christ, The Way, The Truth and The Light.

Indeed, we do not even know we are in darkness, lost in sin, until the Holy Spirit, the Search-light of heaven, is turned upon our souls. With conviction on our lives we can then see ourselves in God's light as He sees us, and we feel our lost and undone condition, and the exceeding sinfulness of sin.

The natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned. I Cor. 2:14. So then to expect a sinner to accept Christ, when the Spirit is not convicting him, is like asking a blind man to see the bright sunshine and admire the beauties of nature around him when all to him is but total darkness.

Jesus said, (John 16:8.) When he (the Comforter) is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment.

To open their eyes, and to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me. Acts 26:18.

What a radical change takes place: from darkness to light! Turned from sin and the power of satan, unto God, being partaker of His divine nature and true holiness.

You may have heard people say that they did not see any difference between the sinner and professor. Perhaps there is not much difference in some church members, but if even a sinner looks sincerely at the life of a real child of God, I am sure they they can discern the difference. Our daily lives should be a living witness to the transforming power of God.

CONVICTION. The first instance we have of conviction or knowledge of sin, is after Adam and Eve had disobeyed and eaten of the forbidden fruit. Gen. 3:8. And they heard the voice of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God amongst the trees of the garden. 9. And the Lord God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou? 10. And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked: and I hid myself.

I wonder if there is one who reads this who is in the same condition? Do you hear the voice of God calling, Where are thou? Are you seeking to hide from His presence? This is impossible, for (Proverbs 15:3). The eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good. If we will confess our lost condition, God is merciful. I will quote a few of the many instances of conviction recorded throughout the Old and New Testament.

Ezra 9:5. And at the evening sacrifice I arose up from my heaviness: and having rent my garment and my mantle, I fell upon my knees, and spread out my hands unto the Lord my God. 6 And said, O my God, I am ashamed and blush to lift up my face to thee, my God; for

our iniquities are increased over our head, and our trespass is grown up into the heavens. 7 Since the days of our fathers have we been in a great trespass unto this day. 10 And now, 0 our God, what shall we say after this? for we have forsaken thy commandments.

Job 7:20. I have sinned: what shall I do unto thee, O thou preserver of men?

Job 40:4-5. Behold, I am vile: what shall I answer thee? I will lay my hand upon my mouth. Once have I spoken but I will not answer: yea twice but I will proceed no further. Also Job 9:20. 13:23. 33:14-29.

Psa. 51:3 For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me. 17. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise. Also Psa. 31:10. 32:5. 38:18.

Isa. 6:5. Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips; for mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of Hosts. Isa. 57:-15. For thus saith the high and loft One that inhabiteth eternity whose name is Holy: I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones. Also Isa. 66-2.

Christ said, (John 6:44), no man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him; and I will raise him up at the last day 45. It is written in the prophets, and they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me.

John 16:7. Nevertheless, I tell you the truth. It is expedient for you that I go way: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you: but if I depart, I will send him unto you. 8. And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment.

Acts 16:14. And a certain woman named Lldia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard us; whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.

Luke 5:8. When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, Depart from me; for I am a sinful man, O Lord.

Acts 2: 37. Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart and said unto Peter and unto the rest of the apostles, Men and brethern, what shall we do?

Acts 9:6. He trembling and astonished said,

Lord what wilt thou have me to do?

Acts 16:29. He called for a light, and sprang in, and coming trembling and fell down before Paul and Silas. 30. And brought them out and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved?

Romans. 2:15. Which shew the work of the law written in their hearts, their conscience also bearing witness, and their thoughts the meanwhile accusing or else excusing one another.

I Cor. 14:24. If all prophecy, and there come in one that believeth not, or one unlearned, he is convinced of all, he is judged of all. 25. And thus are the secrets of his heart made manifest; and so falling down on his face he will worship God, and report that God is in you of a truth.

How we should thank God for conviction. I shall never forget the encouragement I received, while I was seeking God, when a minister said, to me "God will not put a desire in your heart, and not satisfy you." We do not realize our lost and undone condition till we hear the voice of God, calling us: "Where art thou?"

