Colonial Acres Phase V Minutes March 13, 2024

Meeting called to order 6:00 pm. Requested phones be silenced. All Board members present: Gloria P., Mike G., Judy S., Judy K., Katy K., Stacy K. & Kelli R. from Clearview Property Management Pledge of Allegiance recited. Members reminded to be acknowledged before speaking with a two-minute speaking time limit.

Clearview management report given.

We are awaiting our actual dates for goose egg collection. All the contracts have been reviewed. If we are to proceed with a generator for the clubhouse, we will need two proposals for installation. Storm drains have been repaired making it safer for walkers. Repairs complete on damaged bus stop related to crash. Clubhouse flooring has been completed. Spring walk through weather dependent, waiting on date, March or April. New work order form found on Colonial Acres Phase V website, this is beneficial to ensure the work order has been received by Clearview without having to make a phone call, and it is a good tracking method.

Paul Z. to look into whether an old sign we own can be used for clubhouse address and street name. Roofing is assessed by roofing company used in the prior year, this works best as they examine the buildings and give us a free breakdown on what needs to be done.

57-6 asked a question about staying overnight in the clubhouse if we had a generator. It is something that will be discussed when we get the generator.

Management report approved.

Financial report given by Stacy. Copy in newsletter for member's review.

Gloria reminded us that in the bylaws we only need to have one open and closed meeting per year, that we have it monthly has made us extremely transparent to the members.

Stacy explained that there is training for how to be a Board. Cost is \$700.00 per meeting, free if we were to host this training. Motion was made by Judy S. and seconded by Judy K. to look into this. January minutes not approved, need to be discussed and amended. February minutes approved.

Old Business

Dog waste is a problem again, probably due to snow melting and people not picking up after their pets. Looking for ways to improve on this problem.

*64-6 commented that dogs need to be on a leash at all times as he was approached by a large black Lab who was not on a leash

*95-2 commented her dog became ill after eating goose poop and vet cost were over \$1,000 *The Resident Directory will continue to be updated by John McGraw, he will let us know if he no longer wishes to perform this task in the future. Wasp nest are a problem and member requested they be removed. Suggestion made that this is a good time with no leaves on trees to see where they are. They are dormant so it's easy to knock them down, otherwise wasp spray works well in the evening when they are active and no longer dormant.

*Cold patching has been done

*109-6 asked whether the flooded unit has been fixed. Yes, it is all taken care of

*113-1 has rippled siding she would like to have looked at. Clearview will send someone out to assess.

New Business

Still need a date for Spring Walk through

Question about multiple blue flags in field behind new apartments off 11-mile rd.

Blue flags are indicators of water lines marked by the city.

141-5 asked will there be a fence around the new apartments after they are finished. The company building the project should put a fence around it. But if you'd like to know more you can call the city planning commission.

Clubhouse flooring is complete, it was removed and glued down to rectify the problem. The board will give \$600 payment to the clubhouse to help pay for the glue.

A motion was made by a board member to help pay and it was passed.

There was an explanation of clubhouse funds by Bill Aldinger who is the treasurer of the clubhouse committee. Questions were asked as to amount in clubhouse checking account, \$22,644.

120-1 asked how much money is considered delinquent? \$100 you will be accorded lawyer fees as well as the \$100 fine. Questioning whether a person who is habitually delinquent should be

considered not in good standing. Not be able to vote, not attend meetings or community facilities, should we disable key card until paid in full? Up for discussion

New Business

Has been discussed earlier in these minutes.

Spring walk through date dependent on weather. Field by Jefferson and Williamsburg are marked with blue flags for water lines. Clubhouse flooring repair is complete, the board is helping with the payment for the glue which is \$600 our portion. What would be the penalty for delinquent payment. Suggestion made for "no mow" in the interest of environmental health for the pollinators. Judy Stephens will check with the city about fines for not mowing. Please look at this issue and come to the next board meeting with ideas on how you feel about not cutting the lawn in May in interest of environment.

