Sunday Advent Year C Luke 3:1-6

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

2nd Sunday Advent Year C

Luke 3:1-6

Have you ever heard the beautiful Christmas Proclamation chanted at Midnight Mass? Maybe you heard it, but weren't sure what it was? The Proclamation is only sung before the Midnight Mass actually begins, so not being part of Mass, it is easy to think it may just be a special prelude music. But it is an ancient tradition from the Roman Martyrology, that announces the date of Christ's birth in relation to major events and personages of sacred and secular history. It describes Christ's birth in history by situating it by the number of years between it and other previous world-changing events such as creation and the great Noahic Flood, Abraham's call of faith, Moses' deliverance of the Israelites to freedom and David's coronation. The Christmas Proclamation even calculates the number of years from Christ's birth back to such important secular events as the first Olympics (776 BC), the founding of Rome (753 BC) and Caesar Octavian Augustus' Reign (44 BC). Why all the detail? Well, it highlights the historical intervention of God into the world through the birth of Christ. As the Proclamation announces in its last line, Christ's birth reveals the design of God, to "consecrate the world by His most loving presence". This reveals the purpose of God's Incarnation in Christ. This is the meaning of Christmas - Our Redemption or the 'Righting' of our History. Or as St Paul states it in Galatians 4:4, "when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption." If you haven't heard the Proclamation chanted before, I set out the text on papers by the Church doors for you to pick up & read about further. It is a neat custom!

But what does all that have to do with today's gospel? Well, in Luke's gospel today, we find a similar historical sensitivity evident by Luke's concern to specifically put a date in time to the period of John's preaching and baptizing ministry. Luke relates it to various specific historical personalities in governmental positions that rule society at his time. Luke writes that "In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea......"(Luke 3:1) Luke is concerned to demonstrate that Christian events were verifiable and that they happened in actual history dateable in relation to specific world events. I had an old history professor (aren't they all old by definition- they've lived long enough to know and see a lot!) in seminary who would always say, "If history is to be taken seriously, you have to relate the people and places to time and each other – they don't just fall out of the sky!" The German phrase 'sitz in leben' ('seat in life') or the Latin phrase 'in situ' '(in place-position') captures this sense of actual historical events occurring in a matrix of locatable relations to other events – the more relations that there are, the more real or verifiable it can be. The gospel writer Luke is an amateur historian himself. So we find in his gospel introduction, that he states he has already reviewed many testimonies and records as a preparation for his own history. Therefore, he states that his sequencing of events may be the most accurate. In Luke 1:3, Luke describes his ambition to "investigate everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you". Additional references to actual historical persons in secular history or other verifiable background references can be found in Luke 1:5, 1:26-28, 2:1-2 and 3:1-2. Further, Luke includes an extensive genealogy of Jesus in his gospel as an example of historically placing Jesus within a specific family line in relation to many previous generations (Luke 3:23-38).

And speaking of generations, John the Baptist appears on the scene humbly declaring that he is merely a signpost to point to the Messiah. He wishes to draw no attention to himself, but only to call people to prepare and watch for the coming Messiah. He identifies only as a 'solitary voice', or 'voice of one crying out in the desert' (Luke 3:4). I like to note that John is humbly not even using his own words, but is quoting an Isaian prophecy (Isaiad 40:4-5). Like the prophecy indicates, John is located out in the wilderness-desert, which would allow no glamour or self-promotion (remember his rugged diet and dress) or flashy monuments (the dry. Scorching desert wears down any personal memorial). So, minimizing himself, John wishes only to highlight the work of preparing to recognize and receive the coming Messiah: Repent and convert, wait and watch for the coming Christ! And that is what we do with this Advent Season: we turn again to God, make changes in preparation and eagerly await His coming again! Peace, Fr Brian