REPENTANCE: After the Lord has revealed to us our lost condition by conviction then it is our place to repent and seek the Lord.

Deut. 4:29. But if from thence thou shalt seek the Lord thy God, thou shalt find him, if thou seek him with all thy heart and with all thy soul. 30. When thou art in tribulation and all these things are come upon thee, even in the latter days, if thou turn to the Lord thy God, and shalt be obedient unto his voice: 31 (For the Lord thy God is a merciful God) he will not forsake thee, nor forget the covenant of thy fathers which he sware unto them.

Job 34:31. Surely it is meet to be said unto God, I have borne chastisement; I will not offend any more. 32. That which I see not teach thou me: if I have done iniquity, I will do no more. Psa. 34:14. Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it.

18. The Lord is nigh unto them that are of a broken heart; and saveth such as be of a contrite spirit.

Prov. 28:13. He that covereth his sins shall not prosper; but whose confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.

Isa. 44:22. I have blotted out, as a thick cluod, thy transgressions, and, as a cloud thy sins; return unto me; for I have redeemed thee.

Isa. 55:6. Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near; 7. Let

the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

Hos. 10:12. Sow to yourselves in righteousness, reap in mercy; break up your fallow ground: for it is time to seek the Lord, till he come and rain righteousness upon you.

What a wonderful instance of repentance we have in Jonah 3:8: Let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily unto God: yea, let them turn every one from his evil way, and from the violence that is in their hands.

Jesus said, (Matt. 12:41) The men of Nineveh shall rise in judgment with this generation and condemn it; because they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas is here.

Matt. 3:2. Repent ye; for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. 7. O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance.

Matt. 9:13. But go ye and learn what that meaneth, I will have mercy and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentence. Also Mark 2:17. Luke 5:32.

Luke 15:7. O say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons which need no repentance. Also Luke 18: 13-14.

Acts 17:30. The times of this ignorance, God winked at; but now commandeth all men everywhere to repent.

Rom. 2:4. Or despisest thou the riches of his goodness—and forbearance and longsuffering; not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance?

2 Cor. 7:9. Now I repoice, not that ye were made sorry, but that ye sorrowed to repentance; for ye were made sorry after a goodly manner, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. 10. For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of; but the sorrow of the world worketh death.

We fear that the way repentance is taught today, that it does not always go deep enough into the heart to make the change in the life that it should, but we see by the above Scriptures, that a real Bible conviction and repentence will cause men every one to "turn from his evil way, and from the violence that is in their

hands," and to obey the command to "bring forth fruits meet (suitable, fit) for repentance," thus ceasing to commit wilful and known sins. If our children would tell us they were sorry for some meanness they had done, and the next day do the same thing again, we would have reason to believe they were not very sorry. So we must prove our repentance to our heavenly Father by turning away from sin, with loathing and disgust, and He will graciously pardon. Truly it is "the goodness of God," that leadeth us to repentance. When Zacchaeus stood before the Lord, he immediately began to promise to make restitution. This is very necessary, as the blood of Jesus does not blot out any sins that we can make right.

JUSTIFICATION, OR FORGIVENESS OF SINS. Psa. 32:1. Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. 2. Blessed is the man unto whom the Lord imputeth not iniquity, and in whose spirit is no guile. 5. I acknowledged my sin unto thee, and mine iniquity have I not hid. I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord; and thou forgavest the iniquity if my sin. Rom. 4:7.

Psa. 103:12. As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us.

Matt. 1:21. Thou shalt call his name Jesus, for he shall save his people from their sins.

John 3:16. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him, should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Acts 13:38: Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethern, that through this man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins. 39. And by him, all that believe are justified from all things, from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses. A; so Acts 4:12.

Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Rom. 5th Chapter, Rom. 3:20-26, 10:9-13.

Gal. 2:16. Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.

Eph. 2:1. And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins. 4. But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love where-

with he loves us, 5. Even when wer were dead in sins, hath he quickened us together with Christ (by grace ye are saved). John 1:12.

Mark 16:16. He that believeth, and is baptized, shall be saved; but he that believeth not, shall be damned. Matt. 28:19. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the FATHER and the SON and of the HOLY GHOST.

