

The Nativity of the Lord 25 December 2022



Christmas is a very special time to gather together as a family. We celebrate again the coming of the Saviour and Redeemer foretold by the prophets - Jesus - Emmanuel born into the family of Mary and Joseph, and through them into the family of all humankind. We gather together to celebrate God's presence in our midst in the love and care shared within our families, in the companionship, kindness, care and compassion we have received and channel to others who are much less fortunate than ourselves.

In a family we do not choose one another. It is in a family that we learn what love is about. Love is giving, respecting and sharing. We accept and we get to love each other. Our Sacred Heart Family is a very special one, made up of brothers and sisters, old and young, coming from different lands and nations. In such a family we come to know, accept, love one another respecting each other's differences and needs. We do it because God has loved us first and taught us through the mission of Jesus that love, justice and the dignity of each human person is at the very heart of the Gospel by which we strive to live.

At Sacred Heart it is our shared mission to be an active, inclusive and respectful community. We strive to love and care for all, especially those in need. We like to be a family that welcomes everyone and celebrates together and, as we continue our journey we will strive to make our family an even better and safer one for all, especially our children, young people vulnerable persons in our midst or who live in fear or isolation.

But our commitment does not rest there.

Celebrating the presence of our Saviour and Lord, we gaze upon a newborn infant in an animal's feeding box in a makeshift animal shelter. Exposed to the elements he is protected only by two caring parents forced to quickly move from their home for a government census. The woman, suffering in full term of her pregnancy during the journey, the man desperate to find a safe and comfortable place for her to rest. — In their case a family without the protection and support of a family. It is not uncommon. "So as we celebrate the birth of our Saviour, let us remember that he came on a mission of love for all of us but especially for the lost and broken. Those who have lost family and been forced to flee, through war, discrimination or violence. Like Mary and Joseph who contemplated Christ born homeless and rejected, we can learn to recognise the same Christ who does not find welcome and hospitality on our shores, the same Christ who does not find a room in people's hearts. We cannot worship the Christ child in truth without embracing the most vulnerable." Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen.

May this Christmas bring us all comfort, joy and peace, and inspire us all to be the love of Jesus to every person. And what better time could there be for us to renew our commitment to uphold the safety and dignity of each child, young or vulnerable person that they might thrive in a caring and supportive environment in our church community.

A Christmas Message from Archbishop Comensoli

14 December 2022

Friends, I recently heard an Advent prayer that has a striking line in it, describing Jesus' birth. It said:

[Jesus], when the soles of your feet touch the ground,

... you become one of us, to be at one with us.

The image of God's bare feet touching the earth is such an evocative one. Especially at this time of year, we know only too well what it feels like to do the 'great Aussie dance' across a hot beach or prickly lawn!

But of course, this image is far more than a physical reminder.

For Christmas is the divinity of God born into our humanity.

Through the Incarnation, God comes to us, withholding nothing of himself

Barefooted—taking on our flesh, our human condition—in order to touch. and to be touched, in the particularities of our lives: this is Emmanuel— God with us.

Christmas is God placing an exclamation mark on his words, 'I am with you!'

Our God, whose name is Jesus, has walked with us through the tough years of the pandemic and is touching the ground now where healing and renewal is needed.

The Son of God is walking through the streets of Ukraine and Myanmar, Ethiopia and Lebanon, with feet bloodied from war, conflict and repression, yet still taking the steps needed towards peace and liberation. He has seen and felt both the joy of our existence and the suffering of those who are lost or vulnerable. He has awakened us to an attentiveness for our global humanity, and a care for our common home.

So I wonder if, this Christmas and for the year ahead, it is time to remove the 'shoes' that keep us from standing barefoot with Jesus-to feel the sacred ground of our lives with God?

Might we come before him 'barefoot' in our frailties, yet alive in the wonder of our humanity-made in his image-ready and willing to live as the people of God he has created us to be-fraternally, lovingly, caringly; generous, forgiving and hopeful.

May Jesus, the barefooted child of the living God, fill you and your loved ones with abundant joy and peace.

SECOND READING

Hebrews 1:1-6

At various times in the past and in various different ways, God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; but in our own time, the last days, he has spoken to us through his Son, the Son that he has appointed to inherit everything and through whom he made everything there is. He is the radiant light of God's glory and the perfect copy of his nature, sustaining the universe by his powerful command; and now that he has destroyed the defilement of sin, he has gone to take his place in heaven at the right hand of divine Majesty. So he is now as far above the angels as the title which he has inherited is higher than their own name.

GOSPEL

John 1:1-18

All that came to be had life in him and that life was the light of men, a light that shines in the dark, a light that darkness could not overpower.

A man came, sent by God.

His name was John.

He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him.

He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

The Word was the true light that enlightens all men; and he was coming into the world. He was in the world that had its being through him, and the world did not know him.

He came to his own domain and his own people did not accept him.

Indeed, from his fullness we have, all of us, received – yes, grace in return for grace, since, though the Law was given through Moses, grace and truth have come through Jesus Christ.

No one has ever seen God; it is the only Son, who is nearest to the Father's heart, who has made him known.
