Dear Fellow Members of the Body of Christ,

Our worship for this month begins on July 4th. Always there are questions as to how do I or should I separate religion from politics. Two topics we learned as children not to talk about with friends or even family. Our nation has been so divided over the past few years and that has spilled over into our religious beliefs. Confusion between politics and medicine were also heightened during the COVID-19 pandemic. So where is God in these talks of government verses religion?

Luther's thought of the two worlds we live in comes to mind. They are the spiritual and the everyday world in which we live. Luther felt that it was important to learn to live into both worlds as God is present in each. God created this wonderful world in which we reside. God also created government to protect us and keep good order. And of course, God wants us to ultimately love and serve Him.

The assigned lectionary Gospel for the 4th is from the 6th Chapter of Mark, verses 1-13. Jesus is not recognized, in his hometown, as the Messiah, the Son of God. The people there knew him as the carpenter's son and failed to see His power. The next section of Scripture has Jesus sending out the twelve disciples. They are charged to go out and proclaim that all should repent for the Kingdom of God is near. How did Jesus and his disciples handle the rejection that they encountered on their mission? How do we handle living in both worlds today? Where is God in the midst of our struggle of religion verses politics?

The Holy Spirit is right there in the middle of those questions. The Spirit operates in the "in between". He intercedes on our behalf when we are confused about what to do and what to believe. The Spirit always leads us to God and asks us the question, "What would Jesus Do?" It is through the Holy Spirit that we come to know God and His will for us.

So this summer, I urge you to listen for the leading of the Holy Spirit in all you do and say. Come to Christ the Servant on Sunday mornings and worship the Lord and Savior with us. The Spirit will touch you in ways you can only imagine, so you too can live into the fullness of life and the promise of eternal life, through Jesus Christ.

Volunteer!


Plant a tree (sapling) in your backyard.



Interesting Fourth of July Facts

- 1. On the very first 4th of July in 1776, America was home to only 2.5 million citizens. Today, it is home to over 326 million.
- 2. Presidents John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, and James Monroe all died on July Fourth.
- 3. Only John Hancock and Secretary of Congress Charles Thomson signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. Others signed the document on August 2.
- 4. Americans consume more hot dogs on the 4th of July than on any other day of the year. Experts estimate that Americans eat 155 million hot dogs on July 4. That's enough to stretch across the U.S. more than five times.
- 5. July 4 was not established as a federal holiday until 1870, nearly 100 years after the nation's founding.
- 6. Two signers of the Declaration of Independence would later go on to serve as President of the United States: John Adams and Thomas Jefferson. They would both also die on the same day: July 4, 1826, only hours apart from each other.
- 7. The first public reading of the Declaration of Independence took place on July 8, 1776, in Philadelphia, PA, after the ringing of the Liberty Bell.
- 8. Only one U.S. president, Calvin Coolidge, was born on July 4.
- 9. The Philippines has a reason to celebrate independence on July 4 too. On that day in 1946, they signed the Treaty of Manila, gaining their independence from the United States.
- 10. Other countries, including Denmark, England, Norway, Portugal, and Sweden, also celebrate the Fourth of July, welcoming American tourists into their countries.
- 11. The original draft of the Declaration of Independence went missing and remains lost to history.
- 12. Fifty-nine places in the U.S. include the word "liberty" in their name. The state of Pennsylvania has the most cities, counties, townships, and villages that use the word liberty, at 11.
- 13. To honor the 13 original colonies, every July 4, the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped (not rung).
