



Dear Parents,

Many of you are already making plans for your childcare needs for this summer and the 2019 - 2020 school year. First St. John Day School wishes to offer you the best choice in child care and provide your child with quality learning experiences to grow academically, spiritually, socially and physically!

We want to inform you of our summer program and give you the opportunity to sign up first. By having families sign up early we can plan our program to meet the needs of those families.

Summer Program: Our program is open to children between the ages of 30 months to 10 years. The children are separated part of the day for learning experiences and relaxing play. The school age children will take some field trips, while programs will be brought in for the preschoolers. We will offer 2/3/4 or 5 full or half days from June 3 to August 2. You must select which option you prefer and then pick your days. Additional days could be added on a space-available basis.

Our Summer Program will look a bit different than the regular school year. Still included is structured class time, with themes, because we want to continue the regular schedule since many of the children will be returning in the fall. Also, a number of parents start their children in the summer, making the transition into fall classes easier. There will be more relaxing play time outside, when the weather is nice. We ask that children keep swimsuits at school making it easier to set up the pools and cool off! Popsicles are kept on hand for the same reason!

Cost and Payment: Registration is \$50. You will need to be enrolled in our Tuition Express program or pay in full. (If you are currently enrolled, we will just add the additional charges for summer; you will not need to set up a new account.) The program runs 9 weeks.