Member Issues:

95-2 has questions about porch lights. If you don't have a porch light, you'll need to request a permit to have one installed.


FROM THE BOARD

Now that Spring has arrived, we'll be seeing more activity outdoors. Our Spring walk thru of the property happens in April. This is where we make note of work that needs to be taken care of this Summer & Fall. You will see Paul Z. & a Board member or two with a clip board taking notes. It's also the time the DNR will give us the days we can collect geese eggs. If you're out taking a walk & you happen to see a nest let Clearview know where it's located. The more eggs we can destroy the better this program will work.

Judy Stephens has suggested we discuss doing a "No Mow May", an annual conservation program which advocates keeping early spring pollination safe while bees emerge for the season. The start of the growing season is a critical time for hungry, newly emerged native bees & floral resources may be hard to find. By allowing lawns to grow longer, & letting weed flowers to bloom, it could provide nectar & pollen to help our bees thrive in early Spring. Google the "No Mow May" online & you'll find both pro & con information. The Board will be discussing whether we should do this or not & would like the Members input.

When floor was taken up, the tile by the pool table had to be removed and floor sanded. After this was completed two problems arose: 1. Drapes had to be taken down and washed. This has been completed 2. Bookcases were moved and put back in the wrong places. Books are not in correct alphabetical order. Some have been corrected, but not all. Water Softeners

As with many home appliances, water softeners require regular maintenance to operate at their best. This is especially true within Colonial Acres as South Lyon water is drawn from wells and is known to be extremely hard. Having a working water softener will prolong the life of your faucets, and other water drawing appliances.

Although it is suggested to call a softener company to routinely check your water softener (once a year is good) there are things you can do as the homeowner.

Be sure the time on your softener is displayed correctly. Softeners are set up to run in the middle of the night so that water is not drawn while in operation. This is important as salt will be in the water during regeneration, which could get into your water heater and fixtures, and it is highly corrosive. If your softener is functioning correctly, you should never taste salt in your water.

Regularly check your salt barrel to ensure proper levels and refill as needed. For those unable to fill the barrel with salt, there are companies that offer the service. Low salt levels mean your softener won't be able to perform correctly and could leave chalky white residue on fixtures or leave your skin and hair feeling sticky and dry. Which salt you use is your choice, just be sure it is specifically made for water softeners. **Rock salt and table salt are <u>not</u> to be used in your softener**.

While checking your salt levels, be sure to look out for water leaks and salt buildup on the outside of the barrel as those are signs there are other problems that should be addressed.

The average life of a water softener is 7-10 years. **Those with an original softener, it is 20-40 years old and should be replaced.** If you're curious if your unit is performing correctly, fill a water bottle and take the sample to Martin's Hardware in town. They can run a test and let you know, as well as suggest models if you're in need of a replacement (be sure to let them know you are a colonial acres resident so they can direct you to the correct models). You may call any licensed plumber to complete the new install (Martin's Hardware has a list of plumbers), this includes Paul's Plumbing Services. Replacement of a water softener is not covered by the co-op and will be at cost to the resident.

Sometimes, failures of water softeners happen. This could be a leak on the main unit, the salt barrel, or the tubing. On occasion, failure can be found when you go to turn on your faucet and water will not flow. **Please, do not move from faucet to faucet trying to get flow, you will damage all other fixtures in the process.** To test, turn on the cold side of a bathtub faucet, or the laundry tub. Be sure not to use the hot water, as the resin bed will end up in the water heater. If you find small, round, sand-like pellets, ranging from light tan, to bronze, or a dark/blackish color, immediately stop all water use and call a plumber (such as Paul's Plumbing Services). These pellets are part of the resin bed in the main unit of the softener. The softener will need to be bypassed until a replacement of the unit is completed.

Water softeners may not be in every single unit, but this guide will hopefully assist those that have them in how to properly maintain them.
