### Congregational Council Minutes July 18, 2021

**ATTENDANCE:** All were present except Sheila Starkey, Jackson Price, Joe Koon, and Buddy Hydrick (hospitalized).

**CARES AND CONCERNS:** Praying for Jenny Scott's son Ross and daughter-in-law Lindsay and Buddy Hydrick hospitalized for two weeks without a diagnosis.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Approved with two additions

**ADOPTION OF MINUTES:** Approved with no corrections **REPORTS:** 

- Pastor Gina: Written report received. She taught bible study weekly in June and adult class at VBS. Pastor Gina will be at SC Lutheran Men retreat August 20-22 and Women's Retreat at Camp Kinard September 16-19.
- Treasurer: Written reports received for May and June 2021.
- Financial Secretary: Written reports received for April, May, and June 2021.

### Team Reports/Recommendations:

**Worship:** Two Candlelight Dinners are being planned for October 16<sup>th</sup> and December 18<sup>th</sup>. The Worship Team recommends we accept donation from Temples Halloran Funeral Home for 6 military flags and that Mt. Hermon purchase the flag poles, stands, and other accessories at a cost of approximately \$150 each for total of \$900 with funds to be taken from Capital Campaign line item (which has \$5639.36) if the congregation doesn't donate all of them. **APPROVED.** The Worship Team purchased and installed a \$4843.15 sound board without taking a recommendation to the Finance Committee or Church Council for approval. Motion to approve already purchased and installed sound board at a cost of \$4843.15 with funds to be taken from Capital Campaign line item which has \$5639.36 in its account. **APPROVED.** 

**Teach:** Purchased crosses for Confirmation gifts and items for new member baskets. VBS curriculum Discovery on Adventure Island purchased for VBS July 20-22. Sunday School will restart on July 18<sup>th</sup>. The Teach team is asking for volunteers to teach all levels of Sunday School. Council member inquired if the Teach team is current on background checks for adults teaching those under age 18. Motion by council to change youth storage area room key back to standard church key. Also, notify Bryan and Missy Addy to remove anything they need before lock changed. **APPROVED**.

**Outreach:** Written report received from June meeting. Next blood drive will be August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 11:30 to 4 pm. The donations of fresh produce for the Food Pantry have been appreciated. The team will work on feedback received from Church Council regarding the church brochure. School supplies being collected to distribute to local schools. Bishop Carder's Dementia Workshop has been rescheduled for August 29<sup>th</sup> at 4 pm.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

1. Building Renovation & Repair Task Force: They submitted a two-page list of repairs and renovations the task force recommends Church Council consider. Motion to accept these suggestions as information. **APPROVED.** Task Force recommends a HVAC split unit (air handler in room and compressor outside) for

Live Streaming room at a cost of \$3300. The electrical work to connect it, partially repairing power panel in acolyte room, and two thermostats for fellowship hall would cost \$2590 with total cost of scope of work \$5890 with funds coming from \$52,657.33 loan balance as of May 31<sup>st</sup>. **APPROVED.** The task force also recommends replacing the carpet in new Fellowship Hall entrance and basement hallway. The area would also need cement leveling and baseboards. Two quotes received within \$100 of each other and quote was \$12,700. Council members requested receiving an additional quote for replacing buckling flooring in narthex. The recommendation will be revisited next month after additional information received.

2. Synod Convention: Terry Swygert selected as 2022 CWA delegate for meeting in Ohio

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Procedural Audit Inquiry: Recommendation that we conduct a congregational audit on our finances, policies, and procedures. Recommendation tabled for further discussion at next meeting due to long agenda tonight.
- Reservation request for monthly use of Fellowship Hall: Neal Taylor of Beekeeper Association requests rental of Fellowship Hall monthly on first Tuesday of the month from 6-9 pm at a rate of \$200 which would be deposited in Building Improvement Fund. APPROVED as long as there is no conflict with Mt. Hermon activities.
- 3. Church Bus: There are only 6 CDL drivers in the church. The bus was purchased in approximately 1999 and motion to investigate selling the bus. **APPROVED**
- 4. Church parsonage: Tenant to move out August 31<sup>st</sup>.
- 5. Next meeting in person in Fellowship Hall August 8<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm with devotions by Sheila Starkey.