THE INVITATION, COME. Isa. 55: I. Ho, everyone that thirsteth, come ye to the waters, and he that hath no money; come ye, buy, and eat; yea, come buy wine and milk, without money and without price.

Isa. 1:18. Come now, and let use reason together, saith the Lord; though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool.

When Peter saw Jesus walking on the water, he knew he could not go to Him, unless He bid him come, but when He said "come," he knew He would make it possible. So he stepped out of the ship and walked triumphantly on the waves in the power of the Christ, while he looked to Him. So can we triumph over the rough billows of sin, sickness and sorrow, by His grace, and "looking unto Jesus."

Our sins have separated us from God, but Jesus has opened up the way, by His blood and says, (John 6:37) Him that cometh to me, I will in no wise cast out. Christ always said, "come." He never turned any away who were seeking His blessing. To the sick and demon possessed, He said, Bring them to me.

Matt. 19:14. Suffer little children, and forbid them not to come unto me, for of such is the kingdom of heaven. How much shame and sorrowful reaping would be spared if young people would give their lives to God. Weary souls, who are carrying burdens and cares too heavy for you, to you Christ says, (Matt. 11:28) Come unto me, all ye that labor, and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

THE COMING OF THE LORD

There is considerable Scripture that has to do with the coming of the Lord, concerning the Jews. Mat. 23; 37, 38, 39. O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not; Behold, your house is left unto you desolate. For I say unto you, Ye shall not see me henceforth, till ye shall say, Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord.

The return of Christ will come when the Jews in Jerusalem say those words, "Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord." Christ descends from heaven at the united prayers of the twelve tribes of Israel in the City of Jerusalem at a certain time. No man knoweth the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh, but He will shorten the days of the tribulation period but no man knows how many days He will shorten it. If He did not shorten the time of trouble the tribes would be utterly wiped from the face of the earth.

Gen. 12; 1, 2, 3. "Now the Lord had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country and from thy kindred and from thy father's house unto a land that I will show thee; and I will curse him that curseth thee; and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed."

Here Abraham is called out as a chosen vessel of the Lord and as the father of the Jewish people Gen 12; 6, 7." And Abram passed through the land unto the place of Sichem unto the plain of Moreh; and the Cannanite was then in the land. And the Lord appeared unto Abram and said: Unto thy seed will I give this land and there builded he an altar unto the Lord who appeared unto him." God promised to give him and his seed that land. Gen. 13; 14 to 17. And the Lord said unto Abram, after that Lot was separated from him, Lift up now thine eyes and look from the place where thou art, northward, and southward, and eastward, and westward; For all the land which thou seest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed forever. And I will make thy seed as the dust of the earth; so that if a man can number the dust of the earth, then shall thy seed also be numbered. Arise, walk through the land in the length of it and in the

With ten hundred thousand salin? breadth of it; for I will give it unto thee. Then Abram removed his tent, and came and dwelt in the plain of Mamre, which is in Hebron, and built there an altar unto the Lord.

This was another working of the Lord in clearing up the title of the Jews. Lot separated from Abraham, after he did so and the flocks and herds increased, the Lord renewed the covenant with Abraham, he had preference with him over Lot. After this covenant the Lord made another one.

Gen 17; 7, 8 And I will establish my covenant between me and thee and thy seed after thee in their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be a God unto thee and to thy seed after thee. And I will give unto thee, and to thy seed after thee the land wherein thou art a stranger, all the land of Canaan, for an everlasting possession; and I will be their God.

We must get God's basis of promise for the Jew as sole heir to Palestine in order to find out the purpose and plan of the Jew in the future. These promises hold good for time and eternity, in order that the promise of Abraham might be fulfilled.

Gen. 17: 19, 20, 21, "And God said, Sarah thy wife shall bear thee a son indeed; and thou shalt call his name Isaac; and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant and with his seed after him. And as for Ishmael, I have heard thee; Behold, I have blessed him and will make him fruitful, and will multiply him exceedingly; twelve princes shall he begat; and I will make him a great nation. But my covenant will I establish with Isaac which Sarah shall bear unto thee at this set time in the next year. And he left off talking with him, and God went up from Abraham. And Abraham took Ishmael his son and all that were born in his house, and all that were bought with his money, every male among the men of Abraham's house; and circumcised the flesh of their foreskin in the selfsame day, as God has said unto him."

