#### **SEPTEMBER 2013 MINUTES**

The GSSN met at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV on Wed., Sept. 4, 2013. President Ian Thaler called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM & led in pledging allegiance to the flag. He welcomed all - there were 6 visitors and 59 signed in. Dara gave the Treasurer's Report; Fred made a motion to accept the report as presented, which was seconded by Jim Hanson. George N. announced an informal breakfast club meeting for Wed. at 9AM (Sept. 11, 2013) at the Joker's Wild. He then announced that a 1-day outing would take place on Tues., Sept. 17<sup>th</sup> at the Pahrump claim. Anyone interested in either event can contact him. ### **OCTOBER 2013 MINUTES**

GoldSearchers of Southern Nevada - October 2, 2013

The meeting was called to order by the President Ian Thaler at 6:30-pm Tuesday, October 3, 2013 at the American Legion Hall in Henderson NV. The President led the meeting in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag, and then welcomed new members and visitors.

The Treasurer Dara Thaler gave the Treasurer's Report for September 2013. A motion was made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's report. Report accepted The President mentioned a donation to the club of a flag by Gary Gallagher that was to be a raffle prize. The President noted that the flag would be of use at the claim sites as the existing one is worn out. A motion to keep the flag and use it at club claims was made, seconded and was passed.

The President recapped the most recent outing at the Broken Step claim. It was discussed that the October outing would be the weekend of Oct 26<sup>th</sup> as not to compete with the GPAA outing on the 19<sup>th</sup> of October in the Dolan Springs area. With a show of hands the outing site was selected; the 20 acre, if Jim can bring his backhoe to dig for us. In the event Jim can't bring the hoe we will have the outing on the 28 claim.

The President discussed the emails that are sent out prior to events. They are sent out a week before the outing, we are not getting the number of kick backs as we used to, but the President noted that you should have your mail program with the membership email address of the club entered as a contact

(gssnmembership@gmail.com) so that your mail server can receive the emails and they are not automatically sent to the junk mail folder. Hopefully this will ensure all members receive the notice. Also be sure that the club has your correct email address.

The President than thanked all those who helped with the setup and teardown at the last outing. George Kilroy gave a summary of the activities of the Sun newspaper reporter and photographer who attended the outing on Saturday. Brian and Lelia took pictures and asked questions for an article in the Sun Newspaper "Around Nevada" series. They stayed for the potluck and then the metal detector hunt. Brian did dig some dirt and George helped him find some gold.

George advised the membership that the Breakfast Club will be held the Tuesday after our general meeting at Jokers Club in Henderson. He will review what transpired at the general meeting for members that were unable to make the monthly meeting.

George reported on the mid week outing two weeks after the last general meeting. He plans on a monthly "day only" outing on the second Wednesday after the general meeting. The next one will be the second Wednesday after the October meeting (Oct. 16<sup>th</sup>) at the Broken Step Claim. November he will try to go to the Eldorado Mine and we include a lunch with those attending. The December day outing will be something small and easy.

The September "day outing" was at the Phrump claim and a number of the Phrump club members visited. George also cautioned our members that the "day outing" are BYOE, "Bring Your Own Everything.

The President thanked Dale Riddle, a longtime member who donated mining type melters for our raffle. Thank you Dale.

Fred advised that we would not be doing a feature on "equipment of the month", he used that time for the newest information on Government Regulations that were printed in the monthly GPAA newspaper. The government has withdrawn 303,900 acres from new mining claims. For the next twenty years there will no longer be any new claims, this land will be set aside for solar power. The land in question is in Az, Utah, New Mexico, the Grand Canyon to Zion. Fred would like all of us to contact our representatives and speak out against this legislation. The only way we can acquire new claim land is to purchase the land. Let's get the word out about this. Please see the article in the latest GPAA Gazette.

The club received notice of two members or relatives of members that passed away this month. Guy's mother Julie Quinn passed away since the last meeting and Ed Locke from Lake Havasu City also passed away. Please keep them in your thoughts and prayers.

The President advised the membership that he did not intend to seek reelection to the Presidency. He has served for four years and would like to have someone else assume the Presidency. He recapped the progress the club has made in the past five years and felt that although it has been a pleasure being President he would like to step back and let someone else fill the position. He advised that he would stay aboard and help with whatever needs to be done, but that he feels the club will continue on as it has been, the claims are in good order, Ian feels nothing has been left undone.

Fred will serve as the chair person for the nomination Committee, Morris Sequin, Frank Calhoun and Leslie Burns will serve as members. The nominations begin now and will be completed by the next meeting. The election will be in November and the installation of new board members will be in December. Fred Secured nominations from the floor:

Ian nominated John Roberts (the current Vice President) for President, John has accepted the nomination. Fred called for additional nominations, there were none.
