Lectura Divina Método: Cuatro Pasos



Lectio Divina: Cuaresma 4ta Semana

1. Empecemos: "En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo. Amén." Y entonces reza esta oración de la Misa 4ta domingo de cuaresma:

"Dios nuestro, que renuevas este mundo por medio de tus sacramentos, concede a tu Iglesia aprovechar estos signos misteriosos de tu presencia y asístela siempre en sus necesidades materiales. Por nuestro Señor Jesucristo."

2. Lectura: Lee la siguiente Escritura dos o tres veces. Juan 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38

3. Meditación : Despues de la lectura, toma unos momentos para reflexionar en silencio acerca de una o más de las siguientes preguntas: (*Si practicas la lectio divina como familia o en un grupo, invita a los participantes a compartir sus respuestas.*)

¿Cuál palabra o palabras captaron mi atención? ¿Qué parte en este pasaje me consoló? ¿Qué parte en este pasaje me desafió?

4. Contemplación: Lee nuevamente el pasaje de la Escritura, seguida de esta reflexión: ¿De qué manera se relaciona este pasaje con la experiencia de mi vida diaria?

Él fue, se lavó y volvió con vista. ¿Cuáles de mis pecados o de mis faltas necesitan ser limpiados? ¿Qué personas, cosas, actitudes, etc., me impiden ver claramente lo que Dios desea para mí?

Y tú, ¿qué piensas del que te abrió los ojos? ¿De qué manera mis palabras y mis acciones hablan sobre lo que yo creo acerca de Jesús?

Supo Jesús que lo habían echado fuera, y cuando lo encontró, le dijo: "¿Crees tú en el Hijo del hombre?"

¿De qué manera mi fe en Cristo me sostiene durante los problemas y las dificultades? ¿Qué acciones puedo tomar en los próximos días para ofrecer ayuda espiritual o material a los cristianos que están enfrentando una persecución?

5. Oración: Lee el pasaje de la Escritura una vez más. Dale al Señor la alabanza, petición y acción de gracias que la Palabra te ha inspirado. Termine la oración con un Padre Nuestro.



The 5th Encuentro is a four year process of ecclesial reflection and action that invites all Catholics in the United States to intense missionary activity, consultation, leadership development, and identification of best ministerial practices. The process has been proposed as a priority activity of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Strategic Plan for 2017-2020. The V Encuentro starts at the grass roots level and calls for the development of resources and initiatives to better serve the fast-growing Hispanic population in dioceses, parishes, ecclesial movements, and other Catholic organizations and institutions in light of its theme Missionary Disciples: Witnesses of God's Love. WHAT IS THE GOAL OF V ENCUENTRO?

The main goal of the V Encuentro is to discern ways in which the Church in the United States can better respond to the Hispanic/Latino presence, and to strengthen the ways in which Hispanics/Latinos respond to the call to the New Evangelization as missionary disciples serving the entire Church.

Surveys of Possible Mass Time Change

Thanks to all who submitted their surveys. These multilingual surveys, with their structured questions and written comments, are being carefully processed by hand. After careful processing, their major findings and the decision regarding the possible stated change in weekend Mass times will be communicated. For now, please (1) include in your extra praying this Lent, invocations to the Holy Spirit to guide the final stages of our discernment process lest the evil spirit bedevil it more than it already has and (2) inform yourself of the V Encuentro (above) which is an initiative from the American Bishops endorsed by Pope Francis, then ask yourself, what implications might it hold for our parish which is predominantly composed of English and Spanish speaking parishioners (at least ask the question).