Gen. 21: 9 to 21. Gen. 25: 5, 6. God witnessed the covenant with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Isaac was left alone that he might be a partaker. Abraham disposed of his other set of children that Isaac might be sole heir to promises. And Abraham gave all that he had unto Isaac."

Gen. 26, 3, 4, God renewed covenant with Isaac. "Sojourn in this land and I will be with thee, and will bless thee; for unto thee, and unto thy seed, I will give all these countries, and I will perform the oath which I sware unto Ab-

raham thy father; and I will make thy seed to multiply as the stars of heaven, and will give unto they seed all these countries; and in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed.

Gen. 28: 13, 14 God makes a covenant with Jacob." And behold the Lord stood above it and said, I am the Lord God of Abraham thy father and the God of Isaac, the land whereon thou liest to thee will I give it, and to thy seed. And thy seed shall be as the dust of the earth, and thou shalt spread abroad to the west, and to the east, and to the north, and to the south; and in thee and in thy seed shall all the families of the earth be blessed."

God dealt with three separate individualities. He renewed His promise. This was the original deed to the land of Palestine, no other nation can claim the land as their own.

When Moses became the leader of the people, they traveled 40 years in the wilderness. There came a great split into the united kingdom of Israel, and only the tribe of Judah was left out of the 12. 2 Kings 17: 18." Therefore the Lord was very angry with Israel and removed them out of his sight. There was none left but the tribe of Judah only. They remained in Palestine until the year 606 B. C. and were taken captive by Nebchad; they were captive 70 years. Jer. 25: 11.

Jesus was a full blood Jew of the tribe of Judah. They never married or intermarried into strange nations. Judah remained in Palestine to fulfill prophecy. Jesus is the seed of Abraham. We, as Christians who believe in Him, are elected unto grace and are become the children of Abraham by faith. We are bone of His bone, flesh of His flesh and heirs of all the promises made to Abraham. And all the way down those promises are fulfilled in Abraham, these promises are fulfilled in Christ and we are heirs to all things.

There is a dividing line between literal and spiritual Israel. Literal Israel remains the same, but we and all converted people are spiritual Israel. In Luke 21st, we have the parable of the fig tree which is a type of the Jews going back to Jerusalem. The tribe of Judah was scattered. When the Jews rejected Jesus in A. D. 70 they were led away captive into all nation. But at the present time the last census of the Jews read that there were eighteen million Jews over two million of them in New York City. Two hun-

dred and fifty thousand of them have been converted to Christianity. There is the greatest success right now in preaching Jesus Christ to the Jews than there has ever been at any time.

In Rev. 12th chapter we have the church and the man child. There are two Man Childs mentioned in the Bible, the other is found in Isa. 66:7, and is speaking of the city of Jerusalem as the mother of the man child the 12 tribes of Israel. There are two different groups of 144,000 mentioned in the Bible. Rev. 14:1 to 5. These are the ransomed of the Lord who return with Christ to Mt. Zion and follow the Lamb whitherso ever He goest. The other 144,-000 mentioned in Rev. 7 are of the twelve tribes of Israel to be sealed in their forehead, the angel of the Lord will seal them. The elect or remnant who go back to Palestine will possess Palestine at the descent of the Lord and enter into the Millennium in a fleshly human state. The other 144,000 return in an immortalized state. There are two classes of people, fleshly and spiritual. The spiritual reign over the others. In Dan. 9:27 The Anti-Christ makes a covenant with the Jews as a nation. "And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week; and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate."

