Dave Kratz was born in Warren, Ohio, and spent his younger years in Fort Mitchell, Kentucky before his family moved to Tucson when he was ten. He graduated from Cholla High School in Tucson where he played basketball, baseball and tennis for the Chargers. Basketball was "his game" as a high schooler. He made the varsity squad as a sophomore and served as team captain during his junior and senior years. He attended two basketball camps ran by then University of Arizona Head Coach Fred Snowden. After being a two-time Camp MVP, he was recruited by the U of A; however, he would have been redshirted for a year, so he decided to play for Mesa Community College instead.
