Dear Parishioners;

I hate to preach at Mass about money so instead I decided to speak of money in my weekly bulletin article. That being said I'm obliged to remind our communities that this weekend is the Diocese Perpetuate the Gift Appeal. As you may know, this appeal supports the Priests' Retirement Fund for our retired Diocesan priests. All gifts contributed between September 19, 2020 and December 31, 2020 will count toward parish contributions to the Priests' Retirement Fund, thus reducing the amount of budgeted funds that parishes need to contribute via the Priest Retirement Assessment.

Here are some common questions concerning the "Perpetuate the Gift Appeal": What is "Perpetuate The Gift"? Perpetuate The Gift is simply the annual appeal that supports our Diocesan Priests' Retirement Fund. It signifies the beautifully unending and total commitment of our priests to our spiritual salvation, and our contribution to their retirement.

Who oversees the Priests' Retirement Fund? The fund is overseen by the Priests' Retirement Fund Board, which is a subcommittee of the Finance Council of the Diocese of Toledo. The Board is composed of priest representatives, both active and retired, professionals in the actuarial fields and plan administration. The plan administration and actuarial professionals are present at all board meetings.

How are the funds invested? The funds are invested with professional fund managers in socially responsible investments, as defined by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

How can I make a gift? A gift of cash or check can be placed in your parish collection or sent to: Perpetuate The Gift PO Box 954 Toledo, OH 43697 Online gifts by credit card or direct debit can be made at www.toledodiocese.org. Click on Give and select Perpetuate the Gift in the drop down box.

As you may know our Diocese has a skeletal priesthood where each priest usually serves multiple locations. Because of the lack of priests in our Diocese we are very thankful toward our retired priests who assist our parishes if the pastor becomes sick or takes a week of vacation. Thanks for any support you give to these retired priests of Jesus Christ!

CONSCIENCE AND THE CATHOLIC VOTER - 3RD of 8

"In the Catholic tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation."

on issues of consequence. This outline is the third of eight, which will examine important moral and political issues. This third outline will provide an overview of the issue of marriage and the family.

Marriage and the Family

The family is the foundational cell of society. That is why the Church teaches what Pope Saint John Paul II wrote in 1981:

The future of humanity passes by way of the family. It is therefore indispensable and urgent that every person of good will should endeavor to save and foster the values and requirements of the family. I feel that I must ask for a particular effort in this field from the sons and daughters of the Church... They must show the family special love. This is an injunction that calls for concrete action. (Saint John Paul II, Familiaris Consortio, On the Role of the Christian Family in the Modern World, 86)

If the future of humanity passes by the way of the family, Catholics should pay special attention to the political approaches of candidates to the family. As the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has written, Catholic are called to:

Protect the fundamental understanding of marriage as the life-long and faithful union of one man and one woman as the central institution of society; promote the complementarity of the sexes and reject false "gender" ideologies; provide better support for family life morally, socially, and economically, so that our nation helps parents raise their children with respect for life, sound moral values, and an ethic of stewardship and responsibility. (The Challenge of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, Handout Part II)

Yet today, we find the family in crisis. As Pope Francis has pointed out:

The family is experiencing a profound cultural crisis (which) is particularly serious because the family is the fundamental cell of society, where we learn to live with others despite our differences and to belong to one another, it is also the place where parents pass on the faith to their children. (Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium, 66)

This crisis arises from a general lack of openness to life, the use of contraception, absentee fatherhood, and the destruction of what marriage actually is. The Church has always taught that marriage is a covenant between a man and a woman that brings them together as husband and wife to be father and mother to any children their union produces.

Marriage is a covenant "by which man and woman establish themselves a partnership of the whole of life that is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1601)

In summation, marriage is the building block of families, and therefore of all human civilization. Marriage then has public, not just private, purposes. The Church recognizes then that marriage is based on the truth that men and women are distinct and complimentary, that having children requires a man and a woman, and that every child deserves both a mom and a dad. Catholics therefore should pay special attention to where candidates stand on the crucial role of the family, that is founded on God's design for love, between a man and a woman in marriage.



- Fr. Jeff inquired if the Board was aware of any one who might be interested in being sacristan for the 4:30 p.m. Saturday night Mass. One of the Board members is considering it and will get back with Fr. Jeff.
- Fr. Jeff feels like the 2020-2021 school year has gotten off to a good start. He enjoys his class visits with the school children and staff.
- Chuck Weaver and Paul Schroeder have been working on some of the tuck pointing and the plaster in the church.
- Fr. Jeff continues doing his home-bound visits. Right now he is visiting five different households in the parish and distributing Holy Communion during those visits.
- Fr. Jeff has heard some concerns from a couple parishioners who are not happy with our
 parish's social distancing and mask protocol. He asked the Board if they are hearing similar
 complaints. Lisa Myers said she will purchase a box of masks and put them in the back of
 church in case any one needs one.
- Fr. Jeff expressed congratulations to Adam Paynter who completed a long bike tour from Cincinnati to Cleveland and raised over \$4,500 for the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio
- Fr. Jeff is happy to announce that Jonah Studer is the new Athletic Director for the Panther Sports program
- Unfortunately, there will be no Girls Volleyball team this year. There were enough girls who were interested in playing, but there were just not enough teams for them to play.
- The St. Joe's Purse Bing has been postponed. It was originally scheduled for October 18, 2020.

School Report:

- Our school has an enrollment of 97 students in Preschool 8th grade. So far, the social distancing, masks, temperature taking (2x a day), school drop off and pick up and other safety precautions are working out well.
- Fr. Jeff will give Server Training on September 16th for grades 5 8.

- Trick or Trunk will be held on October 31, 2020, for Sacred Heart staff, students & their families
 and SHJ parishioners. It will be held outside and will last 30 minutes. Hot dogs and chips will be
 passed out afterwards, but there will be no inside activities. Masks are mandatory.
- Lisa has received some complaints about adults not being allowed to attend Wednesday morning Mass, but truthfully, the church is full. There is no additional seating available.
- If a student has to quarantine (due to COVID), online learning is available.
