6. BOOK REVIEW: Grant, by Ron Chernow

In case you missed it, the 12/27/17 Fresno Bee had a rave review of this new book. It stated that the book is a "must read of 2017, which debunks Southern myths." The reviewer, Albert Hunt, wrote that in the post-war years the Southerners sought to elevate the reputations of their generals and denigrate Grant. They characterized him as a military butcher, a drunk, a corrupt and failed President.

Chernow tells a different story, of Grant's victorious campaigns, his generosity towards the defeated Confederates, and his civil rights accomplishments. He appointed many minorities to government posts, and tried to enfranchise the Blacks. The book does not white wash Grant, but also deals with his mistakes, and his regrets.
