My work is related with carnivore ecology and conservation in the Neotropics, with extensive field work especially in Colombia, Costa Rica, and Mexico. My focus is mostly related on how to bring the best available ecological science into conservation planning and decision-making and the assessment of threatened and data deficient species, with a special focus on small carnivores. My work ranges from basic ecological research to complex spatial and ecological modeling and from the Colombian weasel to Coatis and Raccoons. I recently received my PhD from UNAM Mexico and I currently serve as Co-chair of the IUCN/SSC Small Carnivore Specialist Group, Vice President of the Colombian Mammalogical Society and as Editor-in-chief for Small Carnivore Conservation, Latin American Journal of Conservation and Mammalogy Notes.
