Grant Available for Home Alterations

If you qualify for the VA Aid & Attendance benefit, or have a service-related disability, you are encouraged to apply for the one-time HISA grant.

What is it?

Home Improvement and Structural Alterations (HISA) grant. A HISA grant provides funds for home improvements necessary for a disabled veteran to have access around the house and to essential lavatory and sanitary facilities. A HISA grant is available to a veteran who has received a medical determination by the VA that alterations to the home are necessary or appropriate for the effective treatment of the disability or for access. A veteran may receive both a HISA grant and either an SHA or SAH grant. The rules for HISA grant can be complicated and requires participation by the contractor or company that will be doing the home alterations. It's best to work with a contractor that has experience working with this type of grant. Please call us for a contractor in your area.

Who is Eligible?

A HISA grant is available to a disabled veteran even if the disability isn't service-connected. Follow the guidelines of eligibility on the VA Aid & Attendance document to determine eligibility by service date, or contact us for assistance.

How Much Could I Receive?

It depends if the Veteran's disability is service-related. The maximum amount available cannot exceed \$6,800 for Veterans with service connected disabilities or for Veterans rated 50 percent or more service connected disability.

A maximum of \$2,000 is for an eligible Veteran (non-service related).
