We drove in very humid and hot mid 90 degree weather to Marshfield Wisconsin for our overnight, we made our fuel stops and bathroom breaks thru the day drinking plenty of water. We were fortunate with Jerry and Nancy Schilling leading us on the journey. The only mishap this day was when Jackie Rude had her hat had blown off her head while Marc was driving down the road, it landing in traffic. Dave Kieger driving a modern chase car was able to stop and retrieve her hat and she reclaimed it at our next stop. The next morning, we stopped at the world's largest round barn near our hotel and took a photo and entered the highway of heat and humidity on ward to Oshkosh.
