

Numbers in the Bible

Seventy

1.) The LORD said unto Moses, Gather unto me seventy men of the elders of Israel, whom thou knowest to be the elders of the people, and officers over them; and bring them unto the tabernacle of the congregation, that they may stand there with thee. What did God want to do to them?

(Numbers 11:16, 17)

- Endue them with the spirit, so that they could help Moses carry out his duties.
- Teach them the Ten Commandments.
- Rebuke them for their hard hearts.
- Kill them.

(Judges 9:52-56)