Great persecution will come to the Jews at this time. The nations are now seeking favor of the Jews. Russia is offering colonies to the Jews; Spain has officially proclaimed to the world a special invitation to the Jews to come to Spain to make their home there; Brazil is also the home of the Jew, and also the U.S. When the ten toed kingdom of Daniel is set up there will be great persecution of the Jews, they will never go back to their land until driven back. The Lord will put a sword behind them and drive them back. There are now 1/2 million of Jews in Roumania and Poland on the verge of starvation. Palestine has 173,000 Jews. There is no labor shortage there. This is a remarkable condition as world wide there is labor shortage. In the U.S. there is 6 or 7 million, in Italy 1 million and 10 million in Europe. The upheavel is coming to drive the Jew back to Palestine and Palestine is getting in a condition

to receive all of them. She can obtain enough food stuffs to take care of the ten tribes and Judah as well. The Jews are not going back to accept Christ but for nationalism. In Rev. 7:2, 3, 4, the servants of God were sealed in their foreheads out of the 12 tribes of Isreal. They are sealed to escape the tribulation. We are sealed with the Holy Ghost and have the privilege of going into redemption to escape tribulation. There is one class left on the earth during tribulation, the 12 tribes of Isreal. Those ready for redemption go up in the rapture, those in the bride class go into the wilderness. At this time the plagues come upon the earth, but they will not hurt the 12 tribes of Isreal. They will be in Jerusalem at the descent of Christ. At this time the nations will turn against the Jews. and oust them with the sword. The Jews then pray the prayer that brings Christ back to earth again. In Zech 12:8 The Lord defends Jerusalem. The battle of Armageddon is the last battle to be fought at the closing of the age. When the Jews realize the Anti-Christ is an impostor they will cry out for deliverance, and Jesus comes in answer to their prayer. His foot touches Mt. Olive and it splits in two. He comes in answer to the cry for deliverance and redeems and spares them. He shortens the days of tribulation; this is the dark hour of the age and the close of the 70th week of Daniel. All nations are gathered together for the battle of Armageddon.

There are two judgments, two resurrections and two raptures or translations. 2 Tim 4:1. "I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom." This is the judgment seat of Christ, He comes to Mt. Olives to judge. Mat 25:31 to 46. This is the coming of the Lord when He comes to sit on His throne of glory. 2 Thes. 1:7, 8, 9. The Lord goes down into the valley of Esdralon, where a great company of soldiers are gathered for battle. There are different fazes of the coming of the Lord. In Rev. we find He is coming on a white horse. Paul said He was coming with a flaming fire and Jude pictured it with 10,000 of His saints. There are two million men gathered in the valley of Armageddon from all the world About the time they are ready for battle they make a raid on Jerusalem and try to wipe it off the earth and try to do away with the Jews,

Jesus answered, verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

Some take the water birth to mean water Baptism and some the natural birth. It is not my purpose to discuss that here; but take the sixth verse, That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. The first man was made a living soul, flesh man, not spirit but natural life. Afterward that which is spiritual. 1 Cor. 15:45, 46.

Because of Adam's transgression, death passed upon the natural or flesh man. Disease is a weapon in the hands of Satan, the enemy of the human race, to torture and kill them until nearly all go before their allotted time. God so loved the natural man, born of the flesh, under the sentence of death; (with no spirit or resurrection power, not able to save or heal themselves, or retain the breath of life in the day of death) that He sent His only begotten Son; a Saviour, Healer, Sanctifier, Baptizer, glorious Lord and coming King. We were helpless for we were only natural being under the

power of a spiritual foe. Jesus the Son of God a spiritual Deliverer came to our rescue. All hail, Praise His name, the only begotten of the great Father. Philemon 10. In the beginning was the Word. St. John 1:1. Endureth forever. 1 Peter 1:25. And this is the Word preached unto you. 1 Peter 1:25. Impossible for the unregenerate to be spiritually born. All flesh is as grass and passeth away. 1 Peter 1:24. James 1: 11. How can we be born again? Not of natural or corruptible seed but of incorruptible seed. 1 Peter 1:23. His seed. Matt. 1:23, 25. Came to His own and His own received Him not. St. John 1:11. But to as many as received Him to them gave He power, (spirit life, his seed begotten) to become the sons of God.

The natural man has not power to become the son of God till he receives it in convertion when the begetting or spiritual conception takes place. The first spark of spirit life, thus making the new birth possible. The Son of God was begotten of the Father, conceived in the natural and born of woman. For us to become joint heirs with Him we must be born again. Begotten by the word that liveth and abideth for ever, and that word is Christ; and born of the spirit or God's seed not many seeds but one.
