# Crystal Ball Thoughts

## From Historic Trails To The Future?



## Prologue

The history trail of Southwestern REACT

is replete with changes to upgrade our capabilities to serve our community. To, perhaps, foresee the possible future, we might take a moment to review our past development as an emergency and service communications team. Let's begin.

## Our Situation and Duty.

The REACT "Bible" may well start off "in the beginning there was nothing for the motorist public". Well, at that time, the CB radio service was in its infant stage but rapidly growing from base stations to mobiles and hand helds. Soon mobiles were talking to other mobile and base stations. Then "one dark and stormy night" someone in a mobile called a base to report an emergency, and at that moment, REACT was born "Good Buddy".

## The March Of Time.

As stated above, the birth of CB Radio quickly caught the whole nation's attention with personal use radio with low cost and no testing required for a license, just money. Several movies ("Smokey and The Bandit") and TV shows ("Dukes of Hazard") depicted using CB. With all those radios out there, the need to use them for public safety and support. REACT, along with small scattered groups attempted to fill the need. Southwestern REACT was formed with a small group in the South Bay area and grew from there. Hundreds have passed through as members, at one time, having over 100 members, making swr the largest team in the nation. That was then. Times have changed.

Through the years, realizing we needed to improve our coverage, we added GMRS (General Mobile Radio Service)

which was Class A of the Personal Radio Service (CB is Class D). We continued to support CB through monitoring and communications with those that did not have GMRS, until the public use of cellphones pretty much ended motorist CB traffic. But the GMRS became our main-stay when we got our first repeater on Lyon's Peak, and the ability to connect through the Palomar and Santiago repeaters.

The next change occurred when the FCC changed the rules on group call signs and we lost our team license causing us to use only our personal call signs. Then we lost access to Lyons Peak. That led us to the Amateur Radio Service, where we are now.

## **Open The Crystal Ball Channel.**

The existing technologies in amateur radio are changing to improve coverage and quality. The promise of digital has created a number of options. Most notable are DMR and C4FM (also known as Fusion). I will discuss these in more detail in an article in "Pro's Nest". At this time, the Board is discussing if we can integrate one or the other in the Team's communication's tool box, in the near future. Here are some positive and negatives we are considering.

## **Positive And Negatives** of DMR & C4FM

Advantages: Both are digital systems, though not compatible, perform with clarity (no noise) where analog may be unreadable under matching conditions. There a number of local repeaters that handle C4FM. DMR systems allow communications with others on other repeaters worldwide. DMR radios are available from many different manufactures allowing for a lower cost.

*Disadvantages:* C4FM is currently only available in certain Yaesu radios, which

makes them more costly. DMR radios require creating a Code Plug (a configuration data load of for each Talk Group (digital channel) and repeater information). There are fewer local DMR repeaters.
