DID YOU KNOW...?

That many houses and buildings in Oceanside are not in their original locations? Numerous houses were thought to be too handsome and functional to tear down and were moved to locations which were sometimes blocks away from where they were built.

The former Hill Street Café on PCH, soon to be Saint Tropez café, was originally built in 1888 at 602 N. Clementine by the druggist/doctor M.S. Weitzel (namesake for Weitzel St) and his wife Sara. It was moved in 1981 by John and Hazel Adams.

A bit longer move was for the house built in 1902 by Charles Libby, a real estate promoter, at the corner of 4th (now Civic Center Drive) and Summit in the Crown Heights area. Dubbed "the House on the Hill," he built it to attract others to Oceanside and the gorgeous view of the Pacific.

This "house on the hill" was later bought by the onetime burlesque performer Goldie McCarthy, otherwise known as the "Chicken Lady" for the many chickens she raised and her outlandish appearance. When she died in 1967, she left mementos from her stage career in the house, along with several hundred jars of jam and other preserves.
